WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Act of the seventh and eighth years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, chapter ninety-four; of the Act of the thirteenth and fourteenth years of Her said late Majesty.

chapter ninety-four; and of the Act of the thirty-second and thirty-third years of Her said late Majesty, chapter ninety-four, duly prepared and laid before His Majesty in Council a Scheme or Representation, bearing date the sixteenth day of January, in the year one thousand nine hundred and thirteen, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, acting under the provisions of the Act of the seventh and eighth years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, chapter ninety-four, the Act of the thirteenth and fourteenth years of Her said late Majesty, chapter ninety-four, and the Act of the thirty-second and thirty-third years of Her said late Majesty, chapter ninety-four, have prepared and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following Scheme or Representation for altering the boundaries of the New Parish of Alverthorpe, the New Parish of Saint John, Wakefield, the New Parish of Saint Mary Magdalene, Outwood, the New Parish of Saint Michael, Westgate Common, and the New Parish of Saint Anne, Wrenthorpe, all in the County of York and in the Diocese of Wakefield.

"Whereas by the authority of an Order of His late Majesty King William the Fourth in Council bearing date the nineteenth day of July, in the year one thousand eight hundred and thirty, and published in the London Gazette on the third day of September, in the same year, a certain part of the Parish of Wakefield, in the said County of York, and at that time in the Diocese of York but now in the said Diocese of Wakefield, was assigned as a District Chapelry by the name of 'Alverthorpe' to the consecrated Church situate at Alverthorpe, in the said Parish of Wakefield.

"And whereas by the authority of an Order of Her said late Majesty Queen Victoria in Council bearing date the seventh day of October, in the year one thousand eight hundred and forty-four, and published in the London Gazette on the fifteenth day of the same month, a District Chapelry was assigned by the name of 'Saint John' to the consecrated Church of Saint John, situate in the said Parish of Wakefield.

"And whereas by the authority of another Order of Her said late Majesty in Council bearing date the sixteenth day of April, in the year one thousand eight hundred and sixtyone, and published in the London Gazette on the same day, a District Chapelry was assigned to the consecrated Church of Saint Mary Magdalene, situate at Outwood, and the said District Chapelry was named 'The District Chapelry of Saint Mary Magdalene, Outwood.'

"And whereas by the authority of another Order of Her said late Majesty in Council bearing date the sixth day of January, in the year one thousand eight hundred and sixtytwo, and published in the London Gazette on the following day, a Consolidated Chapelry was assigned to the consecrated Church of Saint Michael, situate at Westgate Common, and the said. Consolidated Chapelry was named. The Consolidated Chapelry of Saint Michael, Westgate Common.

"And whereas by the authority of another Order of Her said late Majesty in Council bearing date the thirteenth day of May, in the year one thousand eight hundred and seventy-five, and published in the London Gazette on the following day, a District Chapelry was assigned to the consecrated Church of Saint Anne, situate at Wrenthorpe, and the said District Chapelry was named 'The District Chapelry of Saint Anne, Wrenthorpe.'

And whereas the said District Chapelry of Alverthorpe, the said District Chapelry of Saint John, Wakefield, the said District Chapelry of Saint Mary Magdalene, Outwood, the said Consolidated Chapelry of Saint Michael, Westgate Common, and the said District Chapelry of Saint Anne, Wrenthorpe, have become New Parishes of the character contemplated by the Act of the sixth and seventh years of Her said late Majesty, chapter thirty-seven, by the Act of the nineteenth and twentieth years of Her said late Majesty, chapter one hundred and four, and by the above mentioned Act of the thirty-second and thirty-third years of Her said late Majesty, chapter ninety-four.

"And whereas it has been represented to us, and it appears to us to be expedient that the boundaries of the said New Parish of Alverthorpe, the said New Parish of Saint John, Wakefield, the said New Parish of Saint Mary Magdalene, Outwood, the said New Parish of Saint Michael, Westgate Common, and the said New Parish of Saint Anne, Wrenthorpe,

should be altered in the manner which is here-inafter mentioned.

"Now therefore with the consent of the Right Reverend George Rodney, Bishop of Wakefield (in testimony whereof he has signed and sealed this Scheme or Representation), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, humbly represent, recommend and propose that from and after the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme or Representation and without any assurance in the Law other than such duly gazetted Order, the boundaries of the said New Parish of Alverthorpe, the said New Parish of Saint John, Wakefield, the said New Parish of Saint Mary Magdalene, Outwood, the said New Parish of Saint Michael, Westgate Common, and the said New Parish of Saint Anne, Wrentherpe, shall be altered so that (firstly) all those portions of the said Parish of Wakefield, and of the said New Parish of Alverthorpe, which are described in the First Schedule hereunder written and are delineated and set forth upon the Map or Plan hereunto annexed, and are thereon coloured purple, shall be dissevered from such Parish and New Parish respectively, and shall be annexed to and shall in future form part of the said New Parish of Saint Michael, Westgate Common; and (secondly) all those portions of the said New Parish of Saint John, Wakefield, of the said New Parish of Saint Mary Magdalene, Outwood, and of the Parish of East Ardsley, in the said County of York, and in the said Diocese of Wakefield, which are described in the Second Schedule hereunder written, and are delineated and set forth upon the said Map or Plan hereunto annexed, and are thereon coloured pink, shall be dissevered from such New Parishes and Parish respectively and shall be annexed to and shall in future form part of the said New Parish of Saint Anne, Wrenthorpe; and (thirdly) all that portion of the said New Parish of Saint Mary Magdalene, Outwood, which is described in the Third Schedule hereunder written, and is delineated and set forth upon the said Map or Plan hereunto annexed, and is thereon coloured green, shall be dissevered from such New Parish and shall be annexed to and shall in future form part of the said New Parish of Saint John, Wakefield

"And we further represent, recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from representing, recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid or any of them in accordance with the provisions of the hereinbefore mentioned Acts or of any of them or of any other Act of Parliament.

"The SCHEDULES to which the foregoing Scheme or Representation has reference.

"The First Schedule.

"The territory to be annexed to the New Parish of Saint Michael, Westgate Common, in the County of York and in the Diocese of Wakefield, being:—

"I. All that portion of the Parish of Wakefield, in the said County and Diocese, which is bounded upon part of the south, upon the south-west, and upon the north-west by the

said New Parish of Saint Michael, Westgate Common, and upon the remaining sides, that is to say, upon the east and upon the remaining part of the south, by an imaginary line commencing upon the boundary which divides the said New Parish of Saint Michael, Westgate Common, from the said Parish of Wakefield at a point in the middle of the stream called Balne Beck opposite to the middle of Marlborough Street, and extending thence southward to and along the middle of Marlborough Street for a distance of three chains and a half or thereabouts to its junction with Brooksbank Road, and extending thence southeastward along the middle of Brooksbank Road for a distance of four chains or thereabouts to its junction with the street called Westgate, and extending thence westward along the middle of Westgate for a distance of one chain and a half or thereabouts to the centre of the bridge which carries such street across the stream called Westgate Beck upon the boundary which divides the said Parish of Wakefield from the said New Parish of Saint Michael, Westgate Common.

"II. And also all that portion of the New Parish of Alverthorpe, in the said County and Diocese, which is bounded upon part of the north by the New Parish of Saint Anne, Wrenthorpe, upon the east by the New Parish of Saint John, Wakefield, both in the said County and Diocese, upon the south-east and upon the south by the said New Parish of Saint Michael, Westgate Common, and upon the remaining sides, that is to say, upon the west, upon the north-west, and upon the remaining part of the north, by an imaginary line commencing upon the boundary which divides the said New Parish of Saint Michael, Westgate Common, from the said New Parish of Alverthorpe at the point where Flanshaw Lane is joined by the roadway between Flanshaw Hall and the houses known as Acute Terrace, and extending thence in a straight line due north for a distance of eighteen chains and a half or thereabouts to a point in the middle of the stream called Alverthorpe Beck, and extending thence generally eastward along the middle of Alverthorpe Beck for a distance of twenty-two chains or thereabouts to a point opposite to the southern end of the fence forming the western boundary of the close numbered 461 upon the Ordnance Survey Map of the Civil Parish of Wakefield published in the year one thousand nine hundred and seven upon the scale of twenty-five inches to a mile and also upon the map or plan annexed to this Scheme or Representation, and extending thence northward to and along the said fence (which in part forms the eastern boundary of the grounds belonging to Alverthorpe Hall) for a distance of nine chains or thereabouts to the point where it meets the south-western side of Alverthorpe Road, and extending thence first north-east-ward to the middle of Alverthorpe Road and then north-westward along the middle of such road for a distance in all of eight chains or thereabouts to its junction with the roadway leading towards the Sewage Works of the Wakefield Rural District and the Ardsley and Stanley Urban District Councils, and extending thence northward along the middle of such roadway for a distance of eighteen chains and a quarter or thereabouts to the centre of the bridge which carries it across the Ossett Branch Line of the Great Northern Railway, and extending thence north-eastward along the

middle of the said line of railway for a distance of thirteen chains or thereabouts to the centre of the bridge which carries such line of railway across the roadway or footpath leading from Silcoates Street towards Silcoates, upon the boundary which divides the said New Parish of Alverthorpe from the said New Parish of Saint Anne, Wrenthorpe.

"The Second Schedule.

"The territory to be annexed to the said New Parish of Saint Anne, Wrenthorpe, being:—

"I. All that portion of the said New Parish of Saint John, Wakefield, which is bounded upon the south-west and upon the north-west by the said New Parish of Saint Anne, Wrenthorpe, and upon the remaining sides, that is to say, upon the north-east, and upon the south-east, by an imaginary line commencing at the point where the boundary which divides the said New Parish of Saint Anne, Wrenthorpe, from the said New Parish of Saint John, Wakefield, crosses the middle of the loop, line which connects the line of the West Yorkshire Railway (Great Northern Railway) with the Ossett Branch Line of the Great Northern Railway, and extending thence first south-eastward and then south-westward along the middle of the said loop line of railway for a distance of thirty-one chains or thereabouts to the point where the boundaries of the said New Parish of Saint John, Wakefield, the said New Parish of Alverthorpe, and the said New Parish of Saint Anne, Wrenthorpe, all meet.

"II. And also all those contiguous portions of the New Parish of Saint Mary Magdalene, Outwood, of the Parish of East Ardsley, both in the said County and Diocese, and of the said New Parish of Saint John, Wakefield, which, taken together, are bounded upon part of the north-west by the Parish of West Ardsley, upon the south-west by the Consolidated Chapelry of Gawthorpe and Chickenley Heath, both in the said County and Diocese, upon the greater part of the south by the said New Parish of Saint Anne, Wrenthorpe, and upon the remaining sides, that is to say, upon the remaining part of the south, upon the east, upon the north-east, and upon the remaining part of the north-west, by an imaginary line commencing at the point where the boundary which divides the said New Parish of Saint Anne, Wrenthorpe, from the said New Parish of Saint John, Wakefield, crosses the middle of Potovens Lane, and extending thence southeastward along the middle of Potovens Lane for a distance of three chains or thereabouts to its junction with the Bradford Road upon the boundary which divides the said New Parish of Saint John, Wakefield, from the said New Parish of Saint Mary Magdalene, Outwood, and extending thence first south-eastward, then north-eastward and then eastward along the last mentioned boundary (thereby following the middle of the Bradford Road and the middle of Red Hall Lane) for a distance of six chains or thereabouts to a point distant five chains precisely measured along the middle of Red Hall Lane from its junction with the Bradford Road, and extending thence in a straight line due north for a distance of seventy-one chains or thereabouts to a point in the middle of Robin Hood Bridge which carries

Potovens Lane across the line of the West Yorkshire Railway (Great Northern Railway), and extending thence north-westward in a straight line for a distance of forty-eight chains or thereabouts to the junction of Lawns Lane with the roadway and footpath leading past the northern side of the house called Elm Villa into the Bradford Road, and extending thence first westward, then north-westward and then again westward along the middle of the said roadway and footpath (thereby crossing the boundary which divides the said New Parish of Saint Mary Magdalene, Outwood, from the said Parish of East Ardsley) for a distance of twenty chains and a half or thereabouts to its: junction with the Bradford Road, and extending thence south-westward in a straight line for a distance of twenty-nine chains or thereabouts to a point in the middle of the northern end of the footpath which leads from Stony Lane to Beck Bottom Road, and extending thence westward in a straight line (thereby passing to the south of Woodhouse Hall) for a distance of forty-two chains and a half or thereabouts to the junction of Woodhouse Lane with the footpath leading past the Woodhouse Lane Quarry to Nooking, and extending thence south-westward in a straight line (thereby crossing Blind Lane) for a distance of thirty-nine chains or thereabouts to the centre of the culvert which carries the road leading from West Ardsley to Alverthorpe across the stream called Carrgate Beck, upon boundary which divides the said Parish of East Ardsley from the said Parish of West Ards-

" The Third Schedule.

"The territory to be dissevered from the said New Parish of Saint Mary Magdalene, Outwood, and to be annexed to the said New Parish of Saint John, Wakefield, being:— "All that portion of the said New Parish

of Saint Mary Magdalene, Outwood, which is bounded upon the east by the New Parish of Stanley, in the said County and Diocese, upon the south partly by the last named New Parish and partly by the said New Parish of Saint John, Wakefield, and upon the remaining sides, that is to say, upon the west and upon the north, by an imaginary line commencing upon the boundary which divides the said New Parish of Saint John, Wakefield, from the said New Parish of Saint Mary Magdalene, Outwood, at a point in the middle of Red Hall Lane distant five chains precisely measured along the middle of such lane from its junction with the Bradford Road, and extending thence in a straight line due north for a distance of six chains or thereabouts to a point in the middle of the stream called Snow Hill Beck, and extending thence first eastward, then north-eastward and then northward along the middle of such stream for a distance of twenty-seven chains or thereabouts to the point where it meets the fence forming the northern boundary of the close numbered 1 upon the map or plan annexed to this Scheme or Representation, and extending thence first north-eastward, then south-eastward and then eastward along the said fence and along the fences forming the eastern boundary of the said close and the northern boundary of the close numbered 2 upon the said map or plan for a distance in all of nineteen chains or there-

abouts to the eastern end of the last mentioned fence on the western side of Newton Lane, and extending thence in a straight line due east (thereby crossing Newton! Lane and the close numbered 3 upon the said map or plan) for a distance of seven chains or thereabouts to the fence forming the eastern boundary of the last mentioned close, and extending thence first southward along such fence and then south-eastward along the fences forming the northern boundaries of the closes numbered 4, 5 and 6 upon the said map or plan (thereby crossing the footpath leading from Ouchthorpe Lane into Newton Lane) for a distance of nineteen chains or thereabouts to the point where the last mentioned fence meets the footpath leading from the last described footpath into Ouchthorpe Lane near the houses known as Field Head, and extending thence first south-eastward and then north-eastward along the middle of such footpath for a distance of sixteen chains or thereabouts to the point, near its junction with the footpath leading past the western side of Field Head, where it is crossed by the boundary which divides the said New Parish of Saint Mary Magdalene, Outwood, from the said New Parish of Stanley."

And whereas drafts of the said Scheme or Representation have been transmitted to the Patrons and to the Incumbents of the Cures affected by the arrangements which are contemplated by such Scheme or Representation and such Patrons and Incumbents have either signified their assent or offered no objections thereto.

And whereas a period of more than one calendar month has elapsed since drafts of the said Scheme or Representation were transmitted to the said Patrons and Incumbents.

And whereas the said Scheme or Representation has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said Scheme or Representation, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts. And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of Wakefield.

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have in pursuance of the Act of the eighth and ninth years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, chapter seventy, of the Act of the fourteenth and

fifteenth years of her said late Majesty, chapter ninety-seven, and of the Act of the nineteenth and twentieth years of Hersaid late Majesty, chapter fifty-five, duly prepared and flaid before His Majesty in Council a Representation, bearing date the sixteenth day of January in the year one thousand nine hundred and thirteen, in the words and figures following that is to say:—

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of the Act of the eighth and ninth years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, chapter seventy, of the Act of the fourteenth and fifteenth years of Her said late Majesty, chapter ninety-seven, and of the Act of the nineteenth and twentieth years of Her said late Majesty, chapter fifty-five, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following representation as to the assignment of a consolidated chapelry to the consecrated church of Saint Margaret, Thornbury, situate within the new parish (sometime district chapelry) of Saint Mary, Laister Dyke, in the county of York, and in the diocese of Ripon.

"Whereas at certain extremities of the said new parish of Saint Mary, Laister Dyke, and of the parish of Calverley, in the said county and diocese, which said extremities lie contiguous one to another, and are described in the Schedule hereunder written, there is collected together a population which is situate at a distance from the several churches of such new parish and parish.

"And whereas it appears to us to be expedient that certain contiguous portions (being the portions containing the population aforesaid) of the said new parish of Saint Mary, Laister Dyke, and of the said parish of Calverley, should be formed into a consolidated chapelry for all ecclesiastical purposes, and that the same should be assigned to the said church of Saint Margaret, Thornbury, situate as aforesaid.

"Now, therefore, with the consent of the Right Reverend Thomas Wortley, Bishop of Ripon, as such Bishop, and also as the patron, in right of his See, of the vicarage of the said parish of Calverley, and with the consents of the Reverend Ernest Augustus Eardley-Wilmot, of Saint Jude's Vicarage, South Kensington, S.W., Clerk in Holy Orders and a Prebendary of the Cathedral Church of Wells, of the Reverend Robert Baker Girdlestone, of Saxholme, Wimbledon, in the county of Surrey, Clerk in Holy Orders and an Honorary Canon of the Cathedral Church of Christ, in Oxford, of the Reverend Arthur Evelyn Barnes-Lawrence, of Number 6, Church Terrace, Blackheath, in the county of Kent, Clerk in Holy Orders and an Honorary Canon of the Cathedral Church of Southwark, of the Reverend Edward Alexander Stuart, of The Precincts, Canterbury, in the said county of Kent, Clerk in Holy Orders and a Canon of the Cathedral and Metropolitical Church of Christ, in Canterbury, and of the Right Reverend James Denton, Bishop of Sodor and Man, as the patrons of the vicarage of the said new parish of Saint Mary, Laister Dyke (in testimony whereof they, the said consenting parties, have respectively signed and sealed this Representation), We, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, humbly represent that it would, in our opinion, be expedient that ill those contiguous portions of the said new parish of Saint Mary, Laister Dyke, and of the said parish of Calverley, which are described in the Schedule hereunder written, all which portions, together with the boundaries thereof, are delineated and set forth on the map or plan hereunto annexed, should be united and formed into one consolidated chapelry for the said Church of Saint Margaret, Thornbury, situate as aforesaid, and that the same should be named 'The Consolidated Chapelry of Saint Margaret, Thornbury.'

"We therefore humbly pray that Your Majesty will be graciously pleased to take the premises into Your Royal consideration, and to make such order in respect thereto as to Your Majesty in Your Royal Wisdom shall seem meet.

"The SCHEDULE to which the foregoing representation has reference:—

"The Consolidated Chapelry of Saint Margaret, Thornbury, comprising—

"All those contiguous portions of the new parish (sometime district chapelry) of Saint Mary, Laister Dyke, and of the parish of Calverley, both in the county of York and in the diocese of Ripon, which, taken together, are bounded upon the north-west partly by the new parish of Saint John the Evangelist, Greengates, and partly by the new parish of Saint Luke, Eccleshill, upon the west partly by the new parish of Saint Augustine, Undercliffe, Bradford, and partly by the new parish of Saint Clement, Bradford, all in the said county and diocese, and upon the remaining sides, that is to say, upon the south-west, upon the south-east, and upon the east, by an imaginary line commencing upon the boundary which divides the said new parish of Saint Clement, Bradford, from the said new parish of Saint Mary, Laister Dyke, at the junction of Killinghall Road with Thornbury Road, and extending thence south-eastward along the middle of Thornbury Road for a distance of twenty chains or thereabouts to its junction with Leeds Road, and extending thence north-eastward along the middle of Leeds Road for a distance of ten yards or thereabouts to its junction with Thornbury Street, and extending thence south-eastward along the middle of Thornbury Street for a distance of eight chains or thereabouts to its junction with Derby Road, and with the footpath leading into New Lane near its junction with Dick Lane, and extending thence southeastward along the middle of such footpath for a distance of ten chains or thereabouts to its junction with New Lane, and extending thence north-eastward along the middle of New Lane for a distance of two chains or thereabouts to its junction with Dick Lane, and extending thence south-westward along the middle of Dick Lane for a distance of two chains or thereabouts to the centre of the bridge which carries such lane across the Leeds, Bradford and Halifax Line of the Great Northern Railway, and extending thence north-eastward along the middle of such line of railway for a distance of eighteen chains and a half or thereabouts to the centre of the bridge which carries the Shipley Branch Line of the said railway across the said Leeds, Bradford and Halifax line of railway; and extending thence first north-eastward, and then north-westward along the middle of the said Shipley Branch line of railway (thereby crossing the boundary which divides the said new parish of Saint Mary, Laister Dyke, from the said parish of Calverley) for a distance of one mile and seventeen chains or thereabouts to the centre of the bridge which carries such line of railway across Woodhall Road, upon the boundary which divides the said parish of Calverley from the said new parish of Saint Mary. Laister Dyke, and extending thence first northward and then south-westward along the last mentioned boundary (thereby following in part the middle of Woodhall Road and in part the middle of Fagley Road) for a distance of seventeen chains or thereabouts to the point in the middle of the stream called Fagley Beck, where such boundary meets the boundary of the said new parish of Saint John the Evangelist, Greengates."

And whereas the said Representation has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said Representation, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts. And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said diocese of Ripon.

And whereas by virtue of the above-recited provisions of the said Order in Council the Trustees named in the first column of the Schedule to this Order hold the properties described and set opposite to their names in the second column of that Schedule in trust for the unit of the Territorial Force mentioned in the third column of that Schedule for the purposes and subject to the limitations mentioned in the deeds (if any) referred to in the fourth column of that Schedule, and it is expedient that such properties should be transferred from those Trustees to the County Association mentioned in the fifth column of that Schedule.

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, doth order, and it is hereby ordered, that as from the date of this Order the said properties shall in each case be by virtue of this Order transferred from the said Trustees to and vested in the said County Association, subject to any charges thereon and to any liabilities in or towards the discharge of which the said properties are properly applicable, and shall be held by the said Association in like manner in all respects as they were held by the said Trustees respectively for the benefit of the said unit of the Territorial Force or for such other purposes as the Association, with the consent of the said unit (to be ascertained in manner prescribed by regulations of the Army Council), shall direct, but so that the interest of any beneficiaries other than the said unit or the unit of the Volunteers or Yeomanry with which it corresponds shall not, without the consent of such beneficiaries, be affected.

A person in charge of a locomotive drawing two or more loaded or unloaded waggons shall not cause or suffer the locomotive to travel on any highway without having (1) a cord or other efficient means of communication extending from the rearmost waggon to such locomotive; and (2) a person who shall (except during the time it is necessary for him to leave his position in order to comply with any statutory regulation or bye-law relating to the use of locomotives on highways) travel in the rear of such Such last-mentioned person shall signal to the driver of such locomotive to stop or drive to the side of the highway when it shall be necessary to do so in order to enable overtaking pedestrians, vehicles, horses or cattle, to pass by. And the person in charge of such locomotive shall upon receiving any such signal as aforesaid immediately stop such locomotive and waggons or draw it and them to the side of the highway as the case may require.

Provided always that nothing here contained shall apply to a steam roller not drawing more than three loaded or unloaded waggons
