PRESENT,

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Act of the seventh and eighth years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, chapter ninety-four; of the Act of the thirteenth and fourteenth years of Her said late Majesty,

chapter ninety-four; and of the Act of the thirty-second and thirty-third years of Her said late Majesty, chapter ninety-four, duly prepared and laid before His Majesty in Council a Scheme or Representation, bearing date the sixteenth day of January, in the year one thousand nine hundred and thirteen, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

“ We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, acting under the provisions of the Act of the seventh and eighth years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, chapter ninety-four, the Act of the thirteenth and fourteenth years of Her said late Majesty, chapter ninety-four, and the Act of the thirty-second and thirty-third years of Her said late Majesty, chapter ninety-four, have prepared and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following Scheme or Representation for altering the boundaries of the New Parish of Alverthorpe, the New Parish of Saint John, Wakefield, the New Parish of Saint Mary Magdalene, Outwood, the New Parish of Saint Michael, Westgate Common, and the New Parish of Saint Anne, Wrenthorpe, all in the County of York and in the Diocese of Wakefield.

“ Whereas by the authority of an Order of His late Majesty King William the Fourth in Council bearing date the nineteenth day of July, in the year one thousand eight hundred
