ORDER OF THE BOARD OF AGRICULTURE AND FISHERIES.

(DATED 12TH MARCH 1913.)

The Board of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in them under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1911, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

The restrictions on movement of swine imposed by the Swine-Fever (Regulation of Movement) Order of 1908, or the Swine-Fever (Special Areas) Order of 1911, shall not apply to the movement of swine from the sale mentioned in the Schedule hereto to any premises (not being a Swine-Fever Infected Place) in Great Britain if the swine are accompanied by a licence in the Form F set forth in the First Schedule to the said first-mentioned Order granted by an Inspector of the Local Authority of the county of the Parts of Kesteven Division of Lincolnshire and the following conditions are complied with:—

(i.) The swine shall be moved to the place of destination specified in the licence and not elsewhere, and shall be there detained and kept separate from all other swine for twenty-eight days, unless they are slaughtered on such premises before the expiration of that period, or are moved under and in accordance with the conditions of a licence in the Form C set forth in the said First Schedule to a bacon factory or slaughterhouse in the same Scheduled Area.

(ii.) The swine shall be moved by the nearest available route and without unnecessary delay, and during the movement shall, so far as is practicable, be kept separate from all swine not being moved with a licence under this Order.

(iii.) A copy of every licence (Form F) granted by an Inspector under this Order shall be sent by the Inspector to the Local Authority of the District in which the place of destination specified in the licence is situate.

(iv.) After completion of the movement the licence shall forthwith be delivered up at, or sent by post to, the nearest police-station in the same District by the person in charge of the swine at the time of completing such movement.

A licence under this Order shall, for the
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purposes of the above-mentioned Orders, be treated as a licence under those Orders.

BARROW - IN - FURNESS (RAMSDEN DOCK STATION) IRISH ANIMALS LANDING PLACE ORDER OF 1913.

The Board of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in them under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1911, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do hereby define the following part of the Port of Barrow-in-Furness as a Landing Place for Irish Animals, that is to say:

All that space situate at Ramsden Dock Station, in the county borough of Barrow-in-Furness, in the occupation of the Furness Railway Company, which is coloured pink on the plan sealed by the Board of Agriculture and Fisheries for the purposes of this Order, and deposited at the office of the Board.

This Order may be cited as the BARROW-IN-FURNESS (RAMSDEN DOCK STATION) IRISH ANIMALS LANDING PLACE ORDER OF 1913.
