(1) The Provisions of Article (2) Proviso (1),

Article (2) Proviso (iii) (c), Article (2) Proviso (iii) (d) and Article (2) Proviso (iii) (e) of the Principal Order are hereby revoked so far as they relate to works of which the country of origin is Denmark, and the authors of all such works shall enjoy the same rights as if the said provisions had never related thereto.

(2) In the application of the provisions of Article (3) of the Principal Order to works of which the country of origin is Denmark, the date of this Order shall be substituted for the commencement of the Act and for the commencement of the Principal Order.

(3) Where any person has, before the date of this Order, taken any action whereby he has incurred any expenditure or liability in connection with the reproduction or performance of any work at a time when such reproduction or performance would but for the making of this Order have been lawful, nothing in this Order shall diminish or prejudice any rights or interest arising from, or in connection with, such action which are subsisting or valuable at the said date unless the person who, by virtue of this Order, becomes entitled to restrain such reproduction or performance agrees to pay such compensation as, failing agreement, may be determined in accordance with the provisions of the Copyright Act, 1911.

(4) The Provisions of Article (2) Proviso (iii) (a) of the Principal Order shall apply as if Japan were included amongst the foreign countries named in those provisions.

And the Lords Commissioners of the Treasury are to give the necessary orders accordingly.

(c) In the application to such works of the provisions of section 24 of the Copyright Act, 1911, the date of this Order shall be substituted for the commencement of the Act wherever that expression occurs in sub-section (1) (a) and for the 26th July, 1910, in sub-section (1) (b).

(d) In the application to such works of the provisions of Article 3 of the Principal Order the date of this Order shall be substituted for the commencement of the Principal Order.

SPROWSTON.—Forthwith and entirely in the Parish Church of St. Mary and St. Margaret, Sprowston, in the county of Norfolk; and in the Churchyard, except as follows:—

(a) In any vault or walled grave now existing in the said Churchyard burial may be allowed, subject to the condition that every coffin buried in such vault or grave be

separately enclosed by stonework or brickwork properly cemented.

(b) In any earthen grave now existing in the said Churchyard the burial may be allowed of the body of any member of the family of the person or persons heretofore buried in such grave, subject to the condition that no part of the coffin containing the body shall be at a depth less than three feet below the level of the surface of the ground adjoining the grave.

(c) In the said Churchyard, in any grave space in which no interment has heretofore taken place, the burial may be allowed of the body of any person for whom or of any member of a family for which such grave space has been reserved and appropriated as a burial place, with the exclusive right of burial therein, subject to the condition that no part of the coffin containing the body shall be at a depth less than three feet below the level of the surface of the ground adjoining the grave.

SOUTH BREWHAM.—Forthwith and entirely in the Church of St. John the Baptist, South Brewham, in the county of Somerset; and in the Churchyard attached thereto, except as follows:—

In any vault or walled grave now existing in the said Churchyard burial may be allowed, subject to the condition that every coffin buried in such vault or grave be

separately enclosed by stonework or brickwork properly cemented.

Now, therefore, His Majesty in Council is pleased hereby to give notice of such Representations, and to order that the same be taken into consideration by a Committee of the Privy Council, on the 22nd day of April next.

And His Majesty is further pleased to direct that this Order be forthwith published in the London Gazette, and that copies thereof be affixed on the doors of the churches or chapels of, or on some conspicuous places within, the parishes affected by such Representations one month before the said 22nd day of April.

The following Statute made by the Governing Body of Magdalene College, Cambridge, on the tenth day of March, one thousand nine hundred and thirteen, and sealed on the same day, has been submitted for the approval of His Majesty in Council, and notice of its having been so submitted is published in accordance with the provisions contained in "The Universities of Oxford and Cambridge Act, 1877":—

STATUTE made by the Governing Body of Magdalene College Cambridge at a General Meeting specially summoned for the purpose by the votes of not less than two-thirds of the number of persons present and voting on Monday the tenth day of March one thousand nine hundred and thirteen in substitution for Statute XXV of the existing Statutes of the College.

Statute XXV.

Emoluments of the Master and Fellows.

After deduction of all stipends and allowances to the Officers of the College and of the payments to the General Fund for Open Scholarships the Living and Building Fund and all other needful and reasonable general expenses and of such payments as may be required to defray the expenses of the management of the College property and to keep in sound repair the College buildings and the buildings of the College estates and otherwise to improve permanently the College property and also of such payment as may become due to the University the surplus annual revenue of the College (exclusive of the revenues arising from the Peckard Fund and from the proceeds of the sale of the advowson of Ellingham) shall be divided into nine equal parts of which the Master shall receive two and each of the Fellows one. Provided that when such surplus annual revenue exceeds two thousand two hundred and fifty pounds (£2,250) *free of Income Tax* the excess shall be applied in such proportion as the Governing Body thinks fit either to the increase of the number of Fellowships or to the increase of the number or emoluments of the Scholars or to such other purposes as are considered by the Governing Body most advantageous to the College.

The annual revenue arising from the Peckard Fund shall be divided into six equal parts of which the Master shall receive two and the four remaining parts shall be divided equally amongst the four Fellows who have first completed a twelve years' tenure of office as Tutor Lecturer or Dean in the College: Provided that if at any time there are fewer than four Fellows qualified as above then the remaining part or parts shall be given to the Fellow or Fellows who shall have first completed a three years' tenure of office as Tutor Lecturer or Dean in the College and who continue to hold one or other of such offices and in the event of two or more of the Fellows being equally qualified as above to receive any such part it shall be equally divided between or among them provided that if at any time there are fewer than four such Fellows each such Fellow shall then receive one part and the remaining part or parts shall be carried to the capital of the Peckard Fund.

Every resident Fellow shall be entitled to rooms in College free of charge and to such daily allowance for commons during residence as the Governing Body from time to time determines provided that such allowance does not in all exceed fifty pounds (£50) a year free of Income Tax.

The Master shall occupy the lodge free of rent rates taxes and the cost of external and structural repairs and shall receive the annual income arising from the proceeds of the sale of the advowson of Ellingham together with an allowance at the rate of one hundred pounds (£100) a year free of Income Tax. Such allowance shall be in lieu of all payments hitherto made to the Master in respect of salary commons chamber rents poundages and rents of cottages.

His Majesty the KING has been graciously pleased to award the Edward Medal of the Second Class to Albert Benstead, under the following circumstances:—

On the 14th January, 1913, Charles Jex was cleaning the roof over the smelting furnaces at Messrs. Bolckow, Vaughan and Co.'s steel works, and, while he was making his way along an iron beam thirty-two feet from the ground

and immediately above a fifty-ton ladle, which was being filled with molten metal, a column of flame and smoke shot up from the ladle to a height of thirty or forty feet. The flames enveloped Jex, burning him so badly that he was rendered helpless and barely able to retain his foothold on the beam. Had he slipped, he would have fallen into the ladle. Benstead was standing near the foot of an iron ladder, twenty-five feet long, leading to the beam, and immediately climbed up and took hold of Jex, whose hands were so badly burnt that he could not assist himself in descending the ladder. Benstead placed him across his back and carried him down to the floor, the iron ladder being so hot that he had to use his cap to take hold of it and so steady himself as he came down. There is no doubt that Benstead saved Jex from falling into the ladle, and that he ran a very serious risk of falling in himself.

His Majesty the KING has been graciously pleased to award the Edward Medal of the Second Class to Robert Ward and James Jones under the following circumstances:—

On the 21st November, 1912, two workmen, named John Lloyd and Morris Edwards, were employed in excavating a deep sewer trench at Old Colwyn, when the sides of the trench suddenly gave way. There was a heavy fall of earth and timbering, and both men were buried at the bottom. Robert Ward and James Jones promptly set to work to rescue them. The trench was fourteen feet deep, and the two men had been working separate sections seven feet long by three and a-half wide. Soil and timber fell in to the depth of about four feet, and Ward and Jones had to begin their work of rescue at a depth of about ten feet. They had to remove practically all the fallen material in order to reach the two men. The soil was sand and gravel, and the danger of working was largely increased by the presence of water at the bottom, and, as they dug further down, the risk increased. They persisted in their efforts for three and a-quarter hours, and, though John Lloyd was dead when they reached his body, they succeeded in saving the life of Morris Edwards. There is no doubt that the two men ran a great risk of a further fall of earth and timber and of being buried themselves.

Before every such Examination Special Regulations will be issued, in which the particular conditions of the competition will be specified.

2. These Examinations are open to all natural-born or naturalized British subjects, being of the requisite age, health, and character, subject to such restrictions as are herein contained, and to Special Regulations affecting the particular situations.

(i.) The following persons are ineligible, viz.:—

Members of the Royal Irish Constabulary of less than five years' service.

(ii.) The following classes of persons are eligible under certain conditions only, that is to say:—

(a) Persons actually serving in the Army.

(b) Persons actually serving in the Navy.

(c) Persons holding situations in the Civil Service.

(d) Members of the Royal Irish Constabulary of more than five years' service.

(e) Apprentices in His Majesty's Dockyards.

(f) Persons who have entered upon or completed a course of education or training for the occupation of teacher, on account of which grants are payable from the Exchequer.

No person actually serving in the Army will be eligible unless he produces to the Civil Service Commissioners, when called upon to do so, the permission of his Commanding Officer to attend the Examination, dated before the commencement of the competition and given in accordance with such orders as may from time to time be issued by or under the authority of the Army Council.
