

Every resident Fellow shall be entitled to rooms in College free of charge and to such daily allowance for commons during residence as the Governing Body from time to time determines provided that such allowance does not in all exceed fifty pounds (£50) a year free of Income Tax.

The Master shall occupy the lodge free of rent rates taxes and the cost of external and structural repairs and shall receive the annual income arising from the proceeds of the sale of the advowson of Ellingham together with an allowance at the rate of one hundred pounds (£100) a year free of Income Tax. Such allowance shall be in lieu of all payments hitherto made to the Master in respect of salary commons chamber rents poundages and rents of cottages.
