For the purposes of the Electric Lighting Acts, 1882 to 1909, and all Provisional Orders and Licences made and issued thereunder, the Board of Trade approve of the construction and pattern of the meter (hereinafter described) for the measurement of electrical energy when supplied on the constant pressure single-phase, two-wire alternating current system, and known as the Ferranti A. C. Meter Type C.

Provided that the meter be constructed as described in the specification and drawings deposited at the Board of Trade, and dated and numbered 27th February, 1913, and H. 2833, and be in accordance with the pattern meter No. 500272 deposited at the Board of Trade on the 10th November, 1911, by or on behalf of Ferranti, Limited, Hollinwood, Lancashire, and sealed by the Board of Trade.
