The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

HEREAS by Section 16 of Pluralities Act, 1838, as amended by the Pluralities Act, 1850, it is, amongst other things, enacted, "that whenever it shall appear to the Archbishop of the Province, with respect to his own diocese, and whenever it shall be represented to him by the Bishop of any diocese, or by the Bishops of any two dioceses, that two or more benefices, or that one or more benefice or benefices, and one or more spiritual sinecure rectory or rectories, vicarage or vicarages, in his or their diocese or dioceses, being either in the same parish or contiguous to each other, and of which the aggregate population shall not exceed one thousand five hundred persons, may, with advantage to the interests of religion, be united into one benefice, the said Archbishop of the Province shall inquire into the circumstances of the case; and if on such inquiry it shall appear to him that such union may be usefully made, and will not be of inconvenient extent, and that the patron or patrons of the said benefices, sinecure rectory or rectories, vicarage or vicarages respectively, is or are consenting

thereto; such consent being signified in writing under the hands of such patron or patrons, the said Archbishop shall, six weeks before certifying such inquiry and consent to His Majesty as hereinafter directed, cause, with respect to his own diocese, a statement in writing of the facts, and in other cases a copy in writing of the aforesaid representation, to be affixed on or near the principal outer door of the Church, or in some public and conspicuous place in each of such benefices, sinecure rectories, or vicarages, with notice to any person or persons interested that he, she, or they may, within such six weeks, show cause in writing under his, her, or their hand or hands, to the said Archbishop against such union; and if no sufficient cause be shown within such time, the said Archbishop shall certify the inquiry and consent aforesaid to His Majesty in Council; and thereupon it shall be lawful for His Majesty in Council to make and issue an order or orders for uniting such benefices, sinecure rectory or rectories, vicarage or vicarages, into one benefice, with cure of souls, for ecclesiastical purposes only.'

And whereas the Right Honourable and Most Reverend Randall Thomas, Lord Archbishop of Canterbury, pursuant to the provisions of the said Act, hath duly prepared and laid before His Majesty in Council a certificate in writing, bearing date the 10th day of December, 1912, in the words following, that is to

say:—
"We, Randall Thomas, Archbishop of the Province of Canterbury, Primate of All England and Metropolitan, do hereby certify

to Your Majesty in Council—
"That the Right Reverend Bertram, Lord
Bishon of the diocese Bishop of Norwich, as Bishop of the diocese within which are situate the Rectory of Garveston and the Rectory of Thuxton, both in the county of Norfolk, having represented unto Us that the said benefices are contiguous to each other, and of which the aggregate population does not exceed 1,500 persons, might, with advantage to the interests of religion, be united into one benefice, we inquired into the circumstances of the case.

"That on such inquiry it appeared to Us that such union might be usefully made, and would not be of inconvenient extent, and that the Reverend Alfred John Alpe, Clerk, Rector of the said Rectory of Garveston, and also Rector of the said Rectory of Thuxton, being the patron or person entitled to present or nominate to both the said benefices, has con-

sented to the proposed union.

"That six weeks and upwards before certifying such inquiry and consent to Your Majesty in Council we caused a copy, in writing, of the aforesaid representation of the said Lord Bishop to be affixed to the principal outer door of the parish church of each of the said benefices, with notice to any person or persons interested, that he, she, or they might within such six weeks shew cause, in writing, under his, her, or their hand or hands, to us, the said Archbishop, and no such cause has been shewn.

"The representation of the said Lord Bishop of Norwich, Our inquiry into the circumstances of the case, the statement of circumstances in reply thereto, the consent in writing of the said patron, and the copies of the representation and notices before men-

tioned are hereunto annexed.

... And We do hereby certify the inquiry and consent aforesaid to Your Majesty in Council to the intent that Your Majesty in Council may in case Your Majesty in Council shall think fit so to do, make and issue an Order for uniting the said benefices into one benefice, with cure of souls for ecclesiastical purposes only.

Now, therefore, His Majesty in Council, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased to order, as it is hereby ordered, that the Rectory of Garveston, situate in the county of Norfolk and diocese of Norwich, and the Rectory of Thuxton, situate in the same county and diocese, shall be united into one benefice, with cure of souls for ecclesiastical purposes only.

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council. WHEREAS by section 26 of the Pluralities Act., 1838, after reciting that, "Whereas in some instances tithings, hamlets, chapelries, and other places or dis-

tricts may be separated from the parishes or mother churches to which they belong, with great advantage, and places altogether extraparochial may, in some instances, with advantage be annexed to parishes or districts to which they are contiguous, or be constituted separate parishes for ecclesiastical purposes," it is, amongst other things, enacted, "that when with respect to his own diocese it shall appear to the Archbishop of the Province, or when the Bishop of any diocese shall represent to the said Archbishop that any such tithing, hamlet, chapelry, place or district within the diocese of such Archbishop, or the diocese of such Bishop, as the case may be, may be advantageously separated from any parish or mother church, and either be constituted a separate benefice by itself or be united to any other parish to which it may be more conveniently annexed, or to any other adjoining tithing, hamlet, chapelry, place, or district, parochial or extra-parochial, so as to form a separate parish or benefice, or that any extraparochial place may with advantage be annexed to any parish to which it is contiguous, or be constituted a separate parish for ecclesiastical purposes: And the said Archbishop or Bishop shall draw up a scheme in writing (the scheme of such Bishop to be transmitted to the said Archbishop for his consideration) describing the mode in which it appears to him that the alteration may best be effected, and how the changes consequent on such alteration in respect to ecclesiastical jurisdiction, glebe lands, tithes, rent charges, and other ecclesiastical dues, rates, and payments, and in respect to patronage and rights to pews, may be made with justice to all parties interested; and if the patron or patrons of the benefice or benefices to be affected by such alteration shall consent in writing under his or their hands to such scheme, or to such modifi-cation thereof as the said Archbishop may approve, and the said Archbishop shall, on full consideration and inquiry, be satisfied with any such scheme, or modification thereof, and shall certify the same and such consent as aforesaid, by his report to His Majesty in Council, it shall be lawful for His Majesty in Council to make an Order for carrying such scheme, or modification thereof, as the case may be, into effect.''

And whereas the Right Reverend George Wyndham, Lord Bishop of Bath and Wells, hath pursuant to the enactment aforesaid, made a Representation in writing to the Right Honourable and Most Reverend Randall Thomas, Lord Archbishop of Canterbury, as follows:-

"We George Wyndham Lord Bishop of Bath and Wells do hereby represent to your Grace that there are in the county of Somerset and diocese of Bath and Wells the rectory and parish church of Blagdon and the Liberty or extra-parochial place of Charterhouse on Mendip anciently belonging to Witham Friary.

"That the annual income of the said benefice of Blagdon is about three hundred and seventyeight pounds gross and according to the last census the population thereof was nine hundred and fifty.

"That according to the last census the population of the said Liberty of Charterhouse on

Mendip was seventy-two.
"That there is a legal house of residence belonging to the said benefice of Blagdon but no house of residence belonging to the said Liberty

of Charterhouse on Mendip.

"That the said Liberty of Charterhouse on Mendip is coterminous with the civil parish of that name as delineated and described on the Ordnance Survey Map, 2nd edition, 1904, for that district, and contains about two thousand four hundred and fifty-seven acres, boundaries being clearly defined on the said

Ordnance Map.

"That the said Liberty of Charterhouse on Mendip was formerly a monastic foundation, and in proof of this there exists the Charter which confirmed the grant made by King Henry II out of his Royal Manor of Cheddar to the Carthusian House at Witham Friary. The grant was made about the year 1181, together with exemption by the then Bishop from tithes and all ecclesiastical dues, and continued in force until the dissolution of the monasteries. Since then the people residing there have been practically left without the means of Grace until the year 1893, when a fund was raised to provide a stipend for a clergyman to serve the said Liberty of Charter-This fund has continued house on Mendip. up to the present time, and has been raised entirely by voluntary contributions.
"That the said Liberty of Charterhouse on

Mendip is distant over twenty miles from the parish of Witham Friary, and has never within modern times been served by that parish, the distance rendering it practically

impossible.
"That baptisms, marriages and burials of persons residing in the said Liberty of Charterhouse on Mendip up to the year 1808 were and performed in the parish solemnized church of Cheddar, and since that date up to the present time have been selemnized and performed in the parish church of Blagdon, and only one or two isolated cases are known of the ceremonies being performed at Witham

Friary.
"That the said Liberty of Charterhouse on Mendip is contiguous to the said parish of Blagdon, with which it is much intermixed, and the inhabitants thereof could be more easily visited by the Rector of Blagdon than by the Vicar of Witham Friary or by the In-

cumbent of any of the neighbouring parishes.
"That the patronage of the said Rectory of Blagdon is vested in George Alfred Wills, of Burwalls, Leigh Woods, Clifton, Bristol, Esquire, and the patronage of the Perpetual Curacy of Witham Friary aforesaid is vested

in the Duke of Somerset.
"That it appears to us that under the provisions of the Pluralities Act 1838 the said Liberty of Charterhouse on Mendip so far as it may form part of the said Perpetual Curacy of Witham Friary or of any other parish than that of Blagdon may be advantageously separated therefrom and be united and annexed to the said Rectory and parish church of Blagdon for

ecclesiastical purposes.
"That pursuant to the directions contained in the 26th section of the said Act we have prepared the following scheme which together with the consents thereto in writing of the patron and Incumbent of the said Rectory of Blagdon and the patron and Incumbent of the said Perpetual Curacy of Witham Friary we do submit to Your Grace to the intent that Your Grace may if on full consideration and enquiry you shall be satisfied with such scheme certify the same and such consents by your report to His Majesty in Council."

And whereas the said scheme drawn up by the said Bishop of Bath and Wells and the consents referred to in the said representation are as follows:

"SCHEME.

"It is proposed that the said Liberty or extra-parochial place of Charterhouse on Mendip with the district particularly delineated on the Ordnance Survey Map 2nd Edition 1904 so far as it may form part of the Perpetual Curacy of Witham Friary or of any other parish than that of Blagdon shall be separated therefrom and shall be united and annexed to the parish of Blagdon aforesaid for ecclesiastical purposes and that the parish formed by such union be henceforth called or known as the parish of Blagdon with Charterhouse on Mendip.

"That the patronage of the said benefice of Blagdon with Charterhouse on Mendip shall be

vested in the said George Alfred Wills.

"That all fees and ecclesiastical dues and payments for churchings, marriages, burials and ecclesiastical offices solemnized and performed within the said Liberty or district of Charter-house on Mendip shall belong to the Incumbent and church officers of the parish of Blagdon with Charterhouse on Mendip.

"That the owners and occupiers of lands and hereditaments in the said Liberty or district of Charterhouse on Mendip shall be entitled in common with the parishioners of Blagdon to accommodation in the church of Blagdon but shall not hereafter be entitled to accommodation in the parish church of Witham Friary or any other church than that of Blagdon.'

"CONSENTS.

"I, George Alfred Wills, of Burwalls, Leigh Woods, Clifton, Bristol, Esquire, being the patron or person entitled to present to the Rectory of Blagdon in the county of Somerset and diocese of Bath and Wells and Your Grace's province if the same were now vacant do by this writing under my hand signify to Your Grace my consent to the scheme above proposed and to every matter and thing therein contained. "Witness my hand this 21st day of Septem-

ber one thousand nine hundred and twelve.

"That it appears to the said Lord Bishop that under the provisions of the Pluralities Act 1838 the said Liberty or extra-parochial place of Charterhouse on Mendip so far as it may form part of the said Perpetual Curacy of Witham Friary or of any other parish than that of Blagdon may be advantageously separated therefrom and be united and annexed to the said Rectory and parish church of Blagdon for

ecclesiastical purposes.

There is also in the said County of Stafford and Diocese of Lichfield the Benefice (being a Vicarage or Perpetual Curacy) of Croxden, the Ecclesiastical Parish whereof contains an area of 2,446.674 acres, and a population, according to the Census of 1901, of 195 or thereabouts. The net annual value of the Vicarage or Perpetual Curacy is £93 or thereabouts, and a house of residence is being provided for the said Banafice of Croxden

vided for the said Benefice of Croxden.

"3. There is within the said Parish of Checkley the Township or Hamlet of Hollington, containing within its limits the Consecrated Church or Chapel of Ease of St. John the Evangelist, and lying to the south-west of the said Parish of Croxden, and adjacent to it, and more particularly described in the First Schedule hereto. The said Township or Hamlet of Hollington contains by estimation an area of 1,323'467 acres, and a population of 500 or thereabouts.

of 500 or thereabouts.

'4. There is also in the said County of Stafford and Diocese of Lichfield the Benefice (being a New Vicarage or Perpetual Curacy) of Stramshall, the Ecclesiastical Parish whereof contains an area of 2,300 acres, and a population, according to the Census of 1901, of 465.

"5. There are within the said Ecclesiastical Parish of Stramshall certain outlying or detached portions of the Ecclesiastical Parish of Checkley containing an area of 145 15 acres or thereabouts, and an estimated population of 17 or thereabouts, and more particularly described in the Second Schedule hereto.

"6. There is also within the said Ecclesiastical Parish of Croxden a detached portion of the said Ecclesiastical Parish of Stramshall containing an area of 26.789 acres or thereabouts, and no population, and more particularly described in the Third Schedule hereto.
"7. It appears to me that under the provi-

'7. It appears to me that under the provisions of 'The Pluralities Act, 1838,' the following alterations in the contents of the above mentioned Parishes may advantageously be made, viz.:

(1) The separation of the area described in the first part of the Schedule hereto from the said Parish of Checkley and the annexation thereof to the said Parish of Croxden.

(2) The separation of the area described in the second part of the said Schedule hereto from the said Parish of Checkley and the annexation thereof to the said Parish of Stramshall.

- (3) The separation of the area described in the third part of the said Schedule hereto from the said Parish of Stramshall and the annexation thereof to the said Parish of Croxden.
- "8. The said Rectory of Checkley is in the patronage of the Reverend Edward Philips, of The Long Close, Hollington aforesaid, Clerk in Holy Orders, and the said Vicarage or Perpetual Curacy of Croxden is in the patronage of the Right Honourable George Loveden William Henry, Earl of Macclesfield, of Shirburn Castle, in the County of Oxford, the said Vicarage or Perpetual Curacy of Stramshall is in the patronage of the Reverend William Charles Granville Sharp, Clerk in Holy Orders, Vicar of the Vicarage of Uttoxeter, in the said County of Stafford and Diocese of Lichfield, in right of his Benefice.

"9. The Reverend George William Philips is the present Incumbent of the said Rectory of Checkley, the said Reverend Edward Philips is the present Incumbent of the said Vicarage or Perpetual Curacy of Croxden, and the Reverend Charles Frederick Lowry Barnwell is the present Incumbent of the said Vicarage

or Perpetual Curacy of Stramshall.

"10. Pursuant to the directions contained in the 26th Section of the said Act of Parliament I, the said Bishop of Lichfield, have drawn up a Scheme in writing annexed to this Representation describing:

(1) The district of the said Parish of Checkley so as aforesaid proposed to be annexed to the said Parish of Croxden.

(2) The district of the said Parish of Checkley so as aforesaid proposed to be annexed to the said Parish of Stramshall, and

(3) The district of the said Parish of Stramshall so as aforesaid proposed to be annexed to the said Parish of Croxden

and the mode in which it appears to me that the alterations may be best effected and how the changes consequent on such alterations in respect to ecclesiastical jurisdiction, glebe lands, tithe rent charge and other ecclesiastical dues and payments, and in respect to patronage and rights to pews may be made with justice to all parties interested. And I do hereby submit the same to Your Grace, together with the Consents in writing of the said patrons and Incumbents of the Benefices of Checkley, Croxden and Stramshall aforesaid to the intent that if Your Grace shall on full consideration and enquiry be satisfied with such Scheme you may certify the same and such Consents by your report to His Majesty in Council."

And whereas the said Scheme drawn up by the said Bishop and the Consents referred to in the said Representation are as follows:—

"SCHEME.

"That a district consisting of all that part of the said Parish of Checkley which is more particularly described in the first part of the Schedule hereto, and together with the boundaries thereof is more particularly delineated and set forth in the map or plan hereunto annexed, and thereon coloured round with Red, containing within its limits the Consecrated Church or Chapel of Ease of St. John the Evangelist, shall be separated from the

said Parish of Checkley, and annexed for Ecclesiastical purposes to the Parish of Croxden.

1 "That the Consecrated Church or Chapel of Ease of St. John the Evangelist shall cease to be a Chapel of Ease to the Church of the Parish of Checkley, and shall become and be a Chapel of Ease to the Church of the Parish of Croxden for the use of the parishioners and inhabitants

"That the parishioners and inhabitants of the Parish of Checkley shall cease to be entitled to accommodation in the said Consecrated Church or Chapel of St. John the Evangelist, Hollington, and to all rights of baptism, marriage, churching, or burial therein (if any), hitherto possessed or enjoyed by them therein. That a district consisting of all those detached and outlying portions of the said Parish of Checkley, which are more particularly described in the second part of the said Schedule, hereto, and together with the boundaries thereof are more particularly delineated and set forth on the said map or plan hereunto annexed, and thereon coloured Blue, shall be separated from the said Parish of Checkley and annexed for Ecclesiastical purposes to the said Parish of Stramshall.

"That a district consisting of all that detached portion of the said Parish of Stramshall which is more particularly described in the third part of the said Schedule hereto, and together with the boundaries thereof is more particularly delineated and set forth on the said map or plan hereunto annexed, and thereon coloured Yellow, shall be separated from the said Parish of Stramshall, and annexed for Ecclesiastical purposes to the said

Parish of Croxden.

"That the Incumbents of the said Parishes to which such districts shall respectively be annexed shall have the sole and exclusive cure of souls within such districts respectively.

That the inhabitants of such districts shall respectively be entitled to accommodation in the Parish Church and Chapel of Ease of the Parish to which such districts shall respectively be annexed, but shall cease to be entitled to accommodation in the Church of the Parish from which the same shall respectively have been separated.

"That marriages, baptisms, churchings and burials for the inhabitants of such districts shall be solemnized and performed in the Church of the Parish to which the district where such inhabitants reside shall be annexed, or in the Chapel of Ease (if any) of such Parish, so far as the same may be lawfully solemnized and performed therein, but not further or otherwise, and all fees, dues, ecclesiastical offerings and emoluments (except tithe rent charge) arising from such districts shall hereafter belong to the Incumbent of the Parish to which the district whence the same arises shall be annexed.

In pursuance of the powers conferred on me by the Wild Birds Protection Acts, 1880 to 1908, and upon application by the Council of the County Borough of Barrow-in-Furness, I hereby make the following Order:—

Title.

I. This Order may be cited as "The Wild Birds Protection (County Borough of Barrowin-Furness) Order, 1913."

BIRDS.

Close Time Extended.

II. The time during which the killing or taking of Wild Birds is prohibited by the Wild Birds Protection Act, 1880, shall be extended, so far as concerns the County Borough of Barrow-in-Furness, so as to be between the 31st day of January and the 1st day of September in any year, except with respect to the following birds:—Mallard, Wild Duck, Snipe, Teal (other than Garganey), Widgeon, and Woodcock.

Additions to the Schedule of the Act of 1880.

III. The Wild Birds Protection Act, 1880, shall apply within the County Borough of Barrow-in-Furness to the following species of Wild Birds in the same manner as if those species were included in the Schedule to the Act:—

Hedge Accentor (Hedge Sparrow), Black-bird, Black-headed Bunting, Common Bunting, Yellow Bunting (Yellow Hammer), Buzzard, Creeper, Dipper, Stock Dove, Pied Flycatcher, Spotted Flycatcher, Hawfinch, Heron, Hobby, Kestrel, Linnet, House Martin, Sand Martin, Merlin, Moorhen, Nuthatch, Ring Ouzel, Pipits, Lesser Redpole, Redstart, Robin, Stonechat, Swallow, Swift, Thrush, Tits, Pied Wagtail, Grey Wagtail, Yellow Wagtail, Blackcap Warbler, Garden Warbler, Reed Warbler, Sedge Warbler, Willow Warbler, Wood Warbler, Wheatear, Whinchat, Whitethroat, Lesser Whitethroat, Wren, Golden-crested Wren.

Certain Birds Protected during the whole of the Year.

IV: During that period of the year to which the protection afforded by the Wild Birds Protection Act, 1880, as extended by Clause II of this Order, does not apply, the killing or taking of any of the following species of Wild Birds is prohibited throughout the County Borough of Barrow-in-Furness:—

Blackbird, Goldfinch, Kingfisher, Lark, Linnet, Robin, Thrush, Wren, Golden-crested

 \mathbf{Wren} .

All Birds Protected on Sundays and on Christmas Day throughout the County Borough.

V. During those periods of the year to which the protection afforded by the Wild Birds Protection Act, 1880, as extended by Clause II of this Order, does not apply, the killing or taking of Wild Birds on Sundays and on Christmas Day is prohibited throughout the County Borough of Barrow-in-Furness.

Eccs.

All Eggs Protected within a certain Area.

VI. The taking or destroying of the eggs of any species of Wild Birds is prohibited within that part of the County Borough of Barrow-inFurness known as the Island of Walney for a period of five years from the date of this Order.

Certain Eggs Protected throughout the County Borough.

VII. The taking or destroying of the eggs of the following species of Wild Birds is prohibited throughout the County Borough of Barrow-in-Furness:—

Blackbird, Chaffinch, Curlew, Dipper, Stock Dove, Wild Duck, Goldfinch, Black-headed Gull, Pied Flycatcher, Heron, Kestrel, Kingfisher, Moorhen, Nightjar (Goat Sucker, Night Hawk, or Fern Owl), Owl, Oyster Catcher, Ringed Plover, Redshank, Robin, Sandpiper, Sheldrake, Snipe, Teal, Tern, Thrush, Longtailed Tit, Wheatear, Whitethroat, Lesser Whitethroat, Woodcock, Golden-crested Wren.

"Provided that if the Admiralty at any time consider that, on the grounds of public safety, the provisions of this sub-section should not be applicable with respect to any pilotage district or part of a pilotage district they may make an order excluding that district or part of a district from the operation of those provisions; and while any such order is in force with respect to any such district or part of a district a certificate granted under those provisions shall not be of any effect within that district or part of a district."

And whereas by Regulation 13 of the National Insurance (Joint Committee) Regulations, 1912, it is provided that the Joint Committee alone shall exercise the power of making under sub-section 4 of section 9 of the Act tables in accordance with which the reduced rate payable in the case of the persons referred to in that sub-section is to be fixed and the power of making under sub-section 1 of section 55 of the Act tables showing reserve values:

Now, therefore, the Joint Committee, in pursuance of the powers above recited, and of all other powers enabling them in that behalf, have caused to be prepared the table hereto appended, showing—

(a) the reduced rates of sickness benefit to which female insured persons are entitled who, not having been previously insured, and not being persons to whom sub-section 5 of section 44 of the Act applies, become employed contributors subsequently to the expiration of one year from the commencement of the Act, at the ages shown in the first column of that table, and who do not prove that their time since they attained the age of 17 has been spent in a school or college, in indentured apprenticeship or otherwise under instruction without wages, or otherwise in the completion of their education, or who do not undertake them-selves to pay the difference between the voluntary rate and the employed rate, or who do not pay to the Insurance Commissioners such capital sum as is sufficient to secure them benefits at the full rate;

(b) in cases in which such provision is necessary, the reserve values which it is necessary to provide in Great Britain or in Ireland in respect of such female insured persons as aforesaid.
