MOTOR CAR ACT, 1903.

Regulations under Section 8.

COUNTY OF MIDDLESEX AND BOROUGH OF RICHMOND (SURREY).

To the County Council of Middlesex;—
To the Mayor, Aldermen, and Burgesses of the Borough of Richmond, in the County of Surrey;—
And to all others whom it may concern.

WHEREAS Richmond Bridge is situate partly within the Urban District of Twickenham, in the County of Middlesex, and partly within the Borough of Richmond, in the County of Surrey;

And whereas under Regulations made by an Order dated the 7th day of December, 1911, issued by Us, the Local Government Board, under sub-section (1) of Section 9 of the Motor Car Act, 1903, on the application of the County Council of Middlesex and the Town Council of the Borough of Richmond, a motor car may not be driven at a speed exceeding ten miles per hour along Bridge Street, Richmond, and so much of the road passing over Richmond Bridge as extends from its junction with Bridge Street to its junction with Willoughby Road, in the Urban District of Twickenham;

And whereas by Section 8 of the Motor Car Act, 1903, it is provided that We may, in the circumstances there specified, by Regulations made under Section 6 of the Locomotives on Highways Act, 1896, restrict the driving of any motor cars, or of any special kind of motor cars, on any specified highway, or part of a highway;

And whereas by the Heavy Motor Car Order, 1904, issued by Us in pursuance of the Motor Car Acts, 1896 and 1903, the expression "heavy motor car" in that Order is defined as a motor car exceeding two tons in weight unladen;

And whereas the County Council of Middlesex and the Town Council of the Borough of Richmond having applied to Us to make a Regulation in pursuance of the above-cited Sections further restricting the driving of heavy motor cars on the highways aforesaid, We directed a Local Inquiry to be held into the matter by one of Our Inspectors, and an Inquiry was held accordingly, and Report has been made to Us thereon:

NOW THEREFORE, in pursuance of the

powers given to Us in that behalf, We do hereby make the following Regulations:—

ARTICLE I.—The expression "heavy motor car" in this Order shall have the same meaning as the like expression in the Heavy Motor Car Order, 1904.

ARTICLE II.—A person shall not drive a heavy motor car at a speed exceeding five miles per hour on so much of the highway passing over Richmond Bridge as extends for a distance of eighty-three yards in each direction from the centre of the Bridge.

ARTICLE III.—These Regulations shall come into operation on the seventh day of April, one thousand nine hundred and thirteen.

MOTOR CAR ACT, 1903.

Regulations under Section 9 (1).

COUNTY OF MIDDLESEX.

URBAN DISTRICT OF HARROW-ON-THE-HILL.

To the County Council of Middlesex;—
And to all others whom it may concern.

WHEREAS by sub-section (1) of Section 9 of the Motor Car Act, 1903 (hereinafter referred to as "the Act"), it is enacted that, within any limits or place referred to in Regulations made by Us, the Local Government Board, with a view to the safety of the public, on the application of the local authority of the area in which the limits or place are situate, a person shall not drive a motor car at a speed exceeding ten miles per hour;

And whereas We have received and duly considered an application from the County Council of Middlesex for the issue of a Regulation in pursuance of the said sub-section putting the above-mentioned provisions of that sub-section in force within the limits comprising the road hereinafter mentioned.

NOW THEREFORE, in pursuance of the powers given to Us in that behalf, We do, by this Our Order, make the following Regulations:—

ARTICLE I.—The provisions of sub-section (1) of section 9 of the Act with respect to the driving of a motor car at a speed not exceeding ten miles per hour shall apply and have effect within the limits comprising West Street, Harrow, extending from its junction with High Street to its junction with Bessborough Road and Lower Road.

ARTICLE II.—These Regulations shall come into operation on the seventh day of April, One thousand nine hundred and thirteen.
