

Re ROBERT SHARMAN, Deceased.

PURSUANT to a Judgment of the Chancery Division of the High Court of Justice, dated the 28th day of February, 1913, and made in the Matter of the trusts of an indenture of settlement, dated the 7th day of June, 1881, and made between Robert Sharman of the one part, and Anna Sharman and Amelia Sharman of the other part, in an action of Bulloch against Kerr (1912, Letter S, No 1,935, Liverpool District Registry), the following enquiries were directed, viz.:—(1) An inquiry who were the persons who would have been entitled by virtue of or according to the Statute of Distribution to the personal estate of the said Robert Sharman if he had lived up to and died immediately after the 4th day of June, 1909, the date of the death of (his daughter) the said Amelia Sharman, and whether any of them are since dead, and if so, who are their respective legal personal representatives.
