#### PRESENT,

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Act of the eighth and ninth years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, chapter seventy, of the Act of the fourteenth and fifteenth years of Her said late Majesty, chapter ninety-seven, and of the Act of the nineteenth and twentieth years of Her said late Majesty, chapter fifty-five, duly prepared and laid before His Majesty in Council a Representation, bearing date the twenty-seventh day of February, in the year one thousand nine hundred and thirteen, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of the Act of the eighth and ninth years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, chapter seventy, of the Act of the fourteenth and fifteenth years of Her said late Majesty, chapter ninety-seven, and of the Act of the nineteenth and twentieth years of Her said late Majesty, chapter fifty-five, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following representation as to the assignment of a consolidated chapelry to the consecrated church of All

Saints, Hanley, situate within the new parish (sometime district) of Wellington, in the county of Stafford and in the diocese of Lichfield.

"Whereas at certain extremities of the said new parish of Wellington, of the district parish of Shelton, and of the new parish (sometime district) of Saint Jude, Hanley, both in the said county and diocese, which said extremities lie contiguous one to another, and are described in the Schedule hereunder written, there is collected together a population which is situate at a distance from the several churches of such new parishes and district parish.

"And whereas it appears to us to be expedient that certain contiguous portions (being the portions containing the population aforesaid) of the said new parish of Wellington, of the said district parish of Shelton, and of the said new parish of Saint Jude, Hanley, should be formed into a consolidated chapelry for all ecclesiastical purposes, and that the same should be assigned to the said church of All Saints, Hanley, situate as aforesaid.

"Now, therefore, with the consent of the Honourable and Right Reverend Augustus, Bishop of Lichfield, as such Bishop, and also as the alternate patron, in right of his See, of the vicarage of the said new parish of Welling-

ton, with the consent of the Right Honourable Herbert Henry Asquith, the First Lord of Your Majesty's Treasury, acting on behalf of Your Majesty as the other alternate patron of the said vicarage of the new parish of Wellington, with the consent of the Reverend Alfred William Carter, of Number 54, Priory Road, Kew, in the county of Surrey, Clerk in Holy Orders, as the patron of the vicarage of the said district parish of Shelton, and with the consent of the Reverend Henry Venn Stuart, Clerk in Holy Orders, Rector or Incumbent of the rectory of the parish of Stoke-upon-Trent, in the said county of Stafford and diocese of Lichfield, and as such Rector or Incumbent, the patron of the vicarage of the said new parish of Saint Jude, Hanley (in testimony whereof they, the said consenting parties, have respectively signed and sealed this representation), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, humbly represent, that it would, in our opinion, be expedient that all those contiguous portions of the said new parish of Wellington, of the said district parish of Shelton, and of the said new parish of Saint Jude, Hanley, which are described in the Schedule hereunder written, all which portions, together with the boundaries thereof. are delineated and set forth on the map or plan hereunto annexed, should be united and formed into one consolidated chapelry for the said church of All Saints, Hanley, situate as aforesaid, and that the same should be named 'The Consolidated Chapelry of All Saints, Hanley.

"We, therefore, humbly pray that Your Majesty will be graciously pleased to take the premises into Your Royal consideration, and to make such Order in respect thereto as to Your Majesty in Your Royal Wisdom shall seem meet.

"The SCHEDULE to which the foregoing Representation has reference.

"The consolidated chapelry of All Saints, Hanley, comprising:—

"All those contiguous portions of the new parish (sometime district) of Wellington, of the new parish (sometime district) of Saint Jude, Hanley, and of the district parish of Shelton, all in the county of Stafford and in the diocese of Lichfield, which, taken together, are bounded upon the north-east partly by the parish of Bucknall and Bagnall, and partly by the new parish of Northwood, both in the said county and diocese, and upon the remaining sides, that is to say, upon the north-west, upon the west, upon the south, and upon the southeast by an imaginary line commencing upon the boundary which divides the said new parish of Northwood from the said new parish of Wellington at the centre of Ivy House Bridge which carries Bucknall Road across the Caldon Canal, and extending thence first southwestward and then in various directions along the middle of the said canal (thereby crossing the boundary which divides the said new parish of Wellington from the said district parish of Shelton) for a distance of one mile and nine chains or thereabouts to the centre of the bridge which carries Ridgway Road across such canal, and extending thence southward along the middle of Ridgway Road for a distance of eight chains and a half or thereabouts to its

junction with the road called Poplar Grove, and extending thence south-eastward along the middle of Poplar Grove for a distance of three chains or thereabouts to its junction with Leek Road, and continuing thence south-eastward in precisely the same direction and in a straight line for a distance of ten chains or thereabouts to a point in the middle of the River Trent upon the boundary which divides the said district parish of Shelton from the said new parish of Saint Jude, Hanley, and extending thence first south-eastward and then in various directions along the middle of the River Trent (thereby following in part the last-mentioned boundary) for a distance of twenty-six chains or thereabouts to a point opposite to the outlet of the watercourse from the Berry Hill Colliery Pumping Station, and extending thence northeastward to and along the fence which indicates the position of the said watercourse for a distance of two chains or thereabouts to the point where such fence meets the boundary of the county borough of Stoke-on-Trent, and extending thence first north-eastward, then south-eastward, and then again north-eastward along the said county borough boundary (thereby crossing Fenton Road) for a distance of nineteen chains or thereabouts to the point where such boundary crosses the fence forming the western boundary of the Biddulph Valley Branch Line of the North Staffordshire Railway, and extending thence eastward in a straight line (thereby crossing the said branch line of railway and the roadway leading from Berry Hill to Fenton) for a distance of thirtythree chains or thereabouts to the point south of the pool situate on the eastern side of such roadway where the boundary of the said county borough of Stoke-on-Trent diverges eastward from the said roadway, and extending thence first eastward and then in various directions along the said county borough boundary (thereby following in part the south-western side of the roadway leading from the Berry Hill and Holly Bush Collieries to the Lawn Colliery) for a distance of sixty chains or thereabouts to the point where the said county borough boundary diverges south-westward from the last-mentioned roadway, and extending thence first north-eastward to the middle of such roadway and then first south-eastward and then north-eastward along the middle of the same roadway (thereby crossing the Longton, Adderley Green and Bucknall Branch Line of the North Staffordshire Railway) for a distance of twenty chains or thereabouts to the centre of the bridge or culvert which carries such roadway across the stream known as The Brook, upon the boundary which divides the said new parish of Saint Jude, Hanley, from the said parish of Bucknall and Bagnall."

And whereas the said Representation has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said Representation, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts. And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of Lichfield.

[Classification of Explosives.—Order in Council No. 1 (B), Amending No. 1. Explosives Act, 1875 (38 Vict., c. 17).]

#### PRESENT,

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS by the 106th section of the Explosives Act, 1875 (in this Order referred to as the Act), it is provided that His Majesty from time to time, by Order in Council, may define for the purposes of this Act the composition, quality, and character of any explosive, and may classify explosives;

And whereas in pursuance of the Act an Order in Council was made on the 5th day of August, 1875, classifying explosives;

And whereas the provisions of the first section of the Rules Publication Act, 1893, have been complied with:

Now, therefore, in pursuance of the abovementioned provisions of the Act, His Majesty is pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to order as follows:—

Any explosive containing a perchlorate and not included in any of the Classes 3, 4, or 5, as defined in the said Order in Council dated 5th August, 1875, shall be deemed to belong to Class 2 (Nitrate-mixture Class), and all orders, rules, or regulations applying to explosives of Class 2 shall be deemed to apply to the said explosive.

W HEREAS by the Seal Fisheries (North Pacific) Act, 1895 (hereinafter called the Act of 1895), it is enacted that His Majesty in Council may by Order in Council prohibit, during the period specified by the Order, the catching of seals by British ships in such parts of the seas to which that Act applies as are specified in the Order;

And whereas by the Seal Fisheries (North Pacific) Act, 1912 (hereinafter called the Act of 1912), it is enacted that His Majesty in Council shall have the like power to prohibit the killing, taking, and hunting of sea otters within the waters to which the Act of 1895 applies;

And whereas it is further provided by the Act of 1895 that for carrying into effect an arrangement with any foreign State an Order in Council may provide that the powers under the Act of any commissioned officer on full pay in the naval service of His Majesty may,

subject to any limitations, conditions, modifications, and exceptions specified in the Order, be exercised in relation to a British ship, and the equipment, crew, and certificate thereof, by such officers of the said foreign State as are specified in the Order;

And whereas it is further provided by the Act of 1895 that any such Order may contain any limitations, conditions, modifications, and exceptions which appear to His Majesty in Council expedient for carrying into effect the object of the Act;

And whereas by the Act of 1912 it is enacted that the seas with respect to which an Order in Council may be made under the Act of 1895 shall include the seas within such part of the Pacific Ocean as is north of the thirtieth parallel of north latitude, including the Seas of Behring, Kamchatka, Okhotsk, and Japan;

And whereas a convention has been concluded between His Majesty the King, the President of the United States of America, His Majesty the Emperor of Japan, and His Majesty the Emperor of Russia, whereby British subjects and British vessels engaged in pelagic sealing in the waters to which this Order applies may be seized and detained by the naval or other duly commissioned officers of any of the parties to the said convention and delivered as soon as practicable to an authorized official of their own nation;

And whereas the provisions of the Rules Publication Act, 1893, have been complied with:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, in virtue of the above powers, and of all other powers enabling Him in that behalf, is hereby pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:—

- 1. From and after the commencement of this Order the catching of seals and the killing, taking, and hunting of sea otters by British ships is hereby prohibited within the waters to which this Order applies.
- 2. The powers under the Act of 1895 of a commissioned officer on full pay in the naval service of His Majesty may be exercised in relation to a British ship, and the equipment, crew, and certificate thereof, by a naval or other duly commissioned officer of the United States of America, or of His Majesty the Emperor of Japan, or of His Majesty the Emperor of Russia (hereinafter referred to as an "authorized foreign officer"), but subject to the limitations, conditions, modifications, and exceptions following, that is to say:—
- (1) The said powers shall not be exercised by an authorized foreign officer, except in relation to British ships engaged in hunting seals within the waters to which the Order applies.
- (2) A British ship shall not be liable to seizure or detention by an authorized foreign officer by reason of the contravention of any regulations made under section 2 of the Act of 1895.
- (3) The powers under section 3 of the Act of 1895 of detaining any portion of the equipment or any of the crew, and the powers under section 4 of giving a provisional certificate in lieu of a ship's certificate which is seized and retained, or of endorsing on a certificate the grounds on which it was seized, and of directing the ship to proceed forthwith to a specified

port, shall not be exercised in relation to a British ship by an authorized foreign officer.

- (4) Where an authorized foreign officer in exercise of the said powers stops and examines and detains a British ship or her certificate of registry, he shall as soon as possible hand over the ship, or deliver or transmit the certificate, as the case may be, either to the commanding officer of a British cruiser or to the nearest British authority, as defined by this Order, and shall then, or within a reasonable time thereafter, satisfy such officer or authority that there were reasonable grounds for the detention or seizure, and that the case is proper to be adjudicated in a British court, and also furnish to such officer or authority the evidence sufficient, in the opinion of such officer or authority for such adjudication; and if the said foreign officer fails to satisfy such officer or authority, or to furnish to such officer or authority such sufficient evidence as aforesaid, the said officer or authority may release the
- 3.—(1) Where the commanding officer of a British cruiser receives a British ship from an authorized foreign officer, and is satisfied that there were reasonable grounds for the detention or seizure, and that the case is proper to be adjudicated in a British court, he may exercise the powers conferred by section 4 of the Act of 1895 as if he had himself stopped and examined and detained the ship, and that section shall apply accordingly.
- (2) Where the commanding officer of a British cruiser, or a British authority, receives a British ship from an authorized foreign officer, and sends the case for adjudication in a British court, he shall, for the purposes of section 76 of the Merchant Shipping Act, 1894, be deemed to have himself seized or detained the said ship.
  - 4. Nothing in this Order shall apply to Indians, Ainos, Aleuts, or other aborigines dwelling on the coasts of the waters to which this Order applies, who carry on pelagic sealing in canoes not transported by or used in connection with other vessels, and propelled entirely by oars, paddles, or sails, and manned by not more than five persons each, in the way hitherto practised, and without the use of firearms, provided that such Indians, Ainos, Aleuts, or other aborigines are not in the employment of other persons, or under contract to deliver the skins to any person.
  - 5. For the purposes of this Order, the expression "British authority" means any officer of Customs in His Majesty's dominions, and any British consular officer having authority as such in any port or place.
  - "The waters to which the Order applies" means such part of the Pacific Ocean beyond the limits of territorial waters as is north of the thirtieth parallel of north latitude, including the Seas of Behring, Kamchatka, Okhotsk, and Japan.
  - 6. The Seal Fisheries (North Pacific) Order in Council, 1895, is hereby repealed, without prejudice to anything done or suffered under that Order.
  - 7. This Order may be cited as "The Seal Fisheries (North Pacific) Order in Council, 1913."

And the Right Honourable Sir Edward Grey, Baronet, K.G., and the Right Honourable Lewis Harcourt, M.P., two of His Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, and the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, are to give the necessary directions herein as to them may respectively appertain.

And whereas by section 4 of the Seal Fisheries (North Pacific) Act, 1912, the importation of the skins of seals captured in contravention of any such Order as last aforesaid was prohibited.

And whereas by section 5 (1) of the said Act it was enacted that His Majesty might by Order in Council extend the provisions of the two hereinbefore recited sections to any part of His Majesty's Dominions outside the United Kingdom, subject to such modifications and adaptations as might appear to Him to be necessary, provided that those provisions should not be so extended to a self-governing Dominion except with the consent of the Governor-General in Council or Governor in Council of the Dominion.

And whereas the Commonwealth of Australia is a self-governing Dominion for the purposes of section 5 of the said Act.

And whereas the Governor-General in Council of the Commonwealth of Australia has consented that the provisions of sections 3 and 4 of the said Act shall be extended to the Commonwealth of Australia subject to the modifications and adaptations hereinafter contained.

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in this behalf by the Seal Fisheries (North Pacific) Act, 1912, in His Majesty vested, is pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:—

- 1. This Order may be cited as the Seal Fisheries (Commonwealth of Australia) Order in Council, 1913.
- 2. From and after the commencement of this Order sections 3 and 4 of the Seal Fisheries (North Pacific) Act, 1912, shall apply to the Commonwealth of Australia subject to the following modifications and adaptations, that is to say:—
  - (i) For the words "the United Kingdom" in section 3 (1) of the said Act there shall be

deemed to be substituted the words "the Commonwealth of Australia."

- (ii) In section 3 (2) of the said Act for the words "the Secretary of State," wherever those words occur, there shall be deemed to be substituted the words "the Minister for Trade and Customs," and for the words "the Board of Trade or any Officer of the Board" the words "any Officer of Customs."
- (iii) At the end of section 3 (2) there shall be deemed to be added the words "or any Act of the Parliament of the Commonwealth relating to navigation or shipping."
- (iv) In section 4 of the said Act there shall be deemed to be substituted for the words "be deemed to be included in the table of prohibitions and restrictions contained in section 42 of the Customs Consolidation Act, 1876, and that section shall apply accordingly," the words "be prohibited to be imported, and shall be deemed to be included in the table of prohibited imports contained in section 52 of the Customs Act, 1901-1910, and that Act shall apply accordingly."
- 3. This Order shall come into operation on such date as shall be fixed by the Governor-General in Council.

And whereas by section 4 of the Seal Fisheries (North Pacific) Act, 1912, the importation of the skins of seals captured in contravention of any such Order as last aforesaid was prohibited.

And whereas by section 5 (1) of the said Act it was enacted that His Majesty might by Order in Council extend the provisions of the two hereinbefore recited sections to any part of His Majesty's Dominions outside the United Kingdom, subject to such modifications and adaptations as might appear to Him to be necessary, provided that those provisions should not be so extended to a self-governing Dominion except with the consent of the Governor-General in Council or Governor in Council of the Dominion.

And whereas the Colony of Newfoundland is a self-governing Dominion for the purposes of section 5 of the said Act.

And whereas the Governor in Council of

Newfoundland has consented that the provisions of sections 3 and 4 of the said Act shall be extended to Newfoundland subject to the modifications and adaptations hereinafter contained.

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in this behalf by the Seal Fisheries (North Pacific) Act, 1912, in His Majesty vested, is pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:—

- 1. This Order may be cited as the Seal Fisheries (Newfoundland) Order in Council, 1913.
- 2. From and after the commencement of this Order sections 3 and 4 of the Seal Fisheries (North Pacific) Act, 1912, shall apply to Newfoundland, subject to the following modifications and adaptations, that is to say:—
  - (i) For the words "Within the United Kingdom" in section 3 (1) of the said Act there shall be deemed to be substituted the words "in the Colony of Newfoundland."
  - (ii) In section 3 (2) of the said Act for the words "Secretary of State," wherever such words occur, there shall be deemed to be substituted the words "Colonial Secretary," and for the words "The Board of Trade or any officer of the Board" the words "any Officer of the Customs."
  - (iii) In section 4 of the said Act there shall be deemed to be substituted for the words "section 42 of the Customs Consolidation Act, 1876," the words "Schedule C. of the Customs Tariff," and for the word "section" in the last line of the said section 4 there shall be deemed to be substituted the word "schedule."
- 3. This Order shall come into operation on such date as may be fixed by the Governor in Council.

And whereas by section 4 of the Seal Fisheries (North Pacific) Act, 1912, the importation of the skins of seals captured in contravention of any such Order as last aforesaid was prohibited:

And whereas by section 5 (1) of the said Act it was enacted that His Majesty might by Order in Council extend the provisions of the two hereinbefore recited sections to any part of His Majesty's Dominions outside the United Kingdom, to any British Protectorate, and to Cyprus, subject to such modifications and adaptations as might appear to him to be necessary:

And whereas by treaty, grant, usage, sufferance, or other lawful means His Majesty the King has jurisdiction in and over Cyprus and within the Dominions of His Highness the Sultan of Zanzibar:

And whereas it is desirable that the provisions of the sections 3 and 4 of the Seal Fisheries (North Pacific) Act, 1912, should be extended to the Colonies and Protectorates enumerated in the Schedule to this Order and to Cyprus and to the Dominions of the Sultan of Zanzibar subject to the modifications and adaptations hereinafter contained:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in this behalf by the Seal Fisheries (North Pacific) Act, 1912, the Foreign Jurisdiction Act, 1890, or otherwise in His Majesty vested, is pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:—

- 1. This Order may be cited as the Seal Fisheries (Crown Colonies and Protectorates) Order in Council, 1913.
- 2. The word "Zanzibar" in this Order shall have the same meaning as in the Zanzibar Order in Council, 1906.
- 3. From and after the commencement of this Order sections 3 and 4 of the Seal Fisheries (North Pacific) Act, 1912, shall apply to the Colonies and Protectorates enumerated in the Schedule to this Order and to Cyprus and to Zanzibar (all of which Colonies and Protectorates and Cyprus and Zanzibar are hereinafter referred to as "Territories" affected"), subject to the following modifications and adaptations, that is to say:—
  - (i) For the words "The United Kingdom" in section 3 (1) of the said Act there shall be deemed to be substituted in the case of each Territory affected the name of such Territory.
  - (ii) In section 3 (2) of the said Act for the words "Secretary of State" wherever such words occur in the case of all Territories affected other than Zanzibar there shall be deemed to be substituted the words "Officer administering the Government," and in the case of Zanzibar the words "His Majesty's Agent and Consul-General for Zanzibar," and for the words "The Board of Trade or any officer of the Board" the words "any customs officer."
  - (iii) In section 4 of the said Act there shall be deemed to be substituted for the words "section 42 of the Customs Consolidation Act, 1876," a reference to the enactment in force in the Territory affected whereby the importation of goods is prohibited or restricted, and such enactment shall apply accordingly.
- 4. This Order shall be published in the Government Gazette of each of the Territories

affected other than Zanzibar, and shall thereupon come into operation in such Territory. In the case of Zanzibar, this Order shall be published at Zanzibar in such manner as the Secretary of State shall direct by His Majesty's Agent and Consul-General, and shall thereupon come into operation.

WHEREAS His Majesty, by virtue of the authority conferred on Him by the Copyright Act, 1911, and having regard to the provisions of the Berlin Copyright Convention, was pleased to make an Order in Council, dated the 24th day of June, 1912 (hereinafter called the Principal Order), extending the protection of the said Act to certain classes of works to which protection is guaranteed by the said Convention.

And whereas by Orders in Council dated the 17th day of March, 1913, the provisions of the Principal Order were extended, subject to certain modifications, to Denmark and the Netherlands.

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And whereas the Kingdom of the Netherlands has acceded on behalf of the Netherlands East Indies and the Colony of Curaçao, to the said Berlin Copyright Convention subject to the reservations mentioned in the Schedule to this Order;

Now therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His Privy Council and by virtue of the authority conferred upon Him by the Copyright Act, 1911, is pleased to order and it is hereby ordered as follows:—

- (1) The Principal Order shall extend to the Netherlands East Indies and the Colony of Curação as if they were amongst the foreign countries of the Copyright Union therein named, subject to the following modifications:—
  - (a) The provisions of Article (2), Proviso
    (iii.)
    (b) and of Article (2), Proviso (iii.)
    (c) of the Principal Order shall apply as if the Netherlands East Indies and the Colony of Curação were included amongst the foreign countries named in those provisions.
    - (b) In the application to works of which

the country of origin is the Netherlands East Indies or the Colony of Curação of section 1 (2) (d) and 19 of the Copyright Act, 1911, the date of this Order shall be substituted for the commencement of the Act in sections 19 (7) and 19 (8) wherever that expression occurs and the 1st April, 1913, for the passing of the Act.

- (c) In the application to such works of the provisions of section 24 of the Copyright Act, 1911, the date of this Order shall be substituted for the commencement of the Act wherever that expression occurs in subsection (1) (a) and for the 26th July, 1910, in sub-section (1) (b).
- (d) In the application to such works of the provisions of Article 3 of the Principal Order, the date of this Order shall be substituted for the commencement of the Principal Order.

And the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury are to give the necessary Orders accordingly.

that no new burial ground shall be opened in such city or town, or within such limits, without such previous approval, or (as the case may require) that, after a time mentioned in the Order, burials in such city or town, or within such limits, or in such burial grounds or places of burial, shall be discontinued wholly, or subject to any exceptions or qualifications mentioned in such Order, and so from time to time as circumstances may require: Provided always that notice of such representation, and of the time when it shall please His Majesty to order the same to be taken into consideration by the Privy Council, shall be published in the London Gazette, and shall be affixed on the doors of the churches or chapels of, or on some other conspicuous places within, the parishes affected by such representation, one month before such representation is so considered: Provided also that no such representation shall be made in relation to the burial ground of any parish until ten days' previous notice of ' the intention to make such representation shall have been given to the Incumbent and the vestry clerk or churchwardens of such parish:

And whereas the Local Government Board, after giving to the Incumbent and the churchwardens of the parish of All Cannings, in the county of Wilts, ten days' previous notice of their intention in that behalf, have made a representation to His Majesty in Council that, for the protection of the public health, the opening of any new burial ground in the civil parish of All Cannings, in the county of Wilts, save with the previous approval of the Local Government Board, should be prohibited, and that burials should be discontinued in the said parish as hereinafter directed:

- (b) In any earthen grave now existing in the said churchyard the burial may be allowed of the body of any member of the family of the person or persons heretofore buried in such grave, subject to the condition that no part of the coffin containing the body shall be at a depth less than three feet below the level of the surface of the ground adjoining the grave.

REGULATIONS RESPECTING OPEN COMPETITIVE Examinations for the Situation of Female Typist in the General Post Office, London, and in the Inland REVENUE DEPARTMENT IN LONDON.

These Regulations are liable to alteration from time to time.

1. The limits of age for this situation are 18 and 30. If an Examination begins in one of the first four months of any year Candidates must be of the prescribed age on the 1st day of January in that year. If an Examination begins in one of the second four months of any year Candidates must be of the prescribed age on the 1st day of May in that year. If an Examination begins in one of the last four months of any year Candidates must be of the prescribed age on the first day of September in that year.

In reckoning age for competition, persons who have served for two consecutive years in any Civil situation to which they were admitted with the certificate of the Civil Service Commissioners, may deduct from their actual age any time, not exceeding five years, which they may have spent in such service.

- 2. At each Examination the number of Candidates to be selected will be such as may from time to time be fixed.
- 3. Candidates will be required to satisfy the Civil Service Commissioners-
  - (a) That they are unmarried, or widows. No. 28710.  $\mathbf{B}$

- (b) That they are duly qualified in respect of health and character.
- $\mathbf{they}$ (c) That are natural-born naturalised British subjects.
- 4. Candidates must be at least five feet in height.
- 5. Persons holding situations in the Civil Service must obtain the permission of the authorities of their Department to attend the examination, dated before the commencement of the competition.
- 6. Persons who have entered upon or completed a course of education or training for the occupation of teacher, on account of which grants are payable from the Exchequer, will not be qualified to receive appointments until the consent of the Board of Education in England, the Committee of Council on Education for Scotland, or the Cmmissioners of National Education, Ireland, as the case may be, given in conformity with rules sanctioned by the Lords of the Treasury, has been notified to the Civil Service Commissioners.
- 7. No Candidate will be admitted to examination who does not, at such time as may be fixed by the Civil Service Commissioners, produce an undertaking signed by her Parent or Guardian, that she will, if successful, reside either with her parents or guardians, or with relations or friends approved by such parents or guardians.
- 8. The Examination will be in the following subjects, viz.:-
  - 1. Writing.
  - 2. Spelling.
  - 3. English Composition. 4. Copying Manuscript.
  - 5. Arithmetic (first four rules, simple and compound, including English weights
  - and measures, and reduction).
    6. Typewriting.

No Candidate will be regarded as qualified who does not pass to the satisfaction of the Civil Service Commissioners in each of the above-mentioned subjects.

The Civil Service Commissioners may, at their discretion, restrict the examination in Typewriting to such a number of candidates at the head of the list resulting from the marks awarded for the work in the other subjects as they may think fit. The marks awarded for Typewriting to the candidates examined in that subject will be added to the marks awarded to those same candidates for their work in the five other subjects. The examination in Typewriting, as well as the examination in the other subjects, will be held at such times and places as the Civil Service Com-

missioners may appoint.

9. Application for permission to attend an Examination must be made at such times and in such manner as may be fixed by the Civil Service Commissioners.

10. A fee of 2s. 6d. will be required from every Candidate attending the examination.

And whereas it was necessary for Insurance Committees to incur expenses for the purposes of the administration of benefits before the commencement of the said year:

And whereas it is provided by the National Health Insurance (Deposit Contributors Administration Expenses) Order, 1912, that as respects the year 1913 the commencement of the year should, for the purposes of paragraph

(e) of Section 42 and Section 61 of the Act, be taken to be the 13th day of January:

And whereas by virtue of the joint effect of Section 42 and paragraph (g) of sub-section (3) of Section 46 of the Act discharged seamen, marines, and soldiers, who have not become members of Approved Societies within the time specified in the Regulations made under the provisions of the said paragraph (g) are deposit contributors to whom the provisions of the said Section 42 apply:

And whereas it is apprehended that the provisions of the said above-mentioned Order (which provides for the deduction of certain amounts from the sums standing to the credit of deposit contributors with a view to making provision for defraying expenses incurred by Insurance Committees in the administration of benefits) do not apply in the case of any deposit contributor being a discharged seaman, marine, or soldier, and it is desirable that the provisions of the said Order should extend to deposit contributors being discharged seamen, marines, or soldiers:

And whereas by Section 78 of the Act it is amongst other things enacted that if any difficulty arises in respect of bringing into operation Part I of the Act, the Insurance Commissioners (in this Order referred to as "the Commissioners") may, with the consent of the Treasury, by order do anything which appears to the Commissioners necessary or expedient for bringing that Part of the Act into operation, and that any such Order may modify the provisions of the Act as far as may appear necessary or expedient for carrying the Order into effect;

- 1.—(1.) For the purpose of defraying expenses incurred by Insurance Committees in the administration of benefits during the period from the 15th day of July, 1912, to the 12th day of January, 1913, both inclusive, there shall be deducted and paid or credited to Insurance Committees, at such times and in such manner and in such proportion as the Commissioners may direct, from the several amounts from time to time standing in the Post Office Fund to the credit of deposit contributors, being discharged seamen, marines, or soldiers, a sum equal to \frac{1}{2}d. in respect of each contribution payable in respect of the period ending the 13th day of October, 1912, and in respect of the period ending the period ending the 12th day of January, 1913.

For the purposes of this Order a discharged seaman, marine, or soldier, in respect of whom contributions under the Act were paid in accordance with the provisions of the Act at any time not later than the 12th day of January, 1913, who did not become a member of an Approved Society within the time specified in the Regulations made under the said paragraph (g) of sub-section (3) of Section 46 of the Act, shall be deemed to have been a deposit contributor as from the date of his discharge from service.
- (3.) For the purpose of calculating the amount to be deducted in accordance with this paragraph, any fraction of a penny shall be reckoned as a penny.

Each dipping shall be carried out on such date, at such dipping place, and in such manner as shall be required by a Notice signed by an Inspector of the Local Authority of the District wherein the sheep are, and served by post, or otherwise, on the owner or person in charge of the sheep referred to in the Notice. Sheep which are on any lands to which this Article applies on the first day of September, nineteen hundred and thirteen, shall be exempt from the general dipping required by the principal Order between the fourteenth day of July and the first day of

(2.) If a sheep is not dipped as required by the preceding paragraph the owner and person in charge of the sheep on the thirtieth day of September, nineteen hundred and thirteen, shall, each according to and in respect of his own acts and defaults, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Diseases of Animals Act,

1894.

(3.) Articles 4 and 7 of the principal Order shall not apply to sheep affected by this Article.

(4.) This Article shall apply to the lands described in the Schedule hereto, and also to any lands in the neighbourhood to which it may be applied by a Notice to that effect signed by an Inspector of the Board or of the Local Authority and served upon the occupier of the lands described in such Notice.

(5.) This Article shall cease to apply to any lands upon service on the occupier thereof of a Notice to that effect signed by an In-


