WILD BIRD (ENGLAND).

The Wild Birds Protection (Administrative County of West Suffolk) Order, 1913.

Dated 23rd April, 1913.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred on me by the Wild Birds Protection Acts, 1880 to 1908, and upon application by the Council of

the Administrative County of West Suffolk, I hereby make the following Order:---

Title.

I. This Order may be cited as "The Wild Birds Protection (Administrative County of West Suffolk) Order, 1913."

BIRDS.

Additions to the Schedule of the Act of 1880.

II. The Wild Birds Protection Act, 1880, shall apply within the Administrative County of West Suffolk to the following species of Wild Birds in the same manner as if those species were included in the Schedule to the Act:--

Hedge Accentor (Hedge Sparrow), Reed Bunting, Great Bustard, Common Buzzard, Corn Crake (Land Rail), Tree Creeper, Crossbill, Turtle Dove, Spotted Flycatcher, Hen Harrier, Marsh Harrier, Montagu's Harrier, Hawfinch, Heron, Hobby, Kestrel, House Martin, Sand Martin, Nuthatch, Ring Ouzel, Meadow Pipit, Tree Pipit, Quail, Water Rail, Redpoll, Redstart, Robin, Red-backed Shrike, Swallow, Swift, Bearded Tit, Coal Tit, Longtailed Tit, Marsh Tit, Grey Wagtail, Pied Wagtail, White Wagtail, Yellow Wagtail, Blackcap Warbler, Garden Warbler, Grasshopper Warbler, Reed Warbler, Sedge Warbler, Whitethroat, Lesser Whitethroat, Golden Crested Wren, Wryneck (Cuckoo's Mate or Snake Bird).

Certain Birds protected during the whole of the Year.

III. During that period of the year to which the protection afforded by the Wild Birds Protection Act, 1880, does not extend, the killing or taking of the following species of Wild Birds is prohibited throughout the Administrative County of West Suffolk :---

Great Bustard, Goldfinch, Owl (all species), Kestrel, Kingfisher.

Certain Eggs protected throughout the Administrative County.

IV. The taking or destroying of the Eggs of the following species of Wild Birds is prohibited throughout the Administrative County of West Suffolk :---

Bittern, Reed Bunting, Great Bustard, Common Buzzard, Corn Crake (Land Rail), Tree Creeper, Crossbill, Stone Curlew (Thickknee, Norfolk Plover), Turtle Dove, Spotted Flycatcher, Gadwall, Goldfinch, Great Crested Grebe, Red Necked Grebe, Sclavonian Grebe, Eared Grebe, Little Grebe (Dabchick), Hen Harrier, Marsh Harrier, Montagu's Harrier, Hawfinch, Heron, Hobby, Kestrel, Kingfisher, House Martin, Sand Martin, Nightingale, Nightjar (Fern Owl, Goatsucker, Nighthawk), Nuthatch, Golden Oriole, Ring Ouzel, Barn Owl, Long-eared Owl, Short-eared Owl, Tawny Owl, Meadow Pipit, Tree Pipit, Quail, Water Rail, Redpoll, Redshank, Redstart, Redbacked Shrike, Common Snipe, Swallow, Swift, Teal, Bearded Tit, Coal Tit, Longtailed Tit, Marsh Tit, Grey Wagtail, Pied Wagtail, White Wagtail, Yellow Wagtail, Blackcap Warbler, Garden Warbler, Grasshopper Warbler, Reed Warbler, Sedge Warbler, Whitethroat, Lesser Whitethroat, Woodcock, Green Woodpecker, Great Spotted Woodpecker, Lesser Spotted Woodpecker, Golden Crested Wren, Wryneck (Cuckoo's Mate or Snake Bird).

Repeal of former Order.

V. The Order of the 18th December, 1900, is hereby repealed.
