W HEREAS His late Majesty King Edward the Seventh was pleased, by the Charter of Incorporation granted by Him on the 8th day of July, 1907, to the Imperial Col lege of Science and Technology to appoint (amongst others) the Most Honourable the Marquess of Crewe, K.G., the Right Honourable Sir Francis Mowatt, G.C.B., I.S.O., and Sir William Henry White, K.C.B., LL.D., F.R.S., to be Members of the Governing Body of the said Imperial College for a term of office ending on the 31st day of May, 1913:

And whereas it is expedient that the two first-named Members of the said Governing Body should in accordance with the provisions of the said Charter be re-appointed for a further term of four years from the 1st day of June next:

And whereas the said Sir William Henry White died on the 27th February, 1913:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, is pleased to order, and it is hereby ordered, that the Most Honourable the Marquess of Crewe, K.G., and the Right Honourable Sir Francis Mowatt, G.C.B., J.S.O., be re-appointed to be Members of the Governing Body of the Imperial College of Science and Technology, and that the Honourable Nathaniel Charles Rothschild be appointed to be a Member of the said Governing Body for a period of four years from the 1st day of June next.
