"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of the Act of the thirtythird and thirty-fourth years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, chapter thirty-nine, and of the Acts therein mentioned, that is to say, the Act of the third and fourth years of Her said late Majesty, chapter one hundred and thirteen, the Act of the fourth and fifth years of Her said late Majesty, chapter thirty-nine, and the Act of the thirty-first and thirty-second years of Her said late Majesty, chapter one hundred and fourteen, have prepared and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following scheme for effecting a transfer of the ownership of the advowson or perpetual right of patronage of and presentation to the church and cure (hereinafter called "the said benefice") of Empshott, in the county of Southampton and in the diocese of Winchester.

"Whereas the advowson or perpetual right of patronage of and presentation to the said benefice of Empshott is vested for an estate in fee simple in possession free from incumbrances in the Right Honourable William Waldegrave, Earl of Selborne (hereinafter called 'the said

Lord Selborne').

"And whereas the said Lord Selborne is desirous that the whole advowson or perpetual right of patronage of and presentation to the said benefice of Empshott now vested in him as aforesaid should be transferred to and be vested in the Right Reverend Edward Stuart, now Bishop of Winchester, and his successors in the same Bishoprick.

"Now therefore, with the consent of the said Lord Selborne (in testimony whereof he has signed and sealed this scheme) and with the consent of the said Edward Stuart, Bishop of Winchester (in testimony whereof he has signed this scheme and sealed the same with his episcopal seal), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, humbly recommend and propose that upon and from the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this scheme, and without any conveyance or assurance in the law other than such duly gazetted Order the whole advowson or perpetual right of patronage of and presentation to the said benefice of Empshott, now vested in him, the said Lord Selborne, as aforesaid, shall be transferred to the said Edward Stuart, Bishop of Winchester, and his successors in the same Bishoprick, and shall thereupon and thenceforth become and be absolutely vested in and shall and may from time to time be exercised by the said Edward Stuart, Bishop of Winchester, and his successors in the same Bishoprick for ever.

"Whereas it appears to us to be expedient that a district chapelry should be assigned to the said Church of the Holy Trinity, Winchmore Hill, situate as aforesaid.

"Now, therefore, with the consent of the ght Honourable and Right Reverend Right Arthur Foley, Bishop of London (testified by his having signed and sealed this representation), We, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, humbly represent, that it would, in our opinion, be expedient that all that part of the said new parish of Winchmore Hill, which is described in the Schedule hereunder written, all which part, together with the boundaries thereof, is delineated and set forth on the map or plan hereunto annexed, should be assigned as a district chapelry to the said Church of the Holy Trinity, Winchmore Hill, situate as aforesaid, and that the same should be named "The District Chapelry of the Holy Trinity, Winchmore Hill.'

"And with the like consent of the said Arthur Foley, Bishop of London (testified as aforesaid), We, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, further represent, that it appears to us to be expedient that banns of matrimony should be published, and that marriages, baptisms, churchings, and burials should be solemnized or performed at the said Church of the Holy Trinity, Winchmore Hill, situate as aforesaid, and that the fees to be received in respect of the publication of such banns and of the solemnization or performance of the said offices should be paid and belong to the minister of the same church for the time being. Provided always, that nothing herein contained shall be construed as expressing any intention on the part of us, the said Commissioners, to concur in or approve the taking of any fee for the performance of the said office of baptism or for the registration thereof.

"We, therefore, humbly pray that Your Majesty will be graciously pleased to take the premises into Your Royal consideration, and to make such Order with respect thereto as to Your Majesty, in Your Royal Wisdom, shall seem meet."

"The SCHEDULE to which the foregoing representation has reference.

"The district chapelry of the Holy Trinity, Winchmore Hill, being:—

"All that part of the new parish (sometime district chapelry) of Winchmore Hill, in the county of Middlesex and in the diocese of London, which is bounded upon the east partly by the parish of Edmonton and partly by the consolidated chapelry of Saint Aldhelm, Edmonton, upon the south-west partly by the last-named cure, partly by the new parish of Saint Michael at Bowes, Southgate, and partly by the new parish of Palmer's Green, all in the said county and diocese, and upon the remaining sides—that is to say, upon the west and upon the north-west—by an imaginary line commencing upon the boundary which divides the said new parish of Palmer's Green from the said new parish of Winchmore Hill at the centre of the bridge which carries Dog and Duck Lane across the Enfield Branch Line of the Great Northern Railway, and extending thence northward along the middle of such line of railway for a distance of forty-three chains or thereabouts to the centre of the bridge which carries Compton Road across the said line of railway, and extending thence eastward along the middle of Compton Road for a distance of thirteen chains and a half or thereabouts to a point opposite to the southern end of the wall or fence forming the western boundary of the house and premises known as Number 26, Compton Road, and extending thence first north-eastward to and along the said wall or fence and then south-eastward along the wall or fence forming the northern boundary of the said house and premises for a distance in all of two chains and a half or thereabouts to the point where the last-mentioned wall or fence meets the wall or fence forming the western boundary of the house and premises known as Number 21, Station Road, and extending thence north-eastward along the last-mentioned wall or fence for a distance of one chain and three-quarters or thereabouts to its northern end on the southern side of Station Road, and extending thence first north-eastward to and then south-eastward along the middle of Station Road for a distance in all of eighteen yards or thereabouts to its junction with Radcliffe Road, and extending thence first northward and then eastward along the middle of Radcliffe Road for a distance of seven chains and a half or thereabouts to a point opposite to the southern end of the wall or fence forming the western boundary of the house and premises known as Number 21, Radcliffe Road, and extending thence north-eastward to and along such wall or fence for a distance of two chains and a quarter or thereabouts to its northern end, and extending thence north-eastward in a straight line for a distance of seven chains or thereabouts to the southern end of the wall or fence forming the western boundary of the house and premises known as Number 12, Pritchett Terrace, Vicar's Moor Lane, and extending thence northward along such wall or fence for a distance of one chain and three-quarters or thereabouts to its northern end on the southern

WHEREAS by section 3 of the Seal Fisheries (North Pacific) Act, 1912, all persons were prohibited from using any port within the United Kingdom for purposes of pelagic sealing contrary to any Order in Council made under the Seal Fisheries (North Pacific) Acts, 1895 and 1912:

And whereas by section 4 of the Seal Fisheries (North Pacific) Act, 1912, the importation of the skins of seals captured in contravention of any such Order as last aforesaid was

prohibited:

And whereas by section 5 (1) of the said Act it was enacted that His Majesty might by Order in Council extend the provisions of the two hereinbefore recited sections to any part of His Majesty's Dominions outside the United Kingdom subject to such modifications and adaptations as might appear to Him to be necessary provided that those provisions should not be so extended to a self-governing Dominion except with the consent of the Governor-General in Council or Governor in Council of the Dominion:

And whereas the Union of South Africa is a self-governing Dominion for the purposes of

section 5 of the said Act:

And whereas the Governor-General in Council of the Union of South Africa has consented that the provisions of sections 3 and 4 of the said Act shall be extended to the Union of South Africa subject to the modifications and adaptations hereinafter contained:

Now therefore, His Majesty by virtue and in exercise of the powers in this behalf by the

Seal Fisheries (North Pacific) Act, 1912, in His Majesty vested, is pleased by and with the advice of His Privy Council to order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:—

- 1. This Order may be cited as the Seal Fisheries (Union of South Africa) Order in Council, 1913.
- 2. From and after the commencement of this Order sections 3 and 4 of the Seal Fisheries (North Pacific) Act, 1912, shall apply to the Union of South Africa subject to the following modifications and adaptations, that is to say:—
 - (i.) For the words "the United Kingdom" in section 3 (1) of the said Act there shall be deemed to be substituted the words "the Union of South Africa."
 - (ii.) In section 3 (2) of the said Act for the words "the Secretary of State" wherever those words occur there shall be deemed to be substituted the words "the Commissioner or other Principal Officer of Customs," and for the words "the Board of Trade or any Officer of the Board" the words "the Collector or other proper Officer of Customs at the Port."
 - (iii.) In section 4 of the said Act there shall be deemed to be substituted for the words "be deemed to be included in the table of prohibitions and restrictions contained in section 42 of the Customs Consolidation Act, 1876, and that section shall apply accordingly" the words "be deemed to be goods prohibited to be imported into the Union of South Africa for the purposes of any law in force therein relating to customs, and shall be dealt with in accordance with that law."
- 3. This Order shall come into operation on such date as shall be fixed by the Governor-General in Council.


