The Secretary of State for India in Council has appointed Messrs. Charles Farmer Lane and Vincenzo Florio Care to superintend the transfer of lascars, or other persons, at the Victoria and Albert Docks, London, and the Barry Docks, Glamorganshire, respectively, and to grant the certificate required under section 125 of the Merchant Shipping Act, 1894 (57 and 58 Vic., cap. 60).

The fee to be paid for every lascar, or other person, in respect of whom such certificate is applied for, is limited to three shillings; and in no case is the total amount of fees in respect of one crew to exceed five pounds.

MOTOR CAR ACT, 1903.

BOROUGH OF WEST HAM.

Whereas by section 8 of the Motor Car Act, 1903 (hereinafter referred to as "the Act of 1903"), it is enacted that the Local Government Board may, by regulations made under section 6 of the Locomotives on Highways Act, 1896 (hereinafter referred to as "the Act of 1896"), prohibit or restrict the driving of any motor cars, or of any special kind of motor cars, on any specified highway or part of a highway, which does not exceed sixteen feet in width, or on which ordinary motor traffic would, in their opinion, be especially dangerous:
