His Majesty's Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs has received from His Majesty's Minister at Athens the following translation of a recently promulgated Greek Law, which came into operation on the 14th ulto., providing for the establishment of a Prize Court at Athens. The three explanatory Notes which follow the text of the law have been prepared by the Advocate who is usually consulted in these matters by H.M. Legation.

#### TRANSLATION.

LAW CONCERNING THE ESTABLISHMENT OF A PRIZE COURT.

#### Composition and Competency.

Article 1.—For the purpose of trying the validity and the legitimate results of every kind of seizure of vessels or cargoes enforced by right of war by the naval forces or harbour

authorities, an Administrative Court is established with its seat in Athens which sits at the Ministry of Marine, and consists of five members appointed by Royal Decree on the proposal of the Ministerial Council, and taken, two from among the judges of the Court of Cassation, the senior of whom is also the President of the Court, two from among the senior officers of the Royal Navy, and another one of the professors of the School of Law at the Capodistrian University. The duties of State Advocate at this Court are performed by the Legal Adviser at the Ministry of Marine, and, in case of his being prevented, by the junior Legal Adviser.

The duties of Secretary are performed by one of the Subordinate financial officers of the Royal Navy, appointed by an Order of the Ministry of Marine published in the Government Gazette.

The auxiliary staff of the Secretary is also appointed by the Minister of Marine. commencement of the operation of the above Court is announced by Royal Decree. Also its termination after the conclusion of the trial of all the seizures made during the duration of a war and their consequences.

#### Examination.

Article 2.—The State Advocate, to whom the dossiers of the seizures are sent by the Ministry, delivers to the Secretary of the Court the deeds of seizure with those documents and evidence accompanying each which may interest the parties.

A special report concerning the delivery is drawn up for each seizure and entered in a book (Protocol) numbered by the President of the Court, and (the report) shows the date of delivery, the name of the ship, and of the captain, as well as the documents and objects delivered.

The documents and objects thus delivered remain deposited with the Secretary for 30 days from the date of their delivery. The money, if any, seized, is deposited in the public Treasury.

Article 3.—The President, on being informed of the entry of the case in the protocol, according to the foregoing Article, appoints by an Act one of the members of the Court as Reporting Judge for each case, publishes the entry made by posting it outside the door of the room in which the Court sits, and communicates it to the Ministry for Foreign Affairs, and through it to the diplomatic representatives of Greece accredited to the States to which the parties interested in participating in the trial belong, or in which they are believed to reside. These diplomatic representatives see that the communication of the entry is published in the Official Gazettes, or, if necessary, in other newspapers as well in the same States with a note of the dates of the limit of time allowed by the present law, the port of registration of the vessel and the last port at which it took in cargo.

Article 4.—During the limit of time mentioned in the last sentence of Article 2, and any prolongation thereof, those who are able to prove a legal interest and who wish to take part in the trial as litigants, must appear before the Secretary either in person or by special proxy and declare their desire, give their address (street and number) if they reside in Athens, or else appoint an "Anticlitos" (See Note 1), who resides in Athens, with a note of the street and number of his

A report is drawn up about all these things and entered in the book provided in Article 2, and the documents proving the locus standi are delivered to the Secretary to be attached to the proper dossier, as well as the special power of Attorney of the proxy, if any. The special power of Attorney may also be given by letter or by telegram.

Any change of residence of the litigants or of the person of the "Anticlitos" or of his residence must be communicated to the Secretary in the manner shown in Clauses 1 and 2.

The President examines the locus standi of the persons appearing as above, and if he find it to be adequately proved he accepts them in an act as litigants, leaving the definite decision in this respect to the Court. The captain of the vessel which has been seized or in which the seizure has been effected or the captain's substitute, is considered as representing the absent owners, charterers or shippers, and in general those who have rights in the ship or cargo.

The recognised litigants have the right during the limit of time mentioned in the last sentence of Article 2 and of the extension thereof, if any, to inform themselves of the (contents of the) documents deposited with the Secretary and to take copies thereof at their own expense. They cannot present the rights they claim otherwise than by addressing to the President memorials written in the Greek language, and delivering them to the Secretary in the manner given in Article 2.

Article 5.—The Reporting Judge studies the case, and, in co-operation with the Secretary, completes the deficiencies, if any, of the investigation by the examination of witnesses on oath or not, by holding a personal inspection, ordering an appraisement, by searches and seizures, he having in general all the rights and duties of a Reporting Judge of a Naval Court according to the proper laws and respective Royal Decrees, and exercising these rights and duties independently (without the co-operation of a Royal Advocate) according to the provisions governing trial before the permanent Naval Court. The Reporting Judge is on no account obliged to examine witnesses proposed by the litigant who assails the validity of the seizure.

Article 6.—The President is entitled on the application of the State Advocate or of the Reporting Judge to extend, for the sake of the needs of the supplementary investigation, and not for more than another 30 days, the 30 days limit in Article 2, by an Act published and notified where and as provided in Article 3.

A copy of the Act extending the limit is served by the Secretary through the administrative channel, and against a receipt, on the litigants resident in Athens or their "anticliti" appointed according to Article 4.

Article 7.—Within the limit of time mentioned in Article 2 and the extension thereof, if any, the State Advocate communicates to the President of the Court every subsequently received document and information relating to the case.

Within the same limit he delivers to the Secretary his observations or demands, in the manner provided in Article 2.

#### Discussion.

Article 8.—On the expiration of the limit of time the Court examines the case in Council, and if it think necessary it may through the President demand further information or documents from the competent authority or the parties, or, fixing a term therefor, it may order a fresh examination to be carried out by the Reporting Judge, according to the details fixed in Article 5.

When the Court in Council finds that the investigation is complete it fixes (1) a term not less than 10 days within which the State Advocate and the parties must, under pain of exclusion, hand in to the President their final proposals, (2) a date and hour for the discussion of the case. This act of the Council is published by being posted outside the door of the room in which the Court holds its sittings and is communicated administratively by the Secretary, against an acknowledgment, to the State Advocate and the litigants residing in Athens if they have given their address in accordance with Article 4 or otherwise to their appointed "anticliti," if any, and from (the date of) this communication, or else from that of the publication, the above term of 10 days commences.

Article 9.—On the day appointed for the trial the Court meets in public sitting, at the commencement of which the case is read aloud by the President. After which the Reporting Judge makes a detailed report of the case, and the Secretary reads the memorial and the proposals of the parties. Afterwards the President calls upon the litigants or their special Attorneys, if any, who are present, and last of all the State Advocate addresses the Court. The Minister of Marine may also specially appoint an officer of the Navy or another Attorney to represent him and appear in aid of the State Advocate.

No deposition of memorials or proposals

takes place during this sitting.

#### Decision.

Article 10.—On the conclusion of the discussion according to the foregoing Article, both the litigants and the parties withdraw, and the Court meets either at once or within three days at the latest, and draws up its definite decision by an absolute majority, which decision embodies a summary of the history of the case, and especially the grounds, and is signed by all the members of the Court and published, within 15 days of the discussion, at a public session of the Court and deposited with the Secretary. If from the verbal discussion the Court should judge that a supplementary investigation is indispensable, it orders one, which is held according to Articles 5 and 8, after which a new discussion and decision as above follows.

If the Court confirm the seizure either wholly or for the most part it may at the same time condemn the defeated litigant in costs up to Drs. 500 to be paid to the Treasury.

By the decision, provided it contains the entire or partial confirmation of the seizure which has been tried, the question is at the same time also settled as to whether the Treasury is in any respect liable on account of circumstances contingent on the seizure. In case of an affirmative solution and if the respective application of the interested parties

have been made in due time, a clause is included in the decision concerning the compensation due, in order to provide which the Treasury may impose upon the present litigants the Oath of Appraisement (See Note 2) according to the terms of Article 383 of the civil procedure which is administered at once. Save only in case of fraud the authorities effecting the seizure bear no personal liability for compensation.

Article 11.—The decision pronounced is not subject to any ordinary or extraordinary opposition and appeal. Copies thereof, attested by the President and the Secretary, are sent to the Minister for Foreign Affairs and the Minister of Marine, and are served by the Secretary administratively and against a receipt on the litigants, if they reside in Athens, otherwise on their appointed "anticliti, " otherwise on their specially empowered representatives present at the discussion.

#### Execution.

Article 12.—The execution of the decision is assigned in general to the Minister of Marine. But if the decision annul wholly or in part the seizures imposed, or contain a provision in favour of litigants or third parties, the execution is carried out under the care of the interested parties, who have recourse, if it be a question of the return of things, to the Minister of Marine, or, if it be a question of the payment of an indemnity, to the Minister of Finance.

#### Loss and Difference.

Article 13.--If during the limit of time of the trial fixed by the foregoing articles the litigants, who have obtained for themselves the invalidation, have not submitted applications for compensation, they may (on the presupposition that the question of the liability of the Treasury has been settled affirmatively by the decision, within a month of the notification of the decision to them if they reside in Athens, or to their "anticlitos," and in default of such to their representative present at the discussion, otherwise within two months of its publication) deliver to the Secretary of the Court according to the provisions of Article 2 a written statement of the amount of the damage, together with the vouchers. Any application not made in the above manner or not made in due time is inadmissible before every authority or Court. The Secretary communicates administratively and communicates against a receipt to the State Advocate the above delivery, and the latter is entitled to deliver his counter observations in the same manner within eight days.

The President, on receiving information of the above entry of the case, appoints as Reporting Judge one of the members of the Court who carries out an examination regarding the disputed amounts, acting in accordance with the details fixed in Article 5, and with the co-operation of the litigants, who are summoned therefor 24 hours before any steps have been taken for investigation, by an administrative notification served on them if they reside in Athens, or on their "anticliti" if they have appointed such, otherwise by a notice posted outside the door of the room in

which the Court meets.

The Court and the Reporting Judge are entitled, but not obliged, to take into consideration any documents or witnesses not

brought forward or not named according to the manner and time mentioned in Clause 1.

Article 14.—On the termination of the enquiry, treated of in Article 13, which cannot last longer than 30 days from the entry in the protocol of the counter observations of the State Advocate the Court meets in Council and the procedure mentioned in Article 8 is carried out.

On the day fixed for the trial the things appointed in Article 9 are done. The Court, before the issue of its definite decision, and provided those who claim compensation are present, may impose on them an Oath of Appraisement according to the terms of Article 383 of civil procedure, which oath must be taken immediately.

Concerning the decision issued at this trial

Articles 10 to 12 hold good.

And when a final decision has been issued at a previous trial before regular Courts, quashing a seizure hereafter belonging to the competency of the Court established by Article 1, the litigants at that trial who claim a right to compensation must exercise such rights exclusively in accordance with the procedure shown in Articles 13 and 14, handing in their statement of the amount of damage within a period of thirty days (which carries with it loss of rights on expiry before the notification is made) from the notification by the State Advocate, under the authority of the present law through the administrative channel and against a receipt, of the final quashing decision, to them if they reside in Athens or their "anticliti" if they have appointed such, otherwise to their last Attorneys at the regular trial.

#### Trial of Previously Introduced Cases.

Article 15.-The cases within the competency of the Administrative Court established by Article 1, concerning the validity of seizures or compensation, which are already pending before the regular Courts of First Instance, are transferred to this Court and tried by it, the procedure of the present law being observed from the beginning.

Article 16.—Appeals against the definite decisions of the regular Courts, issued before the operation of the present law and not made final, in trials within the competency of the Administrative Court established by Article 1 are lodged before this Court, the competency of the regular Courts of Appeal being with-drawn and the regular trial being abolished,

as follows:

The appellant declares before the Secretary that he appeals against the definite decision issued, and deposits with the Secretary the documents of the trial. Respecting this statement and delivery a deed is drawn up according to Article 2, a copy of which is communicated through the administrative channel by the Secretary to the State Advocate against a receipt if the litigant in the regular trial appeals against the Treasury, otherwise to that litigant if he resides in Athens, or to his "anticlitos" appointed for the regular trial, and in default of such to his last Attorney who represented him in the regular

This appeal is lodged within a period of 30 days (entailing loss of rights if it expire before the appeal is lodged) from the operation of the present law if a communication of the decision has preceded it, otherwise from the date of the communication of the decision. This communication of the decision is made to the State Advocate, as representative of the Treasury, by a bailiff, but by the State Advocate, through the administrative channel and against a receipt, to the litigant if he reside in Athens, or his "anticlitos," otherwise to his last proxy at the regular trial.

If before the operation of the present law an appeal has been lodged against a definite decision issued at a regular trial of a seizure within the competency of the Court established by Article 1, it is also brought for discussion before this Court, a summons being previously made by the litigant first applying by a statement to the Secretary and notification according to the manner in paragraph 1.

With respect to the examination, discussion, decision, and execution, the procedure of Article 3 and the following articles of the present law is applied.

#### " Prescription."

Any claim to compensation arising from a seizure subject to the competency of the Court established by the present law is invalidated by lapse of time after the lapse of six months from the issue of the decision quashing the seizure, provided no reasons exist for non-admission (See Note 3), according to Articles 13 and 14. "Prescription" is stopped by the submission to this Court of a petition respecting the adjudication of compensation, according to the terms of the present law, and recommences from the last act of the litigants or the Court in the last proceedings.

Article 18.—All proceedings taking place according to the present law are done upon

unstamped paper.

All expenses, stationery, of the enquiry, etc., are paid out of the Budget of the Ministry of Marine.

Article 19.—The operation of the present law commences from its publication.

#### EXPLANATORY NOTES.

Note 1.—An "anticlitos" is the special representative of a litigant in a suit, who represents him for this purpose only, that "all communications are made to him while the litigation lasts." His appointment is obligatory whenever the party to the suit resides permanently or temporarily outside the seat of the Court.

Note 2.—"Oath of Appraisement." If the ground and the existence of a claim or of damage unlawfully caused be absolutely proved, but it be impossible to ascertain the quantity or amount of the claim or damage by other evidence, the Court imposes the so-called "Oath of Appraisement" on the party who makes the claim or has suffered the damage.

Note 3.—"Inadmissibility" is a plea put forward to stop a suit; it differs from "Prescription" in that the latter includes the idea of quashing the action, while "inadmissibility" contains the idea of its non-institution. According to some, "inadmissibility" contains the idea of "prescription" of the action by means of the non-execution within the statutory limits of the provisions required by law for preserving it or carrying it on.
