TENDERS FOR LOANS ON TREASURY
BILLS.

1. The Lords Commissioners of H.M. Treasury hereby give notice that Tenders will be received at the Chief Cashier's Office, at the Bank of England, on Monday, the 26th instant, at one o'clock, for Treasury Bills to be issued under the Acts 40 Vic., cap. 2, 52 Vic., cap. 6, and 6 Ed. VII, cap. 20, to the amount of £1,500,000 in part replacement of Bills paid off temporarily on 21st February last.

2. The Bills will be in amounts of £1,000, £5,000, or £10,000. They will be dated the 30th May, 1913, and will be payable at six

months after date, viz.:—on the 30th November, 1913.

3. *The Tenders must specify the net amount per cent. which will be given for the amounts applied for, and the Tenders of private individuals must be made through a London banker.*

4. The Bills will be issued and paid at the Bank of England.

5. The persons whose Tenders are accepted will be informed of the same on Tuesday, the 27th inst., and payment in full of the amounts of the accepted Tenders must be made to the Bank of England not later than three o'clock on Friday, the 30th May, 1913.

6. The Lords Commissioners of H.M. Treasury reserve the right of rejecting any Tenders.
