Notice is hereby given, that His Majesty the King will hold a Levée at St. James's Palace on Thursday, 12th June, at 11.30 o'clock a.m., and that for this Levée Cards of Admission will be required.

The following are the rules to be observed:—Gentlemen who have been presented and who wish to attend this Levée, are requested to make a written application, as detailed below.

No applications can be received from gentlemen wishing to be presented. Their names must be forwarded by the gentleman making the presentation.

All Officers, whether on the active or retired lists of the Royal Navy and the Royal Marines, of whatever rank, will communicate with and obtain their cards from the Private Secretary to the First Lord of the Admiralty. All Civil Officers of the Admiralty will follow the same rule.

All Officers, whether on the active or retired lists, of the Army Special Reserve, Militia, Territorial Force, Yeomanry, or Volunteers, of whatever rank, except those on the Indian and Colonial Establishments, will communicate with and obtain their cards from the Private

Secretary to the Inspector-General at the Horse Guards, Whitehall, but Officers of the Household Cavalry or the Brigade of Guards should communicate with the Lord Chamberlain at St. James's Palace.

All Officers of the Indian Civil Service and of the Indian Army, of whatever rank, whether on the active or retired lists, will communicate with and obtain their cards from the Private Secretary to the Secretary of State at the India Office, Whitehall.

All Officers of the Colonial Service and Colonial Forces, of whatever rank, whether on the active or retired lists, will communicate with and obtain their cards from the Colonial Office, Whitehall, with the exception of Officers of the local Forces of the self-governing Dominions, who will apply to the Private Secretary to the Inspector-General at the Horse Guards, Whitehall, for their cards for attendance or for presentation by the Inspector-General, supporting their application in all cases by a credential from the Governor-General, Governor, or Officer commanding the local Forces, or the representative in London of the Dominion concerned.

Lords Mayor and Mayors, High Sheriffs, Sheriffs, Recorders, Metropolitan Police Magistrates and other Stipendiary Magistrates, and all gentlemen connected with the Home Office, are requested to make their applications through the Private Secretary to the Secretary of State for the Home Department.

Chairmen of County Councils and all gentlemen connected with the Local Government Board, are requested to make their applications through the Private Secretary to the President of the Local Government Board.

Judges, Law Officers, King's Counsel, and all Legal Officials holding appointments under the Crown, other than those already mentioned, are requested to make their applications through the ______/ate Secretary to the Lord Chancellor.

Similarly, all gentlemen connected with the Foreign Office, or any other Government Department, will communicate with and obtain their cards for attendance or presentation at Levées from the Department under which they serve.

THAMES CONSERVANCY.

PROPOSED BYE-LAWS for the PROTECTION, PRESERVATION and REGULATION of FISH-ERIES in the RIVER THAMES, and for other purposes.

BYE-LAWS.

For the Protection, Preservation and Regulation of the Fisheries in the River Thames, and for other purposes, made by the Conservators of the River Thames in exercise of the powers and authority vested in them by the Thames Conservancy Act, 1894, as amended by the Port of London Act, 1908, and of every other power them thereunto enabling:—

Short Title and Commencement of Operation of Bye-laws.

1. These Bye-laws may be cited as "The Thames Fishery Bye-laws, 191," and shall come into operation the day after the same are confirmed by the Board of Agriculture and Fisheries.

Repeal.

2. The Thames Fishery Bye-laws, 1893, so far as the same relate to the River Thames as hereinafter defined, are hereby repealed.

Interpretation Clause.

- 3. In these Bye-laws the words and expressions hereinafter mentioned shall have the meanings hereby assigned to them respectively, unless there be something in the subject or context repugnant to such construction, viz.:—
 - "Court" shall mean any court of summary jurisdiction, whether consisting of two or more justices or of a stipendiary magistrate.
 - "Fish" includes eels, crayfish and shell-fish, and the spat, spawn, brood, ova or fry of eels, crayfish, shellfish, or fish.

The expression "the Conservators" means the Conservators of the River Thames.

The expression "the Thames" or "the river" means and includes so much of the Rivers Thames and Isis respectively as are between the town of Cricklade in the county of Wilts and an imaginary straight line drawn from high water mark on the bank of the River Thames at the boundary line between the parishes of Teddington and Twickenham in the county of Middlesex to high water mark on the Surrey bank of the river immediately opposite the last hereinbefore mentioned point, and so much of the River Kennet as is between the common landing place at Reading in the county of Berks and the River Thames, and all locks, cuts and works within the said portions of rivers. Provided that no dock, lock, canal or cut existing at the passing of the Thames Conservancy Act, 1894, and constructed under the authority of Parliament and belonging to any body corporate established under such authority and no bridge over the River Thames or the River Kennet belonging to or vested in any county council or municipal authority or to or in any railway company or to or in any other company, body or person other than the Conservators shall be deemed to form part of the Thames.

The word "vessel" includes any ship, lighter, keel, barge, launch, houseboat, pleasure or other boat, randan, wherry, skiff, dingey, shallop, punt, canoe, yacht, raft, float of timber, or craft whatever however navigated.

The words "assistant river-keeper" mean and include any water bailiff or officer of the Conservators, or any other person duly authorized under section 69 of the Thames Conservancy Act, 1894, to carry these Byelaws into execution.

Instruments of Fishing.

- 4. (a) No person shall, for the purpose of taking or attempting to take fish in the Thames, use or attempt to use any wheel, basket, instrument, net, hook, tackle or other apparatus or device except the following, and then only in the places, at the times, and in the manner hereinafter prescribed (that is to say):—
 - (1.) Rod and line. Provided that:-
 - (a) No person shall use a rod and line except with a natural or artificial bait, and only for the purpose of taking fish by hooking them in the mouth;
 - (b) No person shall fish with more than two rods and lines at the same time, and such rods when in use shall not be placed more than 15 feet distant the one from the other:
 - (c) No person shall, except when spinning or fishing with live bait, fish with a rod and line having more than two separate baits attached thereto;
 - (d) No person shall leave a rod and line with the bait or hook thereof in the water unattended or out of sight or otherwise without having sufficient control thereof.
- (2.) A landing net with a diameter not exceeding two feet and a depth not exceeding three feet from the ring to the bottom of the net, and having not more rows of knots than seventy-two to the linear yard. Provided that no person shall use a landing net except a person angling with a rod and line, or an assistant to such person, for the purpose of landing a fish already hooked by means of a rod and line lawfully used;
- (3.) A minnow net with a diameter not exceeding three feet in any part thereof. Provided that no person shall fish with a minnow net except a person angling or about to angle in the river, or his servant or agent, for the purpose of obtaining minnows for bait to be used by persons angling in the Thames.
 - (4.) A hand or well net.
- (5.) A grig wheel with a diameter not exceeding six inches. Provided that no person shall use a grig wheel in that part of the river which is situate above the City Stone at Staines, and provided also that no person shall place any grig wheel near any dam or weir.
- (6.) A gaff hook. Provided that no person shall use a gaff hook except a person angling with a rod and line, or an assistant to such person, for the purpose of landing a fish already hooked by means of a rod and line lawfully used.
- (7.) A casting or bait net. Provided that such net may only be used by assistant river-keepers, and then for the sole purpose of obtaining bait to be used by persons for angling in the Thames.
- (b) The measurement of any net referred to in this Bye-law shall be made when the net is wet.
- (c) Any person using or attempting to use for the purpose of taking, or attempting to take, fish in the Thames any wheel, basket,

instrument, net, hook, tackle or other apparatus or device, except as hereinbefore prescribed, shall be guilty of an offence against these Bye-laws.

Keep Net.

5. A keep net may be used for the purposeof keeping fish alive by a person angling in. the Thames.

Trailing.

6. No person on any vessel under way upon the Thames shall draw or cause or suffer to be drawn in the direction in which such vessel is proceeding any line with hook or bait attached thereto, whether such line be attached to a rod or otherwise.

Injury of Fish.

7. No person shall use in the Thames any device or tackle that does not admit of the fish taken therewith being returned to the water without serious injury.

Snaring.

8. No person shall, with the intent or insuch a manner as to take fish by means of foulhooking, snatching, or snaring in the Thames, use any line, rod and line, hook, wire snareor other similar device either alone or in conjunction with a rod and line.

Fixed Nets.

9. No person shall fix or attach any net to the soil or make the same stationary in any way, and a net held by any person on any vessel or attached thereto when moored or anchored in the Thames, shall be deemed to be a fixed net for the purpose of this Bye-law.

Nets at Mouths of Tributaries, etc.

10. No person shall place in the Thames at the mouth of any river, creek, backwater, or brook communicating with or running into the Thames or at any mill sluice, race, or branch of the Thames, any net or device which might stop or catch fish or impede the free movement of the same into, out of, or up or down the Thames.

Night Lines, &c.

11. No person shall use or attempt to use any night hook, fixed hook, night line, hand line, or fixed line in the Thames.

Night Fishing.

12. No person shall, between the expiration of the first hour after sunset and the commencement of the last hour before sunrise, fish for, take, or attempt to take, any fish by any means whatever in that part of the Thames as lies above the City Stone at Staines, nor when on any vessel on that part of the Thames which lies below the said City Stone.

Close Seasons.

13. (1.) No person shall fish for, take, or attempt to take, salmon or salmon trout in the

Thames between the 1st day of September and the 31st day of March following (both inclusive), and no person shall fish for, take, or attempt to take, trout or char in the Thames between the 11th day of September and the 31st day of March following (both inclusive), provided that between the 1st day of April and the 15th day of June (both inclusive) no bait shall be used for taking or attempting to take salmon, salmon trout, trout, or char other than an artificial fly or spinning or live bait, and for the purposes of this Bye-law the expression "live bait" shall mean live fish only.

- (2.) No person shall fish for, take, or attempt to take smelts in the Thames between the 25th day of March and the 27th day of July following (both inclusive).
- (3.) No person shall fish for, take, or attempt to take lampreys or lamperns in the Thames between the 1st day of April and the 24th day of August following (both inclusive).
- (4.) Except as hereinbefore otherwise provided, no person shall take, or attempt to take, any fish in the Thames between the 15th day of March and the 15th day of June following (both inclusive). Provided that this provision shall not prohibit any person from taking, or attempting to take by any means or in any manner authorized by these Bye-laws for taking fish, as bait for salmon, salmon trout, trout, or char, the following fish, namely, dace, gudgeon, bleak, and minnows.

Sizes of Fish.

14. No person shall take in or out of the Thames, or have in his possession, or expose for sale on the river, or on the shore or banks thereof, or within one hundred yards on either side of the Thames, any fish of the species hereinafter mentioned of less than the sizes and dimensions hereinafter specified (that is to say):—

Provided that this Bye-law shall not apply:—

- (a) To any person who takes any undersized fish unintentionally, and at once returns such fish alive to the Thames with as little injury as possible.
- (b) To any roach, dace, gudgeon, bleak, or minnows taken from the Thames for use as bait, to be used by persons angling in the Thames. Provided that no person on the

Thames, or on the banks or shores thereof, or within one hundred yards on either side of the Thames, shall be entitled to have in his possession, or under his control, at any one time more than fifty of such fish for use as bait, or to take from the Thames by himself, his servants or agents, more than fifty of such fish on any one day.

Places in which Taking of Fish Restricted.

15. (a) The places hereinafter mentioned are places staked and marked out for the preservation and incubation of fish in the Thames, that is to say:—

KINGSTON.—From Broom Hall, Teddington, through the backwater called the Trowlock up to the South-Western Railway bridge at Kingston, a distance of 1,960 yards or thereabouts.

THAMES DITTON.—From Long Ditton Ferry for a distance of 512 yards or thereabouts westward.

HAMPTON.—From Molesey Lock to the upper end of the Lawn at Garrick Villa, Hampton, a distance of 1,514 yards or thereabouts.

SUNBURY.—From the "Magpie" Inn to Sunbury Weir, a distance of 683 yards or thereabouts.

Walton.—Walton Sale, a length of 250 yards.

SHEPPERTON.—The Upper Deep, a distance of 240 yards.

SHEPPERTON.—The Lower Deep, a distance of 200 yards.

WEYBRIDGE.—From Shepperton Lock, along the course of the Thames to the Weir, a distance of about 830 yards or thereabouts.

CHERTSEY.—From a point 80 yards below the bridge to the Weir, a distance of 445 yards or thereabouts.

Penton Hook.—From the Weir round the Island, and up to the lock at Penton Hook, a distance of 1,150 yards or thereabouts.

STAINES.—From a point below the Road Bridge, Staines, to the City Stone, a distance of 210 yards or thereabouts.

- (B) In any of the above-mentioned places no person shall do, or attempt to do, or aid or assist, or attempt to aid or assist, in doing any of the following things:—
 - (a) Take up, remove, injure, or destroy any stake, burr, boat, punt, or any other thing placed for the protection of fish, or for the purpose of impeding fishing.
 - (b) Disturb the preserves in this Bye-law specified or any spawning bed or place therein to which fish resort before, during, or after spawning.
 - (c) Fish for, take, or attempt to take fish by any mode whatsoever except:—
 - (i.) with a rod and line as in these Byelaws provided, and (ii.) in the case of a fisherman whose name is notified to the Conservators in accordance with these Byelaws; with a grig wheel lawfully used for the purpose of taking eels.

Regulation of Fishermen.

- 16. (1.) No person shall follow the business of a fisherman on the river or let for hire any vessel to be used on the river for fishing, unless his name and address be entered in a book (hereinafter called "the register") kept for that purpose by the Conservators.
- (2.) Every such person as aforesaid shall furnish to the Conservators in writing the following particulars (that is to say):—
 - (a) His name, address and occupation;
 - (b) The number of boats, punts, and other vessels used or intended to be used by him in connection with his business of a fisherman;
 - (c) The place or places where such business is proposed to be carried on;
- and the Conservators shall enter such particulars together with such other particulars as they think fit in the register, and shall thereupon assign to such person a number to be called the registered number of such person.
- (3) Every such person as aforesaid shall at the time of furnishing such particulars as aforesaid pay to the Conservators a fee of one shilling, and a further fee of one shilling in respect of each boat, punt, or other vessel, as aforesaid.
- (4) Upon receipt of such particulars as aforesaid, together with such fee or fees as aforesaid, the Conservators shall grant to the person furnishing the same a certificate, containing the name and address of such person, the registered number, and such other particulars as the Conservators think fit.
- (5) The name (if any) of every such boat, punt or other vessel as aforesaid, and the name of the person using the same in connection with his business as aforesaid, and his registered number, shall be painted white on a black ground, in capital letters not less than three inches long, and proportionately broad, on the bows of such vessel, except in cases where such vessel is so constructed that such names and number cannot be conspicuously displayed without risk of obliteration on the bows thereof, in which cases such names and number shall be painted as aforesaid on some part of such vessel, so that the same shall always be conspicuously displayed without risk of obliteration, and to the satisfaction of the Conservators and their officers.

Provided that this Bye-law shall not apply to any vessel already marked in accordance with any law or regulation in force on the river.

(6) Every person following the business of a fisherman on the river, and every such person letting for hire any vessel to be used on the river for fishing, shall keep or cause to be kept on board every boat, punt or other vessel used in connection with his business aforesaid a copy of these Bye-laws.

Fish for Scientific Purposes.

17. Nothing in these Bye-laws shall prevent any person, with the previous consent in writing of the Conservators under their common seal, from obtaining fish for the purpose of

artificial propagation and other scientific purposes from any part of the River Thames, or from having in his possession salmon roe, or trout roe, for any of these purposes, or from taking or attempting to take salmon or trout when spawning or near the spawning beds.

Saving certain Rights of Fisheries.

18. Nothing in these Bye-laws, except the provisions relative to the close seasons and to the sizes of fish, shall take away, alter or abridge the right of the owner or occupier of a private fishery, or any person having authority in writing from any such owner or occupier, to do any of the following things within the limits of such private fishery only, namely: to fish for, or to take, or attempt to take, fish by means of nets commonly called cast nets and crayfish nets, or by grig or ground wheels for eels, or by night lines, or by means of eel bucks or stages, so far only as the same or any of them can be legally used irrespective of these Bye-laws. Provided that on a special licence being obtained from the Conservators in writing, under their common seal, and not otherwise, such owners or occupiers or persons having authority as aforesaid may, in such private fishery only, take fish by means of a net, commonly called a hoop net, having a mesh of not less than two inches from knot to knot when wet, or eight inches all round, and not being more than six yards long, or by means of a net commonly called a drag net, and having a mesh of not less than two inches from knot to knot when wet, or eight inches all round.

Proof of Offences.

19. If any net, engine, apparatus or device, the use of which is prohibited by these Byelaws, or if any fish during the time at which the capture of the same is prohibited, or a size of less than that permitted to be taken by these Bye-laws is found in the possession or under the control of any person on the river or on the shore or banks thereof, or within one hundred yards on either side of the Thames, such person shall be deemed guilty of an offence against these Bye-laws unless he prove to the satisfaction of the Court before which he is tried that the same was legally in his possession or under his control; and if any such net, engine, apparatus, device or fish has been lawfully seized, the Court may, either before or after such trial, order the same to be forfeited or destroyed, but without prejudice to the infliction of a penalty or any other remedy against the person charged.

Penalty for Breach of Bye-laws.

20. Any person who shall offend against any of these Bye-laws shall for every offence be liable to a penalty not exceeding £10, and in the case of a continuing offence to a further daily penalty not exceeding the like amount, which said penalties shall be recoverable, enforced and applied according to the provisions of the Thames Conservancy Act 1894, as amended by the Port of London Act 1908.

All persons desirous of making any objection to or representation respecting such proposed Bye-laws may do so in writing or otherwise on or before Saturday, the 5th day of July, 1913, by sending the same to or leaving
