The KING has been graciously pleased to grant unto John Hugh Middleton Middleton, of Courtenay Beach, in the borough of Hove and county of Sussex, Gentleman, His Royal licence and authority that he may take and henceforth use and bear the surname of Powell in addition to and after that of Middleton, that he may bear the Arms of Powell quarterly with those of Middleton, and that such surname and arms may in like manner be taken, borne, and used by his issue, the said arms being first duly exemplified according to the Laws of Arms, and recorded in His Majesty's College of Arms, otherwise the said Royal licence and permission to be void and of none effect.

And to command that the said Royal Concession and Declaration be recorded in His Majesty's said College of Arms.

His Majesty the KING has been pleased to award the Edward Medal of the Second Class to Mr. Albert Edward Stroud, under the following circumstances:—

On the 11th July last Stroud, who is a guard on the East Indian Railway, was employed on

special duty at Bukhtiarpur Station, and was engaged in controlling a large crowd of pilgrims. Just as a passenger train was entering the station, an elderly Indian woman jumped on to the line intending to cross. Stroud at once jumped after her, and, though she had fallen, succeeded in dragging her out of the way of the train.

His Majesty the KING has been graciously pleased to award the Edward Medal of the Second Class to Kenneth Burton and Gurzei Ahom, under the following circumstances:—

On the 12th December, 1911, a native foreman, named Rulia, employed by the Assam Oil Company at Digboi, entered an oil tank ten feet deep and containing four feet of oil. He was overcome by oil fumes, whereupon one of his workmen, named Gurzei Ahom, who had tried to dissuade him from entering the tank and was aware of the danger, went to his assistance and was himself overcome. Another workman gave the alarm to Mr. Kenneth Burton, Assistant Manager in charge of the tank, who was in his office some 70 yards away. Mr. Burton immediately obtained a rope, and, climbing into the tank, fastened it around

Gurzei Ahom and succeeded in pulling him out. Mr. Burton then entered the tank again, and, attaching the rope to Rulia, hauled him to the top of the tank; but Mr. Burton was overcome and collapsed, and Rulia fell back into the oil. The tank was then emptied, but it was too late to save Rulia's life.

On the 9th July, 1912, two disastrous explosions occurred in the South Workings of the Cadeby Main Colliery, near Doncaster, originating at the coal face and spreading along the roads for distances of nearly half a mile.

H. Hulley and G. Fisher were among the first to explore the affected districts after each of the explosions. They assisted in attending to and removing the injured, and also in building stoppings to shut off the dangerous areas, in spite of the constant risk of further explosions and falls. Altogether Fisher was in the pit for about 12 hours and Hulley even longer, and, as both men were experienced pitmen, they were well aware of the imminent risk to their lives that they ran during the whole time. Their great courage and tenacity render their conduct conspicuous even among the many brave actions performed in connection with the disaster.

J. E. Chambers went down into the pit after the second explosion, immediately explored one of the roads near the point of origin alone, and was the probable means of saving two lives; he afterwards went through the district to assist in withdrawing all men from the workings.

W. H. Prince helped to organise rescue

parties and assisted in saving life by the use of apparatus. With great presence of mind, and at much risk to himself, he personally extinguished a fire which occurred while he was so engaged, and afterwards he helped to build the stoppings.

Herbert Williamson superintended the rescue work in some of the roads after the first explosion. A fall caused by the second explosion prevented him from making any progress for a time; but he got together a body of men to clear a way over it, and then continued the work of rescue. He also returned to the affected roads by himself after the third explosion.

Sergeant Winch went with his brigade into the workings after the first explosion to help in the rescue work; he was knocked down by the second explosion, but proceeded inwards and assisted in saving lives by the use of his apparatus. He displayed great coolness in dealing with a fire, which broke out in one of the roads, and in keeping his men together to continue the work.

All these men displayed great courage, and set a splendid example in the face of the disaster. Throughout their work the risk of a further explosion sweeping through the district was always present, and falls and fires were occurring in many places.

LIGHT RAILWAYS ACT, 1896.

London and North Western Railway (Wolverhampton and Cannock Chase Light Railway) Transfer and Amendment Order.

The Light Railway Commissioners have submitted to the Board of Trade for confirmation, under the above-mentioned Act, an Order made by them authorizing the transfer to the London and North Western Railway Company of the powers, etc., conferred on the Wolverhampton and Cannock Chase Railway Company by the Wolverhampton and Cannock Chase Railway Acts of 1901 and 1903, and by the Wolverhampton and Cannock Chase Railway (Light Railway) Orders of 1907 and of 1910, and extending the time limited for the completion of part of the railways thereby authorized and authorizing the London and North Western Railway Company to abandon other parts of such railways and to construct new light railways in substitution therefor and for other purposes.

On the part of the Company: --

(1) To pay the amounts aforesaid, and all taxes, rates, charges, assessments, impositions and outgoings without deduction. (2) To continuously work the tramways in an efficient and proper manner according to a time table and list of fares to be reasonably approved by the Corporation and so as to afford daily a reasonably efficient service of cars as is necessary to meet the requirements of the public. (3) To abide by, perform and fulfil all statutory and other provisions for the time being applying to the tramways which bind the Corporation and to indemnify the Corporation from all claims and penalties by reason of the non-observance of such provisions, and further to indemnify the Corporation from all damages and costs in respect of accidents arising to any person or property from the operation of the tramways. (4) To observe, conform to, and enforce byelaws, orders, rules and regulations made by the Corporation or the Board of Trade.
