EAST KENT LIGHT RAILWAYS (EXTENSIONS).

OTICE is hereby given, that application is intended to be made to the Light Railway Commissioners this present month of May, 1913, for an Order under the above Acts for the purposes (inter alia) following, that is to say:—

LONDON COUNTY COUNCIL (GENERAL POWERS).

[Petition for Additional Provision No. 2].

(Contribution by London County Council to cost of acquisition of Crystal Palace; Raising of money by issue of Consolidated Stock, &c., and provisions relating thereto; Repeal and Amendment of Acts; Incidental Provisions).

THE London County Council (in this notice called "the Council") intend to apply to Parliament by petition for additional provision for leave to introduce into the Bill promoted by the Council, and now pending in Parliament under the title of the "London County Council (General Powers) Bill," provisions to authorise the Council if they think fit to contribute such sum as they may determine towards the acquisition of the lands and premises situate partly in [the Metropolitan Boroughs of Camberwell and Lewisham in the Administrative County of London, and partly in the Urban Districts of Beckenham and Penge in the Administrative County of Kent known as "the Crystal Palace" and the grounds appurtenant thereto, and lands and premises held in connection therewith.

The said provisions will enable the Council to raise money by the creation and issue of Consolidated Stock to such amount as may be necessary for the purposes of any such contribution as aforesaid, or to resort to the Consolidated Loans Fund or otherwise to raise such money in each case in accordance with the provisions of the Acts regulating the raising of money for capital purposes by the Council, and to make provision as to the redemption of such stock or repayment of loans, and the payment of interest or dividends thereon out of the Consolidated Loans Fund and County Rate, as payments for general or special county purposes within the meaning of the Local Government Act, 1888, as the Council may determine.

The proposed Additional Provision will or may prescribe the terms and conditions upon

and subject to which any such contribution as aforesaid may be made, and will or may make any other provision with respect to such contribution and the acquisition maintenance management and use of the said lands and premises which may be deemed necessary or expedient and repeal alter or amend any of the provisions of the Metropolis Management Acts, 1855 to 1893, the Open Spaces Act, 1906, and any other Act or Acts relating to Open Spaces or to any of such matters as are hereinbefore referred to.

The said provisions will vary and extinguish all rights and privileges which would be inconsistent or might interfere with the objects or

purposes thereof, and will confer other rights and privileges.
