#### LIGHT RAILWAYS ACT, 1896.

Birmingham Corporation (Quinton) Light Railway Order.

The Light Railway Commissioners have submitted to the Board of Trade for confirmation, under the above-mentioned Act, an Order made by them authorising the construction of a Light Railway in the City and County of Birmingham and in the Parish of Warley in the Urban District of Oldbury in the County of Worcester, in extension of the Light Railway authorised by the Birmingham Corporation Light Railway Order, 1912.
