WE, considering that it is desirable that Friday, the eleventh day of July next, should be observed as a Bank Holiday in the City of Liverpool, the County Borough of Bootle, the County Borough of Birkenhead, and the County Borough of Wallasey, and in pursuance of the provisions of "The Bank Holidays Act, 1871," do hereby, by and with the advice of Our Privy Council, and in exercise of the powers conferred by the Act aforesaid, appoint Friday, the eleventh day of July next, as a special day to be observed as a Bank Holiday throughout the City of Liverpool, the County Borough of Bootle, the County Borough of Birkenhead, and the County Borough of Wallasey, under and in accordance with the said Act; and We do, by this Our Royal Proclamation, command the said day to be so observed, and all Our loving Subjects to order themselves accordingly.

Given at Our Court at Buckingham Palace, this thirteenth day of June, in the year of our Lord one thousand nine hundred and thirteen, and in the Fourth year of Our Reign.

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Act of the sixth and seventh years of His late Majesty, King William the Fourth, chapter seventy-seven, of the Act of the third and fourth years of Her late Majesty, Queen Victoria, chapter one hundred and thirteen, and of the Act of the thirty-seventh and thirty-eighth years of Her said late Majesty, chapter sixty-three, duly prepared and laid before His Majesty in Council a Scheme, bearing date the eighth day of May, in the year one thousand nine hundred and thirteen, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, acting in pursuance of the Act of the sixth and seventh years of His late Majesty, King William the Fourth, chapter seventy-seven, of the Act of the third and fourth years of Her late Majesty, Queen Victoria, chapter one hundred and thirteen, and of the Act of the thirty-seventh and thirty-eighth years of Her said late Majesty, chapter sixty-three, have prepared and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following Scheme with respect to the Archdeaconries and Rural Deaneries in the diocese of Chichester.

"Whereas the Archdeaconries and Rural Deaneries in the said diocese of Chichester were set forth in the Statutory Schedule of Rural Deaneries prepared under the provisions of the hereinbefore thirdly mentioned Act and deposited in the Registry of the diocese of Chichester at Chichester on the eighteenth day of February, in the year one thousand eight hundred and seventy-five.

"And whereas the Archdeaconries within the said diocese were then two in number, to wit, the Archdeaconry of Chichester and the Archdeaconry of Lewes, but by an Order of Your Majesty in Council, dated the twenty-fourth day of June, in the year one thousand nine hundred and twelve, and published in the London Gazette on the twenty-eighth day of the same month, a new Archdeaconry, to wit, the Archdeaconry of Hastings, was constituted out of the said Archdeaconry of Lewes.

"And whereas it has been represented to us by the Right Reverend Charles John, Bishop of the said diocese of Chichester, that the arrangements which are hereinafter recommended and proposed with respect to the said Archdeaconries of Chichester, Hastings and Lewes and with respect to some of the Rural Deaneries

within such Archdeaconries are desirable and should be carried into effect, and we are of opinion that the same may properly be carried into effect.

"And whereas the said arrangements involve the rearrangement of the limits and the renaming of certain Rural Deaneries within the said Archdeaconries of Chichester, Hastings and Lewes, the abolition of certain other Rural Deaneries, and also the formation of two new Rural Deaneries.

"And whereas it appears to us to be convenient to set forth in the Schedule to this Scheme annexed the names of all the parishes, cures or churches which, under the arrangements hereinafter recommended and proposed, will be situate within and will constitute the several Rural Deaneries of the said three Archdeaconries of Chichester, Hastings and Lewes, to the intent that so far as legally may be the said Schedule may be held to be in the place of and in substitution for the aforesaid Statutory Schedule of Rural Deaneries.

'Now, therefore, with the consent of the said Charles John, Bishop of Chichester, (in testimony whereof he has set his hand and Episcopal Seal to this Scheme) we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, humbly recommend and propose that as from the day on which any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme shall be published in the London Gazette, and without any assurance in the law other than such duly gazetted Order, first, the Rural Deaneries of Arundel II, Mid-hurst II and Storrington III, in the said Archdeaconry of Chichester, and the Rural Deanery of Lewes IV, in the said Archdeaconry of Lewes, shall be abolished, secondly, a new Rural Deanery shall be formed within the said Archdeaconry of Hastings and shall be named "The Rural Deanery of Etchingham," thirdly, a new Rural Deanery shall be formed within the said Archdeaconry of Lewes, and shall be named "The Rural Deanery of Hove," and fourthly, the said Archdeaconries of Chichester, Hastings and Lewes shall each comprise and consist of those Rural Deaneries the names of which are set down in order under its name are numbered consecutively in Schedule to this Scheme annexed, and thatthe name which in such Schedule is given to any Rural Deanery shall be the name thereof, and that every parish or cure or church the name of which is set down in numbered order under the name of any Rural Deanery in the first column of the said Schedule shall belong to and be and form part of the Rural Deanery and Archdeaconry under the names of which it is set down as aforesaid, and shall be subject to the jurisdiction and authority of the Rural Dean of the Rural Deanery and of the Archdeacon of the Archdeaconry under which it is so set down as aforesaid, and shall not belong to or be a part of any other Rural Deanery or Archdeaconry nor be subject to the jurisdiction and authority of any other Rural Dean or Archdeacon.

"And we further recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other matter or thing with respect to the matters aforesaid or any of them by virtue of the said Acts or of any of them or of any other Act of Parliament,

four hundred yards.

"That on the map hereunto annexed the said parish of Overton is coloured blue, the said chapelry of Fyfield is coloured yellow, the said chapelry of Alton Priors is coloured pink, and the said parish of Alton Barnes is coloured green.

"That according to the last available Census Report the population of the said parish of Overton, including the chapelry of Fyfield was 694; the population of the said chapelry of Alton Priors was 175; and the population of the said parish of Alton Barnes was 151.

"That there is in each of the parishes of Overton and Alton Barnes a parish church and in the chapelry of Alton Priors a church. "That the Parish Church of Overton con-

"That the Parish Church of Overton contains accommodation for 320 persons; that the church at Alton Priors contains accommodation for 150 persons, and that the Parish Church of Alton Barnes contains accommodation for 100 persons.

persons.

"That the net annual value of the benefice of Overton, including the chapelries of Alton Priors and Fyfield is £412 14s. 11d. or thereabouts, and that the net annual value of the benefice of Alton Barnes is £139 3s. 2d. or

thereabouts.

"That there are houses of residence belonging to each of the benefices of Overton and Alton Barnes.

"That the patronage of the benefice of Overton with the chapelries of Fyfield and Alton Priors belongs to Alexander Taylor, of Manton House, Marlborough, Esquire, and the Reverend Henry Tootell is the present Incumbent thereof. That the patronage of the benefice of Alton Barnes belongs to the Warden and Scholars of Saint Mary College, of Winchester, in Oxford, commonly called New College, Oxford, and the Reverend Charles Andrew Sladen is the present Incumbent thereof.

"That if the said chapelry of Alton Priors be separated from the said parish of Overton and annexed to the said parish of Alton Barnes the Warden and Scholars of New College, Oxford, the patrons of the said rectory of Alton Barnes, have granted a capital sum of £150 for the increase of the endowment of the benefice of Alton Barnes with the chapelry of Alton Priors annexed.

"That it appears to me that under the provisions of the Act of Parliament passed in the session holden in the first and second years of the reign of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, chapter 106, the said chapelry of Alton Priors may be advantageously separated from the said benefice of Overton and annexed to the said benefice of Alton Barnes.

"That pursuant to the directions contained in the 26th section of the said Act of Parliament I have drawn up a Scheme in writing describing the mode in which it appears to me that the alteration may best be effected and how the changes consequent on such alteration in respect to ecclesiastical jurisdiction, glebe lands, tithes, rent charges and other ecclesiastical dues, rates and payments, and in respect to patronage and rights to pews may be made

with justice to all parties interested. Which Scheme, together with the Consents thereto of the before-mentioned patrons and Incumbents I do submit to Your Grace to the intent that Your Grace may, if on full consideration and inquiry you shall be satisfied with such Scheme, certify the same and such consents as aforesaid by your Report to His Majesty in Council."

And whereas the said Scheme drawn up by the said Bishop of Salisbury and the Consents referred to in the said Representation are as follows:—

"SCHEME.

"That the said chapelry of Alton Priors shall be separated from the said parish of Overton and annexed for ecclesiastical purposes to the said parish of Alton Barnes.

"That all fees and other ecclesiastical dues and payments for marriages, burials, churchings and other ecclesiastical offices, and all such other ecclesiastical dues, offerings, and emoluments usually payable to the Incumbent of a parish or benefice which shall arise or become payable for or in respect of the said chapelry of Alton Priors when it has been annexed to the said parish of Alton Barnes, shall belong and be payable to the Incumbent of the benefice of Alton Barnes with the chapelry of Alton Priors annexed.

"That two moduses of six pounds five shillings and five pounds six shillings respectively per annum (particulars whereof are set out in the First Schedule hereto) now payable to and received by the Vicar of Overton, shall cease to be so paid and received and shall be payable

to and received by the Incumbent of the benefice of Alton Barnes with Alton Priors.

"That the commuted sum of thirty pounds thirteen shillings and fourpence tithe rent charge (worth in 1912 £22 5s. 11d.) charged upon a farm called Shaw Farm, situate in the parish of Overton (particulars of which are set out in the Schedule hereto), and which is now payable to and received by the Vicar of Overton, shall cease to be so payable, and shall be payable to and received by the Rector of the parish of Alton Barnes with Alton Priors, and that the said capital sum of one hundred and fifty pounds, given by the Warden and Fellows of New College, Oxford, and the income thereof be payable to and received by the Rector of the parish of Alton Barnes with Alton Priors.

"That no other alterations shall be made in respect of the tithe rent charges and other emoluments of either of the said benefices of Overton and Alton Barnes.

"That the patronage of the said benefice of Overton with the chapelry of Fyfield annexed shall remain vested in the said Alexander Taylor, Esquire, and that the patronage of the benefice of Alton Barnes with Alton Priors shall be vested in the said Warden and Scholars of New College. Oxford.

"That the inhabitants of the chapelry of Alton Priors shall henceforth cease to have any right to accommodation in the Parish Church of Overton, and that the inhabitants of the parish of Alton Barnes and the chapelry of Alton Priors when the said chapelry of Alton Priors shall have been annexed to the said parish of Alton Barnes shall have right to accommodation both in the Church of Alton Barnes and in the Church of Alton Priors."

WHEREAS by the Burial Act, 1853, as amended by the Burial Act, 1900, it is provided that, in case it appear to His Majesty in Council, upon the representation of the Local Government Board, that, for the protection of the public health, the opening of any new burial ground in any city or town, or within any other limits, save with the previous approval of the Local Government Board, should be prohibited, or that burials in any city or town, or within any other limits, or in any burial grounds or places of burial, should be wholly discontinued, or should be discontinued subject to any exception or qualification, it shall be lawful for His Majesty, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to order that no new burial ground shall be opened in such city or town, or within such limits, without such previous approval, or (as the case may require) that after a time men-tioned in the Order, burials in such city or town, or within such limits, or in such burial grounds or places of burial, shall be discontinued wholly, or subject to any exceptions or qualifications mentioned in such Order, and so from time to time as circumstances may require: Provided always that notice of such representation, and of the time when it shall please His Majesty to order the same to be

taken into consideration by the Privy Council, shall be published in the London Gazette, and shall be affixed on the doors of the churches or chapels of, or on some other conspicuous places within, the parishes affected by such representation, one month before such representation is so considered: Provided also that no such representation shall be made in relation to the burial ground of any parish until ten days' previous notice of the intention to make such representation shall have been given to the Incumbent and the Vestry Clerk or Churchwardens of such parish:

And whereas the Local Government Board, after giving to the Incumbent and the Churchwardens of the parish of Sprowston, in the county of Norfolk, and the parish of South Brewham, in the county of Somerset respectively, ten days' previous notice of their intention in that behalf, have made representations to His Majesty in Council that, for the protection of the public health, the opening of any new burial ground in the civil parishes of Sprowston and South Brewham aforesaid, save with the previous approval of the Local Government Board, should be prohibited, and that burials should be discontinued therein as hereinafter directed:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, is pleased to order, as it is hereby ordered, that no new burial grounds shall be opened in the said civil parishes save with the previous approval of the Local Government Board, and that burials therein shall be discontinued as follows, viz.:—

Sprowston.—Forthwith and entirely in the parish church of St. Mary and St. Margaret, Sprowston, in the county of Norfolk; and in the churchyard, except as follows:—

- (a) In any vault or walled grave now existing in the said churchyard burial may be allowed subject to the condition that every coffin buried in such vault or grave be separately enclosed by stonework or brickwork properly cemented.
- (b) In any earthen grave now existing in the said churchyard the burial may be allowed of the body of any member of the family of the person or persons heretofore buried in such grave, subject to the condition that no part of the coffin containing the body shall be at a depth less than three feet below the level of the surface of the ground adjoining the grave.
- (c) In the said churchyard, in any grave space in which no interment has heretofore taken place, the burial may be allowed of the body of any person for whom or of any member of a family for which such grave space has been reserved and appropriated as a burial place, with the exclusive right of burial therein, subject to the condition that no part of the coffin containing the body shall be at a depth less than three feet below

the level of the surface of the ground adjoining the grave.

SOUTH BREWHAM.—Forthwith and entirely in the church of St. John the Baptist, South Brewham, in the county of Somerset; and in the churchyard attached thereto, except as follows:—

In any vault or walled grave now existing in the said churchyard burial may be allowed subject to the condition that every coffin buried in such vault or grave be separately enclosed by stonework or brickwork properly cemented.

And whereas it seems fit to His Majesty, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, that the said Order so far as it relates to the said Parish Churchyard be varied:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice aforesaid, is pleased to order, as it is hereby ordered, that the said Order of the 27th day of January, 1885, so far as it relates to the Parish Churchyard of Llanstadwell, in the county of Pembroke, be varied, so that, notwithstanding anything therein, it shall be lawful after the death of the Reverend Lacy H. Rumsey and his wife, and subject to the condition hereinafter set forth, to bury their bodies in any grave space or spaces in that portion of the said churchyard to the southwest or south of the ancient vestry, and in which no interment has taken place for a period of fourteen years prior to the date of this Order.

Provided that the burials hereby authorized shall be subject to compliance with the requirement that no part of the coffin containing the body shall, in either case, be at a depth less than three feet below the level of the surface of the ground adjoining the grave.

The following Statute made by the University of Oxford, on the 3rd day of June, 1913, has been submitted for the approval of His Majesty in Council, and notice of its having been so submitted is published in accordance with the provisions of "The Universities of Oxford and Cambridge Act, 1877":—

Whereas the University of Oxford Commissioners, in exercise of the powers conferred on them by the Universities of Oxford and Cambridge Act, 1877, made a Statute (hereinafter referred to as Statt. Tit. IV Sect. 11 F. § 5 (a)) wholly for the University relating to the Rawlinsonian Professor of Anglo-Saxon, and it was thereby provided that he should be entitled to receive the annual payment then assigned to him out of the University Chest, unless provision for a payment of correspond-

ing amount should have been made from some other source;

And whereas the said Commissioners, in exercise of the powers aforesaid, made a Statute (hereinafter referred to as Statt. Tit. IV Sect. II F. § 9 (a)) wholly for the University relating to the Merton Professor of English Language and Literature, and it was thereby provided that the said Professor should be entitled to the emoluments which by the Statutes of Merton College are appropriated to his Professorship;

And whereas it was provided by clause 5 of each of the said Statutes that the University might, if it should think fit, at any time by Statute determine that the two said Professorships should be united;

And whereas the said Commissioners, in exercise of the powers aforesaid, made a Statute wholly for Merton College, and thereby provided that the Professor of English Language and Literature should be by virtue of his office a Fellow of the College, and should receive from the College a stipend of £700 per annum in addition to the emolument of his Fellowship, and that if at any time the Professorship of English Language and Literature should be united to the Rawlinsonian Professorship of Anglo-Saxon the College might resolve that any part of the yearly sum of £700 aforesaid should be applied to some other purpose connected with the Professoriate of the University, such purpose to be determined from time to time by the College with the consent of the Hebdomadal Council, provided that the total emolument of the holder of the said united Professorships should not be reduced to less than £900 per annum;

And whereas the three hereinbefore recited Statutes were approved by Her late Majesty Queen Victoria in Council on the 3rd of May, 1882;

And whereas the University, in exercise of the powers conferred on it by the first and second hereinbefore recited Statutes, in the year 1894 made a Statute (hereinafter referred to as Statt. Tit. IV Sect. 11 F. § 5 (b)) by which it was provided that the Rawlinsonian Professorship of Anglo-Saxon should, as soon as it should become vacant, be united to the Merton Professorship of English Language and Literature;

And whereas the University, in exercise of the powers conferred on it by the said Statutes and in concurrence with Merton College, in the year 1894 made a Statute (hereinafter referred to as Statt. Tit. IV Sect. 11 F. § 9 (b)) by which (after reciting as the fact was that Merton College, with the consent of the Hebdomadal Council, had agreed in the event of the union of the said Professorships to co-operate with the University in the creation of a new Professorship of English Literature and to assign to such Professor £300 per annum, part of the yearly sum of £700 payable to the Merton Professor of English Language and Literature) it was provided that when the Merton Professor of English Language and Literature should become Rawlinsonian Professor of Anglo-Saxon the yearly sum of £300 should be deducted from the emoluments of the Merton Professor of English Language and Literature and appropriated to the Professorship of English Literature:

And whereas the University in the year 1894 made a Statute (hereinafter referred to as Statt. Tit. IV Sect. 11 F. § 12) for establishing a Professorship of English Literature;

And whereas the said Rawlinsonian Professorship of Anglo-Saxon became vacant in the year 1903 and all the hereinbefore recited Statutes made by the University thereupon took effect;

And whereas the present holder of the Rawlinsonian Professorship of Anglo-Saxon and of the Merton Professorship of English Language and Literature is entitled to the annual sum of £600 appropriated to the Merton Professorship of English Language and Literature by the Statutes of Merton College, inclusive of the emoluments of a Fellowship in the said College, and is further entitled as Rawlinsonian Professor of Anglo-Saxon to an annual sum of £300 payable out of the University Chest, inclusive of the sum of £70 or thereabouts being the income of the Rawlinsonian endowment;

And whereas the present holder of the Professorship of English Literature is entitled to the annual sum of £500 payable by Merton College under the Statutes of Merton College, inclusive of the sum of £300 deducted from the emoluments of the Merton Professorship as provided by the hereinbefore recited Statute, Statt. Tit. IV Sect. 11 F. § 5 (b), and is also at present in receipt of an annual sum of £200 payable out of the Common University Fund and of an annual sum of £200, being the emoluments of a Fellowship in Magdalen College tenable by him for a period of seven years from July 20, 1911;

And whereas by his will dated April 4, 1874, Dr. Joseph Bosworth directed his trustees, after the decease of the survivor of certain persons therein named, to transfer certain Trust Funds and income to the University and directed that the University should stand possessed of such Trust Funds and income upon trust to invest the same in manner therein mentioned, and should out of the income thereof pay so much to the Rawlinsonian Professor of Anglo-Saxon as should from time to time be sufficient to augment his salary as such Professor to £500 per annum, and subject thereto should apply such income in manner therein declared;

And whereas the said Dr. Joseph Bosworth died in the year 1876 and his will was shortly thereafter duly proved;

And whereas in the events that happened the said trusts declared by the said Dr. Joseph Bosworth's will in favour of the University became operative on May 30, 1910;

And whereas the said Trust Funds have been transferred to the University in pursuance of the said will;

And whereas the annual income of the said Trust Funds so transferred amounts to the sum of £350 or thereabouts;

And whereas it is expedient, in order to make better provision for the teaching in the University of English Language and Literature, and in order to carry into effect the hereinbefore recited trusts of the said will, to separate the Rawlinsonian Professorship of Anglo-Saxon from the Merton Professorship of English Language and Literature, and to provide that the emoluments of the Rawlinsonian Professorship of Anglo-Saxon shall consist of the annual sum of £500 per annum payable out of the University Chest, inclusive of the income of the Rawlinsonian Endowment and of the Bosworth Endowment;

And whereas under the Statutes of Merton College the Merton Professor of English Language and Literature will, so soon as the Rawlinsonian Professorship of Anglo-Saxon is separated from the Merton Professorship of English Language and Literature, again become entitled to receive out of the revenues of Merton College the annual sum of £700 and in addition the emoluments of a Fellowship in the said College;

And whereas the Warden and Fellows of Merton College and the present holder of the Rawlinsonian Professorship of Anglo-Saxon and the Merton Professorship of English Language and Literature have consented to the separation of the said Professorships upon the terms and subject to the conditions hereinafter contained;

And whereas the Warden and Fellows of Merton College have agreed to co-operate with the University for the purpose of making provision for the emoluments of the said Professorship of English Literature, and to make such alterations in the Statutes of the said College as may be necessary for that purpose, and in particular to provide that the Professor of English Literature shall receive out of the revenues of the College the annual sum of £300, and in addition shall, so soon as he ceases to be a Fellow of any other College, be entitled to be admitted to a Fellowship in Merton College and to receive the emoluments of such Fellowship;

And whereas it is expedient to provide that the Professor of English Literature shall receive out of the University Chest such further annual sum (if any) as, being added to the emoluments appropriated to his Professorship by the Statutes of Merton College and to any emoluments of which he may be in receipt in virtue of his Professorship, inclusive of the emoluments of any Fellowship held by him in any College, will amount to the annual sum of £900;—

The University, in exercise of the powers conferred upon it by the Universities of Oxford and Cambridge Act, 1877, and of all other powers enabling it, enacts as follows:—

- 1. As from the date of approval of this Statute by His Majesty in Council the Rawlinsonian Professorship of Anglo-Saxon shall be separated from the Merton Professorship of English Language and Literature, and the present holder of the united Professorships shall cease to be Rawlinsonian Professor of Anglo-Saxon but shall continue to be Merton Professor of English Language and Literature.
- 2. In Statt. Tit. IV Sect. 11 F. § 5 (a) (ed. 1912, p. 105), in the title the word "Rawlinsonian" shall be struck out, and the words "Rawlinson and Bosworth" shall be substituted therefor.
- 3. In Statt. Tit. IV Sect. II F. § 5 (a) (ed. 1912, p. 105) in clause I the word "Rawlin-

- sonian" shall be struck out, and the words "Rawlinson and Bosworth" shall be substituted therefor.
- 4. In Statt. Tit. IV Sect. II F. § 5 (a) (ed. 1912, p. 106) clause 2 shall be struck out, and the following clause shall be substituted therefor:—
- "2. He shall be entitled to receive the annual sum of £500 payable out of the University Chest, inclusive of the income of the Rawlinson Endowment and of the Bosworth Endowment."
- 5. In Statt. Tit. IV Sect. II F. § 5 (a) (ed. 1912, p. 106) clause 5 shall be struck out.
- 6. In Statt. Tit. IV Sect. II F. § 5 (b) (ed. 1912, p. 106) the whole Statute shall be struck out.
- 7. In Statt. Tit. IV Sect. II F. § 9 (a) (ed. 1912, p. 109) clause 5 shall be struck out.
- 8. In Statt. Tit. IV Sect. 11 F. § 9 (b) (ed. 1912, p. 109) the whole Statute shall be struck out.
- 9. In Statt. Tit. IV Sect. II F. § 12 (ed. 1912, p. 113) clause 3 shall be struck out, and the following clause shall be substituted therefor:—
- "3. The Professor shall be entitled to the emoluments which by the Statutes of Merton College are appropriated to his Professorship, and shall receive out of the University Chest such further annual sum (if any) as, being added to such emoluments and to any other emoluments of which he may be in receipt in virtue of his Professorship, inclusive of the emoluments of any Fellowship held by him in any College, will amount to the annual sum of £900."
- 10. In Statt. Tit. IV Sect. II F. § 12, in clause 4 the words "Schedule B" shall be struck out and the words "Schedule A" shall be substituted therefor.
- 11. In Statt. Tit. IV Sect. 11 F. § 12, in clause 4 all words after "Oxford and Cambridge Act, 1877" shall be struck out, and the following words shall be substituted therefor:—
- "Provided that nothing contained in this clause shall operate so as to impose upon the present holder of the Professorship any duties in addition to the duties to which he was subject under the Statute relating to his Professorship, which was in force on the 1st day of January, 1913."

Whereas it is expedient to amend Section II of Title XXI of the Statutes of the University of Oxford ("Concerning a Visitatorial Board") so as to give further powers to the Visitatorial Board in respect of Bodley's Librarian:

Now the said University, in exercise of the powers in that behalf conferred on it by "The Universities of Oxford and Cambridge Act, 1877," hereby enacts as follows:—

In Section II of Title XXI of the Statutes of the University (p. 454, ed. 1912), after clause 14 the following clause shall be inserted:—

"15. If the Curators of the Bodleian Library shall at any time represent to the Visitatorial Board that in the opinion of a majority of their whole number Bodley's Librarian is by reason of physical or mental infirmity so far unable to discharge his duties that it is expedient in the interest of the Library that he should cease to hold his office, and that he is unwilling or unable to resign it, the Visitatorial Board may, if such action appears to them to be required by the circumstances of the case, remove the Librarian from office."

Whereas the University of Oxford Commissioners under and by virtue of all and every the powers in that behalf enabling them contained in the Universities of Oxford and Cambridge Act, 1877, did by an Instrument under their Seal, dated the sixteenth day of June, 1881, make certain Statutes thereunto annexed for "the College of All Souls of the Faithful Departed, commonly called All Souls College, in the University of Oxford."

And whereas such Statutes were approved by Her late Majesty Queen Victoria in Council on the third day of May, 1882, and have since been altered and amended from time to time.

And whereas at a General Meeting of the Governing Body of the said College specially summoned for that purpose, and held on the thirteenth day of May, 1913, it was unanimously resolved that the several further altera-

tions in and additions to the said Statutes hereinafter, specified should be made, that is to say:—

In Statute IV. (April, 1913, edition).

That the words "Reader in" in line 16 of Clause 1 of this Statute should be removed, and the words "Gladstone Professor of" should be inserted in their place.

That the words "and the Reader in" in line 20, and the words "Political Theory and Institutions" in line 21 of Clause 1 of this Statute should be removed.

That the words "and of the Reader" in line 4 of Clause 2 of this Statute and the words "The provision as to the Reader in Political Theory and Institutions shall have effect until July 1st, 1920," at the end of such Clause should be removed.

That the words "or Reader" in line 1 of Clause 4 of this Statute and the words "or Readership" in lines 10 and 11 respectively of such Clause should be removed.

Now we, the said Warden and College, in pursuance of the provisions of the said Universities of Oxford and Cambridge Act, 1877, do hereby submit the aforesaid alterations and additions made by us in the Statutes governing our said College to the King's Most Excellent Majesty in Council, and humbly pray that the same may be approved and confirmed.

His Majesty the KING has been graciously pleased to award the Edward Medal of the

Second Class to Albert Henry Cooper, Arthur Bernard Hewitt, and George Thompson, in the following circumstances:

On the 8th January last a steel girder fell from a roof in the Markham No. 2 Colliery, Stavely, Derbyshire, causing a fall of the roof. Mr. Cooper, the under manager of the mine, who at once went to the place, took steps to repair the damage, and, while the debris was being removed in tubs, a second fall occurred without warning and buried three men engaged in the work of removal. Though fragments of the roof were still falling, Mr. Cooper dashed over the heap of debris and, being joined later on by Mr. Hewitt, the manager, he succeeded in rescuing two of the men. They then proceeded to search for the third man and discovered him completely buried. George Thompson, a workman employed at the mine, came to help, and the three worked for about fifty minutes in order to extricate the unfortunate man. They had all but succeeded, when a further heavy fall took place killing him outright. Notwithstanding the risk of further falls, the work of rescue was continued for four hours, till the dead body was reached.

The three men incurred prolonged and serious risk in their efforts to save life.

His Majesty the KING has been graciously pleased to award the Edward Medal of the Second Class to Thomas Thompson under the following circumstances:

On the 3rd of April a heavy fall of roof occurred in a gateway at the Swinton Common Colliery, Yorks, shutting off the face of the Colliery, Yorks, shutting on the face; coal. There were five men working at the face; four of them got out in time, but the fifth, owing to injuries, was unable to escape, and was imprisoned. The work of rescue was begun at once and, chiefly owing to the efforts of Thomas Thompson, a collier employed at the mine, who worked almost without cessation for ten hours in removing the débris, the man was extricated. The roof under which Thompson worked was in a very dangerous condition, and three falls of stone occurred while the work was in progress. There is no doubt that Thompson ran prolonged and serious risk to his own life in persevering till the rescue was effected.

His Majesty the KING has been graciously pleased to award the Edward Medal of the Second Class to Thomas Chatterton and Albert Schofield under the following circumstances:-

On the 28th of January last two men named James English and Alfred Sykes lost their lives from poisoning by noxious gases in some old workings at the Lodge Mill Colliery, Lepton, Huddersfield, which had been gas-bound for a fortnight. They had penetrated into the workings in order to continue the recovery of some rails; and, after about half an hour, Chatterton and Schofield, who were there to repair the road and load up the rails, became alarmed at their absence, and went in search

of them. They had to go on hands and knees in the dark, in a low road only three feet high, through a foul atmosphere. Chatterton succeeded in getting within call of Sykes, and Schofield succeeded in going a distance of 70 Failing yards before becoming unconscious. to reach Sykes, Chatterton managed with diffi-culty to make his way back, and to telephone for assistance, while Schofield remained unconscious in the workings till his subsequent There is no doubt that both men ran very serious risk to their own lives in attempting to rescue Sykes and English.
