WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Act of the third and fourth years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, chapter one hundred and thirteen, and of the Act of the seventeenth and eighteenth years of Her said late Majesty, chapter eighty-four, duly prepared and laid before His Majesty in Council a Scheme bearing date the eighth day of May, in the year one thousand nine hundred and thirteen, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

“We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of the Act of the third and fourth years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, chapter one hundred and thirteen, and of the Act of the seventeenth and eighteenth years of Her said late Majesty, chapter eighty-four, have prepared and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following Scheme for apportioning the income of the benefice (being a vicarage) of Saint Andrew, Great Grimsby, in the county

of Lincoln and in the diocese of Lincoln, between that benefice and a certain other benefice, namely, the benefice (being a consolidated chapelry) of Saint Luke, Grimsby, which said last-named benefice is situate in the said county of Lincoln and in the said diocese of Lincoln.

“Whereas the Bishop of the said diocese of Lincoln is the patron in right of his See of the said benefice of Saint Andrew, Great Grimsby, and also of the said benefice of Saint Luke, Grimsby.

“And whereas by the authority of an Order of Your Majesty in Council bearing date the thirteenth day of October, in the year one thousand nine hundred and ten, and published in the London Gazette on the twenty-first day of the same month, all the tithe rent charges, glebe lands, and all (if any) other the endowments then or thereafter belonging to the benefice of Algarkirk, in the said county of Lincoln and in the said diocese of Lincoln, were charged and for ever made chargeable as from the day of the date on which such Order was published in the London Gazette with a clear annual sum or yearly charge of eighty pounds in favour of the Incumbent of the said benefice of Saint Andrew, Great Grimsby, and his successors.

“And whereas we are of opinion that the said benefice of Saint Luke, Grimsby, is at

present insufficiently endowed, and that the said benefice of Saint Andrew, Great Grimsby, has endowments of such an amount as that after the apportionment hereinafter recommended and proposed shall have been carried out, the said benefice of Saint Andrew, Great Grimsby, will still be sufficiently endowed.

"And whereas the said benefice of Saint Andrew, Great Grimsby, is now full of a clerk, the Incumbent thereof being the Reverend Charles Henry Lenton, Clerk in Holy Orders.

"Now, therefore, with the consent of The Right Honourable and Most Reverend Randall Thomas, Archbishop of Canterbury, acting as Archbishop of the Province within which each of the said two benefices is situate, and with the consent of The Right Reverend Edward Lee, now Bishop of the said diocese of Lincoln, acting as such bishop and also as the patron in right of his See of each of the said two benefices as aforesaid (in testimony whereof they the said consenting parties have respectively signed this Scheme and sealed the same with their several episcopal seals), and also with the consent of the said Charles Henry Lenton, as the Incumbent of the said benefice of Saint Andrew, Great Grimsby (in testimony whereof he has signed and sealed this Scheme), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, humbly recommend and propose that as from the day of the date on which any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme shall have been published in the London Gazette and without any conveyance or assurance in the law other than this Scheme and any duly gazetted Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying the same, the said clear annual sum or yearly rent charge of eighty pounds now charged or chargeable as aforesaid on all the tithe rent charges, glebe lands and all (if any) other the endowments now or hereafter belonging to the said benefice of Algar-kirk in favour of the Incumbent of the said benefice of Saint Andrew, Great Grimsby, and his successors, shall cease to be payable to the Incumbent of the said benefice of Saint Andrew, Great Grimsby, and shall be transferred to and be for ever thereafter payable to the Incumbent of the said benefice of Saint Luke, Grimsby, and his successors in the same manner as is set forth and prescribed by the aforesaid Order of Your Majesty in Council bearing date the thirteenth day of October, in the year one thousand nine hundred and ten.

"And we further recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid or any of them in accordance with the provisions of the said Acts or of either of them or of any other Act of Parliament."

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said Scheme, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts. And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said diocese of Lincoln.

“And whereas by an Order in Council of His late Majesty, bearing date the 19th day of November, 1902, sanction was given to the establishment of a Royal Naval Auxiliary Sick Berth Reserve:

“And whereas we consider it desirable that a superior grade, to be known as ‘Reserve Wardmaster,’ should be instituted in the Reserve:

“We beg leave humbly to recommend that Your Majesty may be graciously pleased by Your Order in Council to sanction the establishment of this grade accordingly, under the regulations set forth in the annexed Schedule.

“The Lords Commissioners of Your Majesty's Treasury have signified their concurrence in this proposal.

“SCHEDULE.

“1. The rating of ‘Reserve Wardmaster’ to be equivalent to that of a Chief Sick Berth Steward.

“2. While under training Reserve Wardmasters to receive pay at the rate of 3s. 6d. a day, up to a maximum of seven days' training annually.

“3. When called out Reserve Wardmasters to receive pay at the rate of 4s. 6d. a day for the first six months and 5s. a day afterwards, with extra pay at the rate of 1s. a day when employed in a ship of war in war time.

“4. In other respects Reserve Wardmasters to be subject to the existing regulations for members of the Royal Naval Auxiliary Sick Berth Reserve.”

WHEREAS there was this day read at the Board a Memorial from the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the

Admiralty, dated the 10th day of June, 1913, in the words following, viz. :—

"Whereas by section 3 of the Naval and Marine Pay and Pensions Act, 1865, it is enacted, *inter alia*, that all pay, pensions, or other allowances in the nature thereof, payable in respect of services in Your Majesty's Naval or Marine Force to a person being or having been an officer, seaman, or marine therein, shall be paid in such manner and subject to such restrictions, conditions, and provisions as are from time to time directed by Order in Council:

"And whereas, under Article 1926A, clause 2, of the Regulations for the Government of Your Majesty's Naval Service, Non-Continuous Service Men of the Royal Navy who are transferred to continuous service are allowed to count time for pension from the age of 18 if they have completed 10 years on the continuous service system:

"And whereas we consider it desirable that provision should be made for such men, if transferred to the Royal Marines, to be similarly allowed to count towards pension time served in the Royal Navy prior to the age of 20:

"We beg leave humbly to recommend that Your Majesty may be graciously pleased by Your Order in Council to authorise us to allow men transferred from the Royal Navy to the Royal Marines to reckon former service in non-continuous service ratings towards pension to the extent and under the same conditions as would have applied if they had become continuous service ratings in the Royal Navy.

"The Lords Commissioners of Your Majesty's Treasury have signified their concurrence in this proposal."

ORDER OF THE BOARD OF AGRICULTURE AND FISHERIES.

(DATED 19TH JUNE 1913.)

KEIGHLEY ALLOTMENT GARDENS (SWINE-FEVER) ORDER OF 1913.

The Board of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in them under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1911, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:—

Premises to which this Order applies.

1.—(1.) This Order shall apply to the premises described in the schedule hereto, and also to any other premises in the borough of Keighley to which the Order may be applied by a Notice to that effect signed by an Inspector of the Board or of the Local Authority of the said borough and served upon the occupier of the premises described in such Notice.

(2.) This Order shall cease to apply to any premises upon service on the occupier thereof of a Notice to that effect signed by an Inspector of the Board.

(3.) A copy of every Notice served under this Article shall forthwith be sent to the Board by the Inspector signing the same.

Restrictions on Movement of Swine from or to Premises to which this Order applies.

2. Swine shall not, except as expressly authorised by this Order, be moved from or to any premises to which this Order applies.

Movement of Swine for Immediate Slaughter.

3.—(1.) Swine (not being in a Swine-Fever Infected Place and their movement not being prohibited by Notice of an Inspector of the Local Authority or of the Board given under any Order of the Board) may be moved from any premises to which this Order applies to a slaughter-house situate in the borough of Keighley for the purpose of immediate slaughter if accompanied by a licence in the Form D set forth in the First Schedule to the Swine-Fever (Regulation of Movement) Order of 1908 authorising such movement, granted by an Inspector of the Local Authority of the said borough, which licence shall be in force for not more than eight days inclusive of the day of issue.

(2.) Before a licence is granted by an Inspector under this Article the owner of the swine, or his agent authorised in writing for this purpose, shall sign, and deliver or send by post to the Inspector, a declaration in the Form E set forth in the First Schedule to the Swine-Fever (Regulation of Movement) Order of 1908, which shall be retained by the Inspector.

(3.) The swine shall, before the movement is commenced, be marked by and at the

expense of the owner by the painting with an indelible composition of red colour of a broad line down the back and another broad line across the loins of each of the swine thus +, each line being not less than nine inches long.

(4.) The swine moved under this article shall be moved by the nearest available route and without unnecessary delay, and shall, after their arrival at the slaughter-house, be there detained until they are slaughtered.

(5.) During the movement the swine shall not be permitted to come in contact with swine not marked in manner prescribed by this Article.

Cleansing and Disinfection of Vehicles used for Conveyance of Swine.

4.—(1.) Any float, cart or van which has been used for the conveyance of swine under the preceding Article shall immediately after each occasion of such use be cleansed and disinfected by and at the expense of the person using the same for such purpose as follows:

- (i.) The floor of the float, cart or van and all other parts thereof with which the swine, or their droppings, have come in contact shall be scraped and swept, and the scrapings and sweepings, and all dung, sawdust, litter, and other matter shall be effectually removed therefrom; then
- (ii.) The same parts of the float, cart or van shall be thoroughly washed or scrubbed or scoured with water; then
- (iii.) The same parts of the float, cart or van shall be disinfected in one of the modes prescribed by the Diseases of Animals (Disinfection) Order of 1906.

(2.) The scrapings and sweepings and the dung, sawdust, litter, and other matter removed under this Article shall forthwith be well mixed with quicklime, and be effectually removed from contact with swine.

Movement of Swine to Premises to which this Order applies.

5.—(1.) Swine may be moved to any premises to which this Order applies, if accompanied by a licence in the Form A set forth in the First Schedule to the Swine-Fever (Regulation of Movement) Order of 1908 authorising such movement, granted by an Inspector of the Local Authority of the borough of Keighley, under this Order or under the Swine-Fever (Regulation of Movement) Order of 1908, as the case may be. The licence shall be in force for not more than eight days inclusive of the day of issue.

(2.) Before a licence is granted by an Inspector under this Article the owner of the swine, or his agent authorised in writing for this purpose, shall sign, and deliver or send by post to the Inspector, a declaration in the Form B set forth in the First Schedule to the Swine-Fever (Regulation of Movement) Order of 1908, countersigned as hereinafter provided.

(3.) The declaration shall not be effective until it is countersigned by a police officer of the district where the swine are, who, before countersigning the declaration, shall, so far as is practicable, satisfy himself as to the correctness of the statements contained therein.

(4.) The declaration shall be retained by the Inspector granting the licence thereon.

(5.) The swine moved under this Article shall be moved by the nearest available route and without unnecessary delay.

(6.) Swine while detained on premises to which this Order applies need not be kept separate from other swine.

Production of Licences; Names and Addresses.

6.—(1.) Any person in charge of a pig being moved, where under this Order a licence is necessary, shall, on demand of a Justice, or of a constable, or of an Inspector or other officer of the Board or of a Local Authority, produce and show to him the licence, if any, necessary for the movement, and shall allow it to be read and a copy of or extract from it to be taken by the person to whom it is produced.

(2.) Any person so in charge shall, on demand as aforesaid, give his name and address to the Justice, or constable, or Inspector or other officer.

Licences after Completion of Movement.

7. A licence under this Order authorising movement of swine to any premises shall forthwith after completion of the movement be delivered up at, or sent by post to, the nearest Police Station in the same District by the person in charge of the swine at the time of completing the movement.

Local Authority to enforce Order.

8. The provisions of this Order shall be executed and enforced by the Local Authority.

Offences.

9.—(1.) If a pig is moved in contravention of this Order, the owner of the pig, and the person for the time being in charge thereof, and the person causing, directing, or permitting the movement, and the person moving or conveying the pig, and the consignee or other person receiving or keeping it, knowing it to have been moved in contravention as aforesaid, and the occupier of the place from which the pig is moved, shall, each according to and in respect of his own acts and defaults, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1894.

(2.) If a pig is not marked as required by this Order, the owner, consignee, or other person for the time being in charge thereof, shall, each according to and in respect of his own acts and defaults, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1894.

(3.) If any person, with a view unlawfully to evade or defeat the operation of this Order, by washing, or in any other manner, takes out, effaces, or obliterates, or attempts to take out, efface, or obliterate, any mark painted on any pig as required by this Order, the person doing the same, and the person causing, directing, or permitting the same to be done, and the owner of the pig, and the person for the time being in charge thereof, shall, each according to and in respect of his own acts and defaults, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1894.

(4.) If a person in charge of a pig being moved, where under this Order a licence is

necessary, on demand made under this Order, fails to give his true name and address, or gives a false name or address, he shall be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1894.

Interpretation.

10. In this Order—

“The Act of 1894” means the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894:

“The Board” means the Board of Agriculture and Fisheries:

“Swine-Fever Infected Place” means a place for the time being declared to be a Swine-Fever Infected Place under any Order of the Board:

“Slaughter-house” includes bacon-factory.

Other terms have the same meaning as in the Act of 1894.

Commencement.

11. This Order shall come into operation on the twenty-sixth day of June, nineteen hundred and thirteen.

Short Title.

12. This Order may be cited as the KEIGHLEY ALLOTMENT GARDENS (SWINE-FEVER) ORDER OF 1913.
