Navigation of the River Mersey," that I have received a notice from Lever Brothers, Limited, given pursuant to the provisions of the above-mentioned Act, of their intention to construct Dock Gates on Bromborough Pool, on the easterly side of New Chester Road Pool Bridge, and to fill in certain lands, &c., in accordance with plans and sections deposited at this office, a copy of which notice is subjoined.

In pursuance of an Act for better preserving the navigation of the River Mersey (5 and 6 Vic., cap. 110), we, Lever Brothers, Limited, Soap Manufacturers, of Port Sunlight, Cheshire, hereby give you notice that we propose to construct Dock Gates on Bromborough Pool, on the easterly side of New Chester Road Pool Bridge, and in place of certain lands opened up to the flow of the pool, to fill in part of the old bed in equal proportion, so that the work of filling will not exclude any tidal waters.

The Dock Gates when closed will hold, within the upper pool, waters of a 16-ft. or lower tide; but waters of higher tides will flow through the weir framework of the gates.

The gates will have an open clearance equal

to the width of the present bridge.

We are owners of both banks of the pool immediately affected.

It is estimated that the gates will enclose, on a 16-ft. tide, 92,000 cubic yards of water.

It is proposed that the gates shall be opened for admittance at every high tide, and shall be opened to allow all waters to pass out to low tide, at least two tides in the week, when and as directed by the Mersey Conservator.

The object of the work is to allow barges to manœuvre to the different loading bays during low tides; and the waters retained will be used for condensing purposes, as is the case with

the present dock.

It is proposed to commence this work shortly after the date of permission being granted.

SPECIAL REGULATIONS RESPECTING OPEN COM-PETITIVE EXAMINATIONS FOR THE SITUATION OF SECOND-CLASS CLERK IN THE DUBLIN METROPOLITAN POLICE COURTS.

N.B.—These Regulations are liable to alteration from time to time.

I. The limits of age for this situation are 17 and 25, and candidates must be of the prescribed age on the first day of the examination.

In reckoning age for competition the following allowances will be made, viz.:

i) Persons who have served in the Army or Navy may deduct from their actual age any time during which they have served;

- (ii) Persons who may be serving or who may have served in the Militia, the Imperial Yeomanry, the Honourable Artillery Company, or the Volunteers, may deduct from their actual age any time spent on actual military service, such time being reckoned by the number of days for which they received Army pay;
- (iii) Persons who have served for two full consecutive years-
 - (A) In any Civil situation to which they were admitted with the Certificate of the Civil Service Commissioners,

- (B) In the Royal Irish Constabulary, or (C) As Registered Boy Clerks in connection with the Civil Service (if appointed on the results of the competition of September 22nd, 1908, or any previous competition) may deduct from their actual age any time not exceeding five years which they may have spent in such service.

III. The examinations are open to all natural-born or naturalised British subjects being of the requisite age, health, and character, with the following restrictions:-

(i) The following persons are ineligible,

Members of the Royal Irish Constabulary of less than five years' service.

- (ii) The following classes of persons are eligible under certain conditions only, that is to say:
 - (a) Persons actually serving in the Army.
 - (b) Persons actually serving in the Navy.
 - (c) Persons holding situations in the Civil Service.
 - (d) Members of the Royal Irish Constabulary, of more than five years' service.
 - (e) Apprentices in His Majesty's Dockyards.

(f) Persons who have entered upon or completed a course of education or training for the occupation of teacher, on account of which grants are payable from the Ex-

No person actually serving in the Army will be eligible unless he produces to the Civil Service Commissioners, when called upon to do so, the permission of his Commanding Officer to attend the examination, dated before the commencement of the competition and given in accordance with such orders as may from time to time be issued by or under the authority of the Army Council.

No person actually serving in the Navy will be eligible unless he produces to the Civil Service Commissioners, called upon to do so, the permission of his Commanding Officer to attend the examination, dated before the commencement of the competition and given in accordance with such orders

ORDER OF THE BOARD OF AGRICULTURE AND FISHERIES.

(DATED 24TH JUNE 1913.)

PORTSMOUTH ALLOTMENTS (SWINE-FEVER) ORDER OF 1913.

The Board of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in them under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1911, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

Premises to which this Order applies.

- 1.—(1.) This Order shall apply to the premises described in the Schedule hereto, and also to any other premises in the county borough of Portsmouth to which this Order may be applied by a Notice to that effect signed by an Inspector of the Board or of the Local Authority of the said borough and served upon the occupier of the premises described in such Notice.
- (2.) This Order shall cease to apply to any premises upon service on the occupier thereof of a Notice to that effect signed by an Inspector of the Board.
- (3.) A copy of every Notice served under this Article shall forthwith be sent to the Board by the Inspector signing the same.

Restrictions on Movement of Swine from or to Premises to which this Order applies.

2. Swine shall not, except as expressly authorized by this Order, be moved from or to any premises to which this Order applies.

Movement of Swine for Immediate Slaughter.

3.—(1.) Swine (not being in a Swine-Fever Infected Place and their movement not being prohibited by Notice of an Inspector of the

Local Authority or of the Board given under any Order of the Board) may be moved from any premises to which this Order applies to a slaughter-house situate in the county borough of Portsmouth for the purpose of immediate slaughter if accompanied by a licence in the Form D set forth in the First Schedule to the Swine-Fever (Regulation of Movement) Order of 1908 authorizing such movement, granted by an Inspector of the Local Authority of the said borough, which licence shall be in force for not more than eight days, inclusive of the day of issue.

(2.) Before a licence is granted by an Inspector under this Article the owner of the swine, or his agent authorized in writing for this purpose, shall sign, and deliver or send by post to the Inspector a declaration in the Form E set forth in the First Schedule to the Swine-Fever (Regulation of Movement) Order of 1908, which shall be retained by the

Inspector.

(3.) The swine shall, before the movement is commenced, be marked by and at the expense of the owner by the painting with an indelible composition of red colour of a broad line down the back and another broad line across the loins of each of the swine, thus +, each line being not less than nine inches long.

(4.) The swine moved under this Article shall be moved by the nearest available route and without unnecessary delay, and shall, after their arrival at the slaughter-house, be there

detained until they are slaughtered.

(5.) During the movement the swine shall not be permitted to come in contact with swine not marked in manner prescribed by this Article.

Cleansing and Disinfection of Vehicles used for Conveyance of Swine.

- 4.—(1.) Any float, cart or van which has been used for the conveyance of swine under the preceding Article shall immediately after each occasion of such use be cleansed and disinfected by and at the expense of the person using the same for such purpose as follows:
 - (i.) The floor of the float, cart or van and all other parts thereof with which the swine, or their droppings, have come in contact shall be scraped and swept, and the scrapings and sweepings, and all dung, sawdust, litter, and other matter shall be effectually removed therefrom; then

(ii.) The same parts of the float, cart or van shall be thoroughly washed or scrubbed

or scoured with water; then

(iii.) The same parts of the float, cart or van shall be disinfected in one of the modes prescribed by the Diseases of Animals (Disinfection) Order of 1906.

(2.) The scrapings and sweepings, and the dung, sawdust, litter, and other matter removed under this Article shall forthwith be well mixed with quicklime, and be effectually removed from contact with swine.

Movement of Swine to Premises to which this Order applies.

5.—(1.) Swine may be moved to any premises to which this Order applies, if accompanied by a licence in the Form A set forth in the First Schedule to the Swine-Fever (Regulation of Movement) Order of 1908 authorizing such movement, granted by an

Inspector of the Local Authority of the county borough of Portsmouth, under this Order or under the Swine-Fever (Regulation of Movement) Order of 1908, as the case may be. licence shall be in force for not more than eight

days, inclusive of the day of issue.

(2.) Before a licence is granted by an Inspector under this Article the owner of the swine, or his agent authorized in writing for this purpose, shall sign, and deliver or send by post to the Inspector, a declaration in the Form B set forth in the First Schedule to the Swine-Fever (Regulation of Movement) Order of 1908, countersigned as hereinafter provided.

(3.) The declaration shall not be effective until it is countersigned by a police officer of the district where the swine are, who, before countersigning the declaration, shall, so far as is practicable, satisfy himself as to the correctness of the statements contained therein.

(4.) The declaration shall be retained by the Inspector granting the licence thereon.

(5.) The swine moved under this Article shall be moved by the nearest available route and without unnecessary delay.

(6.) Swine while detained on premises to which this Order applies need not be kept separate from other swine.

Production of Licences; Names and Addresses.

6.-(1.) Any person in charge of a pig being moved, where under this Order a licence is necessary, shall, on demand of a Justice, or of a constable, or of an Inspector or other officer of the Board or of a Local Authority, produce and show to him the licence, if any, necessary for the movement, and shall allow it to be read and a copy of or extract from it to be taken by the person to whom it is produced.

(2.) Any person so in charge shall, on demand as aforesaid, give his name and address to the Justice, or constable, or Inspector or

other officer.

Licences after Completion of Movement.

7. A licence under this Order authorizing movement of swine to any premises shall forth-with after completion of the movement be delivered up at, or sent by post to, the nearest Police Station in the same District by the person in charge of the swine at the time of completing the movement.

Local Authority to enforce Order.

8. The provisions of this Order shall be executed and enforced by the Local Authority.

Offences.

9.—(1.) If a pig is moved in contravention of this Order, the owner of the pig, and the person for the time being in charge thereof, and the person causing, directing, or permitting the movement, and the person moving or conveying the pig, and the consignee or other person receiving or keeping it, knowing it to have been moved in contravention as aforesaid, and the occupier of the place from which the pig is moved, shall, each according to and in respect of his own acts and defaults, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1894.

(2.) If a pig is not marked as required by this Order, the owner, consignee, or other person for the time being in charge thereof, shall, each according to and in respect of his own acts and defaults, be deemed guilty of an

offence against the Act of 1894.

- (3.) If any person, with a view unlawfully to evade or defeat the operation of this Order, by washing, or in any other manner, takes out, effaces, or obliterates, or attempts to take out, efface, or obliterate, any mark painted on any pig as required by this Order, the person doing the same, and the person causing, directing, or permitting the same to be done, and the owner of the pig, and the person for the time being in charge thereof, shall, each according to and in respect of his own acts and defaults, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of
- (4.) If a person in charge of a pig being moved, where under this Order a licence is necessary, on demand made under this Order, fails to give his true name and address, or gives a false name or address, he shall be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1894.

Interpretation.

10. In this Order-

The Act of 1894" means the Diseases of

Animals Act, 1894: The Board " means the Board of Agricul-

ture and Fisheries:

"Swine-Fever Infected Place" means a place for the time being declared to be a Swine-Fever Infected Place under any Order of the Board:

"Slaughter-house" includes bacon-factory. Other terms have the same meaning as in

the Act of 1894.

Commencement.

11. This Order shall come into operation on the twenty-eighth day of June, nineteen hundred and thirteen.
