tively the 12th October, 1877, the 20th December, 1909, and the 16th December, 1908, making certain sections of the Public Health Act, 1875, the Public Health Acts Amendment Act, 1907, and the Towns Improvement Clauses Act, 1847, applicable within the Parish of Fowey, and also the said Order made by the Secretary of State dated the 11th October, 1909, declaring Part VIII. of the Public Health Acts Amendment Act, 1907, to be in force in the Parish of Fowey shall (subject to the provisions of any Order which the Secretary of State may hereafter make) have effect as if the said sections of the said part of the said Acts were declared to be in force in the Borough.

SAVINGS FOR RATES.

14. Notwithstanding the incorporation of the Borough and the provisions of this Scheme all rates, assessments, compositions, charges, mortgages, contracts, leases, conveyances, deeds, documents, acts, matters and things made, entered into, or done before the commencement of this Scheme by to or with reference to the Parish Council or Rural District Council or their predecessors shall be as good, valid and effectual to all intents and purposes whatsoever for against and with reference to the Mayor, Aldermen and Burgesses as if the same had been made, entered into or done by to or with reference to the Mayor, Aldermen and Burgesses instead of the Parish Council or Rural District Council or their predecessors, and may be proceeded on and enforced in the same manner in all respects as if the Mayor, Aldermen and Burgesses instead of such Parish Council or Rural District Council respectively, or their predecessors had been party or privy to the same and had been named or referred to therein.

COMPENSATION FOR EXISTING OFFICERS.

15. In case any officer of the Parish Council of Fowey, the Rural District Council of St. Austell, or any other Local Authority for whom the Mayor, Aldermen and Burgesses of the Borough of Fowey (in this clause referred to as "the Corporation"), or the Council of the said Borough are respectively substituted who shall have been employed by the said Parish Council or Rural District Council or by any such Local Authority as the case may be, shall not be employed by the Council of the said Borough nor offered by the said Council a position in their employ of a similar character and of an equal value to that formerly held by him, he shall be entitled to be paid by way of compensation for the loss of his position out of the funds of or under the control of the Corporation, and the amount to be paid in each case shall be determined in accordance with the provisions of section 120 of the Local Government Act, 1888, and sub-sections (1) to (7) inclusive of that section shall apply as if they formed part of this Scheme with the substitution of the words "Borough Council" for "County Council" and "this Scheme" for "this Act," and with such other modifications as are necessary to make them applicable hereto; Provided nevertheless that if any such officer be so employed by the said Corporation and discharged by them (otherwise than for misconduct) within four years of the commencement of this Scheme, he shall be entitled to compensation in the same manner as if he had not been employed by the said Corporation; Provided that the term "officer" shall include only persons employed by the said Parish Council or Rural District Council or by any other Local Authority whose salaries or emoluments are payable at intervals of not less than one month, and no other persons.

less than one month, and no other persons.

16. The accounts of the Parish Council of Fowey and of the officers and committees (if any) of such Parish Council shall be made up to the date of the commencement of this Scheme, and shall be audited by the District Auditor in like manner and with the like incidences and consequences as if this Scheme had not been made and the enactments relating to the accounts of Parish Councils and to the audit of such accounts and to all matters incidental thereto and consequential thereon and the Rules made by the Local Government Board thereunder shall apply to such audit, and for the purposes of such audit the Parish Council shall be deemed to exist and their officers (if any) to remain in office as if this Scheme had not been made:

Provided that such audit may be held as soon as practicable after this Scheme comes into operation, and that any money certified by the District Auditor at the audit to be due from any person shall be paid by such person to the Treasurer of the Borough.
