His Majesty's Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs has received from the Greek Government a notification to the following effect:—

An effective blockade is declared to have been established, from six p.m. on the 4th instant, between Ænos and the mouth of the River Struma, at a distance of five miles from the coast, neutral vessels being allowed a period of twenty-four hours within which to leave the blockaded area.

Neutral vessels proceeding to Bulgarian ports in the Black Sea will be visited and searched for contraband of war. The items comprised in Articles 22 and 24 of the Declaration of London are deemed to be contraband, the commodities comprised under Nos. 8 and 9 of the latter Article being declared absolute contraband.

## NATIONAL HEALTH INSURANCE.

The National Health Insurance (Transfer of Deposit Contributors) Order, 1913 (No. 2).

dated July 2, 1913, made by the Insurance Commissioners under Section 78 of the National Insurance Act, 1911 (1 & 2 Geo. V, c. 55).

Whereas by Section 78 of the National Insurance Act, 1911 (in this Order called "the Act"), it is amongst other things provided that if any difficulty arises in bringing Part I. of the Act into operation, the Insurance Commissioners, with the consent of the Treasury, may by Order make any appointment and do anything which appears by them necessary or expedient for bringing Part I. of the Act into operation, and any such Order may modify the provisions of the Act so far as may appear necessary or expedient for carrying the Order into effect:

And whereas by Section 42 of the Act, and by the Regulations made thereunder, it is amongst other things provided that insured persons who have not joined an approved society within the time prescribed, shall become deposit contributors within the meaning of that Section, and by Section 43 of the Act, provision is made for the transfer of deposit contributors to approved societies and for the necessary consequential adjustments between the Post Office Fund and the funds of the approved societies:

And whereas in many cases persons have under the provisions of the Act and the said Regulations become deposit contributors, but have, by reason of the fact that contributions payable by or in respect of them have not been paid, or for other reasons, failed to take such steps as were necessary for the purpose of enabling accounts to be opened in their name in the Post Office Fund:

And whereas many of such persons have since become members of approved societies for the purposes of Part I. of the Act, and delay has arisen and will arise in ascertaining the position in insurance of such persons and in the administration of their benefits by their approved societies by reason of the fact that it is necessary that contributions, or arrears of contributions, payable by or in respect of them before the time of their joining an approved society, should be paid into the Post Office Fund, and the necessary transfers and adjustments should be subsequently made between the Post Office Fund and the approved society, and doubts have arisen, in the case of approved societies, whether they are in order in administering the benefits of such persons until the proper amount, if any, has been transferred to the societies from the Post Office Fund and the adjustments aforesaid have been made, and a difficulty has thereby arisen within the meaning of the said Section 78:

Now, therefore, the Insurance Commissioners, in pursuance of the powers conferred on them by the said Section and of all other powers enabling them in that behalf, with the consent of the Treasury, hereby order as follows:—

1. Where no account has been opened in the Post Office Fund in the name of any person who, by reason of any provisions of the Act or of any Regulations made thereunder, has become or is deemed to have become a deposit contributor, that person may, if he joins an

approved society for the purposes of Part I. of the Act before the 15th day of July, 1913, notwithstanding anything contained in the Act or the Regulations made thereunder, be treated in all respects and for all purposes as a member of the society as from the date on which, under any provisions of the Act or of the said Regulations, he would, but for this Order, have become or be deemed to have become a deposit contributor.

2. This Order may be cited as the National Health Insurance (Transfer of Deposit Contributors) Order, 1913 (No. 2).

## NOTES.

## NATIONAL INSURANCE.

## NATIONAL HEALTH INSURANCE.

The National Health Insurance (Representation of Insured Persons) (Wales) Order, 1913, dated 4th July, 1913, made by the Welsh Insurance Commissioners under Sections 78 and 82 of the National Insurance Act, 1911 (1 & 2 Geo. V, c. 55), with reference to the method of appointing and electing persons to represent insured persons on Insurance Committees.

Whereas by Section 78 read with Section 82 of the National Insurance Act, 1911 (in this Order called "the Act"), it is amongst other things provided that if any difficulty arises with respect to the constitution of Insurance Committees, the Welsh Insurance Commissioners (in this Order called "the Commissioners"),

with the consent of the Treasury, may by Order make any appointment and do anything which appears to them necessary or expedient for the establishment of those Committees, and that any such Order may modify the provisions of the Act so far as may appear necessary or expedient for carrying the Order into effect:

And whereas it is provided by paragraph (a) of sub-section (2) of Section 59 read with Section 82 of the Act that three-fifths of the members of an Insurance Committee shall be appointed in such manner as may be prescribed by Regulations of the Commissioners so as to secure representation of the insured persons resident in the county or county borough who are members of Approved Societies, and who are deposit contributors, in proportion, as nearly as may be, to their respective numbers, and by the proviso (i) to that sub-section that the said Regulations shall provide for conferring upon the Approved Societies



which have members resident in the county or county borough, the power of appointing the representatives of such members:

And whereas the Commissioners, in pursuance of the provisions aforesaid, have made certain Regulations, entitled "The National Health Insurance (Insurance Committees: Representation of Insured Persons) Regulations (Wales), 1913," providing for the method of appointment by election or otherwise of persons to represent insured persons on Insurance Committees:

And whereas by virtue of the said Regulations an Approved Society which is entitled under the said Regulations, and desires to appoint representatives, is required to inform the Commissioners in the manner and within the limit of time therein mentioned of the name and address of any person so appointed, and an Approved Society which is entitled under the said Regulations, and desires to take part in an election of representatives, is required to despatch by post to the Office of the Commissioners within the respective limits of time therein mentioned a nomination paper and a voting paper in the forms respectively prescribed in the said Regulations:

And whereas it is apprehended that in the case of certain Approved Societies the Committee of Management or other governing body of the Society is not empowered under the Rules of the Society to make such appointments or nominations, or to cast such vote as aforesaid on behalf of the Society, and it is apprehended that it may not be practicable for the members of the Society to make such appointments or nominations or to cast such vote as aforesaid in accordance with the Rules of the Society (whether in General Meeting or otherwise) within the respective limits of time prescribed by the said Regulations:

And whereas for the purpose of duly constituting Insurance Committees it is necessary that the appointments and nominations should have been made, and the votes cast within those respective limits of time:

And whereas difficulties have arisen as to the determination of the principal place of residence of persons nominated or appointed as representatives of insured persons on Insurance Committees:

And whereas sundry difficulties have arisen within the meaning of the said Section 78 with respect to the constitution of Insurance Committees:

Now, therefore, the Commissioners, in pursuance of the powers conferred on them by Sections 78 and 82 of the Act, and all other powers enabling them in that behalf, with the consent of the Treasury, hereby order as follows:—

1. This Order may be cited as the National Health Insurance (Representation of Insured Persons) (Wales) Order, 1913.

2. For the purposes of the first appointments or elections of representatives of insured persons under the said Regulations, the following provisions shall have effect:—

(1.) Notwithstanding that the Rules of an Approved Society do not authorize the Com-

mittee of Management or other governing body of the Society to exercise on behalf of the Society the power of making an appointment or nomination of candidates for election as representatives of the Society, or of casting a vote under the said recited Regulations, any such appointment or nomination, if made, and any such vote if cast, by the Committee of Management or other governing body of the Society within the respective limits of time prescribed by the said Regulations shall be valid and binding upon the members of the Society in the same manner, and shall for the purposes of the appointment or election have effect in all respects as if it had been made or cast in accordance with the Rules, and as a valid and proper exercise of the powers of the Society.

(2.) Any form purporting to have been duly signed by or on behalf of an Approved Society pursuant to the said Regulations, and which shall within the meaning of the said Regulations have been dispatched so as to be delivered at the office of the Commissioners within the time prescribed by and pursuant to the provisions of the said Regulations, shall be deemed to have been so duly signed by or on behalf of such Society, and shall have effect accordingly unless and until the Commissioners in their discretion shall otherwise decide.

(3.) Any person who would have been duly appointed or elected as a representative of insured persons under the said Regulations on an Insurance Committee, if he had had his principal place of residence within the county or county borough within the meaning of Regulation 19 of the said Regulations, shall be deemed for the purposes of the said Regulations to have and have had at all times material for the purposes of the said Regulations his principal place of residence within the county or county borough as aforesaid, unless the returning officer or other person acting in his place under the said Regulations, or unless and until the Commissioners shall otherwise have decided.

(4.) Any person declared to have been appointed or elected under the said Regulations, shall be deemed to have been duly appointed or elected if the provisions of the said Regulations shall, in the opinion of the returning officer or other person appointed to act in his place in pursuance of the said Regulations or of the Commissioners (if the matter shall have been reported to them for their decision), have been substantially complied with as affecting such appointment or election, unless and until the Commissioners in their discretion shall otherwise have decided.

A Notice of Dissolution of Partnership not signed by all the Partners, or their legal representatives, must be accompanied by a Statutory Declaration made by a Solicitor of the Supreme Court to the effect that such notice is given in pursuance of the terms of the partnership to which it relates.

Advertisements purporting to be issued in pursuance of Statutes or under Orders of Court will not be inserted unless signed or attested by a Solicitor of the Supreme Court.
