BRISTOL CORPORATION.

To The King's Most Excellent Majesty.

The Humble Address of The Lord Mayor, Aldermen and Burgesses of the City of Bristol.

May it please Your Majesty.

We, Your Majesty's dutiful subjects, the Lord Mayor, Aldermen and Burgesses of the City of Bristol, crave leave to offer a most hearty and loyal welcome to our ancient City on the occasion of Your Majesty's visit to the Show of the Royal Agricultural Society of England, which after a lapse of 35 years is again being held in our City.

The ever-widening scope of the aims and objects of the Society is strikingly emphasised in the present Show by the introduction, at the instance of the Bristol Committee, of a section which illustrates the products of Your Majesty's Overseas Dominions, and the comparison which, for the first time in the history of the Society, can now be made between the products of the Home Country and the Colonies

must of a necessity be fraught with advantage to the future of Agriculture throughout Your Majesty's world-wide Dominions, whilst the attendance of great numbers of visitors from across the seas will, we trust, go far to strengthen the ties of friendship which already exist between the various peoples of Your Majesty's vast Empire.

WILD BIRD (ENGLAND).

The Wild Birds Protection (Administrative County of the Isle of Wight) Order, 1913.

Dated 8th July, 1913.

In pursuance of the powers conferred on me by the Wild Birds Protection Acts, 1880 to 1908, and upon application by the Council of

the Administrative County of the Isle of Wight, I hereby make the following Order:—

Title.

I. This Order may be cited as the Wild Birds Protection (Administrative County of the Isle of Wight) Order, 1913.

BIRDS.

Close Time Extended.

II. The time during which the killing or taking of Wild Birds is prohibited by the Wild Birds Protection Act, 1880, shall be extended, so far as concerns the Administrative County of the Isle of Wight, so as to be between the last day of February and the first day of September in any year.

Additions to the Schedule of the Act of 1880.

III. The Wild Birds Protection Act, 1880, shall apply within the Administrative County of the Isle of Wight to the following species of Wild Birds in the same manner as if those species were included in the Schedule to the Act:—

Curlew, Bunting, Common Bunting, Reed Bunting, Chiffchaff, Peregrine Falcon, Spotted Flycatcher, Heron, Kestrel, House Martin, Sand Martin, Raven, Red-backed Shrike, Swallow, Wild Swan, Swift, Missel Thrush, Wagtail (all species), Blackcap Warbler, Garden Warbler, Grasshopper Warbler, Sedge Warbler, Wood Warbler, Wheatear, Whinchat, Golden-crested Wren, Wryneck (Cuckoo's Mate or Snakebird).

The Cormorant deprived of Protection.

IV. The Administrative County of the Isle of Wight is hereby exempted from the operation of the Wild Birds Protection Act, 1880, so far as the Cormorant is concerned.

Certain Birds protected during the whole of the Year.

V. During that period of the year to which the protection afforded by the Wild Birds Protection Act, 1880 (as extended by Clause II. of this Order), does not apply, it shall be unlawful throughout the Administrative County of the Isle of Wight to kill or take any of the Wild Birds mentioned in the schedule of that Act, or added thereto by the Wild Birds Protection Act, 1881, or by Clause III of this Order, except only the Eider Duck, Gannet, Lapwing (Peewit or Green Plover), Mallard or Solan Goose (Wild Duck), Plover, Snipe, Sandpiper or Summer Snipe, Teal, Widgeon, and Woodcock.

All Birds protected on Sundays in Certain Areas.

VI. During that period of the year to which the protection afforded by the Wild Birds Protection Act, 1880, as extended by Clause II of

this Order, does not apply, the killing or taking of Wild Birds on Sundays is prohibited in that part of the Administrative County of the Isle of Wight which lies within the district of the Rural District Council, and outside the several Urban Districts in the said Isle.

EGGS.

Certain Eggs protected throughout the County.

VII. The taking or destroying of the eggs of the following species of Wild Birds is prohibited within the Administrative County of the Isle of Wight:—

Peregrine Falcon, Kestrel, Kingfisher, Nightjar (Fern Owl, Goat Sucker, Night Hawk), Owl, Raven, Wild Swan.

All Eggs protected within Certain Areas.

VIII. The taking or destroying of the Eggs of any species of Wild Bird is prohibited within the following areas for a period of five years from the date of this Order:—

The Red Cliff and Culver Cliffs, between the west side of the Red Cliff Fort on the west and the point of the Culvers forming the western boundary of Whitecliff Bay on the east, from the sea level to the Government boundary; the whole of the cliffs in the parishes of Freshwater and Totland from the westernmost point of Cave Bay, thence round the coast to Sconce Point, and a hundred yards inland from the top of such cliffs.

Repeal of former Order.

IX. The Order of the 6th April, 1909, is hereby repealed.

And to command that the said order and declaration be registered in His Majesty's College of Arms.

TRADE BOARDS ACT, 1909.

Order of the Board of Trade under Section 5 (2).

Whereas by Section 4 of the Trade Boards Act, 1909, it is, amongst other things, provided as follows:—

(1) Trade Boards shall, subject to the provisions of this section, fix minimum rates of wages for timework for their trades (in this Act referred to as minimum time-rates), and may also fix general minimum rates of wages for piecework for their trades (in this Act referred to as general minimum piece-rates), and those rates of wages (whether time or piece-rates) may be fixed so as to apply universally to the trade, or so as to apply to any special process in the work of the trade or to any special class of workers in the trade, or to any special area.

If a Trade Board report to the Board of Trade that it is impracticable in any case to fix a minimum time-rate in accordance with this section, the Board of Trade may, so far as respects that case, relieve the Trade Board of their duty.

(2) Before fixing any minimum time-rate or general minimum piece-rate, the Trade Board shall give notice of the rate which they

propose to fix, and consider any objections to the rate which may be lodged with them within three months.

(3) The Trade Board shall give notice of any minimum time-rate or general minimum piece-rate fixed by them;

And whereas by Section 5 of the said Act it is amongst other things provided—

(1) Until a minimum time-rate or general minimum piece-rate fixed by a Trade Board has been made obligatory by order of the Board of Trade under this section, the operation of the rate shall be limited as in this Act provided.

(2) Upon the expiration of six months from the date on which a Trade Board have given notice of any minimum time-rate or general minimum piece-rate fixed by them, the Board of Trade shall make an order (in this Act referred to as an obligatory order) making that minimum rate obligatory in cases in which it is applicable on all persons employing labour and on all persons employed, unless they are of opinion that the circumstances are such as to make it premature or otherwise undesirable to make an obligatory order, and in that case they shall make an order suspending the obligatory operation of the rate (in this Act referred to as an order of suspension);

And whereas a Trade Board was established by the Board of Trade under the said Act on 29th July, 1910, for the making of boxes or parts thereof made wholly or partially of paper, cardboard, chip or similar material in Great Britain, and was constituted in accordance with the Regulations made by the Board of Trade under the said Act, and dated 27th April, 1910;

And whereas the said Trade Board gave notice, on 3rd May, 1912, that they proposed to fix minimum time-rates of wages for male workers in the said trade;

And whereas, after considering the objections lodged with them within three months from 3rd May, 1912, the said Trade Board gave notice on 6th January, 1913, that they had fixed minimum time-rates of wages for male workers in the said trade, and the rates fixed are set out in the Schedule hereto;

And whereas the said rates have been in limited operation since the 6th day of January, 1913;

Now, therefore, the Board of Trade, in pursuance of the powers in them vested as before recited, do by this order make the said minimum time-rates fixed by the said Trade Board, and set out in the said Schedule hereto, obligatory in cases in which they are applicable on all persons employing labour, and on all persons employed in the said trade.

SCHEDULE.

MINIMUM TIME-RATES FOR MALE WORKERS.

Section A.—The minimum (or lowest) time-

rate for male workers in the trade of making boxes or parts thereof made wholly or partially of paper, cardboard, chip, or similar material, shall (subject to the provisions of this notice as to learners) be as follows, clear of all deductions, that is to say:—6d. an hour.

LEARNERS.

Section B. (1) In lieu of the above rate male "learners" shall receive the following minimum or lowest time-rates clear of all deductions, that is to say:—

When employed under 15 years of age, 4s. 6d. a week.

When employed at 15 and under 16 years of age, 6s. a week.

When employed at 16 and under 17 years of age, 8s. a week.

When employed at 17 and under 18 years of age, 11s. a week.

When employed at 18 and under 19 years of age, 14s. a week.

When employed at 19 and under 20 years of age, 17s. 6d. a week.

When employed at 20 and under 21 years of age, 21s. a week.

(2) The learners' rates are weekly rates based on a week of 52 hours, but they shall be subject to a proportionate deduction or increase according as the number of hours actually spent by the learner in the factory or workshop in any week is less or more than 52.

(3) A male learner is a worker under 21 years of age who, while employed, is engaged during the whole or a substantial part of his time in learning some branch or process of the trade.
