Address presented by the Lancashire County Council on the 7th July, on Their Majesties' arrival at Knowsley:—

To His Most Excellent Majesty King George V.

May it please Your Majesty.

MERSEY DOCKS AND HARBOUR BOARD.

To Their Most Excellent Majesties King George V and Queen Mary.

May it please Your Majesties.

We, the members of the Mersey Docks and Harbour Board, humbly desire to express our grateful sense of the great honour conferred upon us by Your visit to the Dock Estate to open the Gladstone Dock, and we assure Your Majesties of our deep loyalty and affection.

This auspicious visit is the first which circumstances have permitted Your Majesties to make to this City since your Accession, but we recall with pleasure visits made by Your revered Father, both as Sovereign and as Prince of Wales. It will be recollected that, in 1881, accompanied by your august Mother, then Princess of Wales, he opened a system of docks to which the Princess gave her own name Alexandra. We also remember that your Grandfather His Royal Highness The Prince Consort opened the Albert Dock and Warehouses in 1846, and that five years later Your Grandmother, the great Queen Victoria, was the first British Sovereign to visit this Port and Dock Estate.

Many developments of the Estate have been made since the completion of the Alexandra system, and the Board have again found it necessary to construct new docks to meet the demand for increased accommodation for ships of the largest size. In addition to the Gladstone Dock, which Your Majesties have graciously consented to open to-day, the Board are constructing on the land adjoining docks capable of accommodating vessels of 1,100 feet in length.

We rejoice in this opportunity of acknowledging the great interest which Your Majesties have always shown in every matter which concerns the welfare of Your people. This interest is again displayed in the visit which Your Majesties have made, and are making, among Your subjects in Lancashire during this

To His Most Excellent Majesty the King.

The Loyal and Dutiful Address of the High Commissioner for the Commonwealth of Australia in London.

On behalf of Your Majesty's Australian Government, I beg leave to tender most grateful thanks to Your Majesty for your gracious consent to lay the Foundation Stone of the new Offices of the Commonwealth in London.

I also beg leave to be permitted to ask Her Majesty the Queen to accept the grateful thanks of the Australian Government for graciously consenting to accompany Your Majesty.

I hope and believe that this edifice, when completed, will prove worthy of the kindness of Your Majesty, worthy of Australia and of this Imperial city. A spacious exhibition of the resources of Australia will be one of the chief features of this Commonwealth Building.

That display will be a perpetual reminder of the noble opportunities which our Continent presents for vigorous development and successful enterprise.

The people of Australia remember with

great satisfaction that Your Majesty and Her Majesty the Queen have a close personal knowledge of them and of their country. Indeed, the same may be said of all the large divisions of the vast Empire over which the auspicious reign of Your Royal and Imperial Majesty extends.

The difficulties and dangers of navigation which used to make Australia seem to be at such an immense distance from Great Britain have disappeared. Emigration has ceased to be exile. Secure and prosperous conditions of life have been established over immense areas of our virgin continent. The flag planted by Captain Cook less than a hundred and fifty years ago on our then unknown coasts has become the emblem of a sway over the Southern Seas almost universal:

I feel I need not remind Your Majesty that this new building will proclaim something more than the industrial growth of Australia. It will also testify to the increasing intimacy and harmony of the political relationship between the Mother and the Daughter lands. Some ties have gone, but the ties that really do unite Britain and the Dominions beyond the seas—mutual betterment—pride of race—grandeur of tradition—glory of achievement—loyalty to the Throne—a resolve to stand shoulder to shoulder when our King calls—all these remain and they are strengthened by the flight of time.

To which Address His Majesty was pleased to return the following gracious Answer:—

It gives Me much pleasure, and not less pleasure to the Queen; who accompanies Me, to be present on this interesting occasion for the purpose of laying the foundation stone of the new Offices of the Commonwealth Government in London.

I congratulate the Commonwealth on the acquisition of this splendid site and on the noble structure which it is proposed to erect upon it. When completed it will take its place as a worthy and welcome addition to the buildings which adorn the centre of the Empire, and it will not only serve those useful purposes for which it is designed, but will also call to the mind of all who pass by the immense opportunities and limitless resources of the great continent under the Southern Cross. I cherish the most happy recollections of My two visits to Australia in 1881 and 1901, and of the warmth of the reception accorded to Me in all the States on both occasions. My second visit remains to both of Us an inspiring memory, when I was deputed by My dear Father to inaugurate the first Parliament of the Commonwealth.

Nothing can gratify Me more than the testimony which you bear to the growing sense of kinship and unity which pervades the self-governing communities of the Empire, and to those indissoluble ties which knit them to one another and to My Throne.

I am well assured that, as in the past, in any national emergency Australia will be ready to play her part for the common cause, and that the loyalty of her sons will never be appealed to in vain.

PORTSMOUTH ALLOTMENTS (SWINE-FEVER) ORDER OF 1913. (No. 2.)

The Board of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in them under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1911, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

- 1. Article 3 of the Portsmouth Allotments (Swine-Fever) Order of 1913 is hereby revoked and the following provisions substituted therefor:—
- "Movement of Swine from Premises to which this Order applies.
 - 3.—(1.) Swine (not being in a Swine-Fever Infected Place and their movement not being prohibited by Notice of an Inspector of the Local Authority or of the Board given under any Order of the Board) may be moved from any premises to which this Order applies under and in accordance with the following provisions.
 - (2.) Swine may be moved to any slaughter-house for the purpose of immediate slaughter if accompanied by a licence in the Form D set forth in the First Schedule to the Swine-Fever (Regulation of Movement) Order of 1908 authorising such movement, granted by an Inspector of the Local Authority of the county borough of Portsmouth.
 - (3.) Before a licence (Form D) is granted by an Inspector under this Article the owner of the swine, or his agent authorised in writing for this purpose, shall sign, and deliver or send by post to the Inspector a declaration in the Form E set forth in the First Schedule to the Swine-Fever (Regulation of Movement) Order of 1908, which shall be retained by the Inspector.
 - (4.) The swine shall, before the movement is commenced, be marked by and at the expense of the owner by the painting with an indelible composition of red colour of a broad line down the back and another broad line across the loins of each of the swine thus +, each line being not less than nine inches long.
 - (5.) Swine may also be moved from any premises to which this Order applies to any other premises, not being situate in a Scheduled Area to which the Swine-Fever (Special Areas) Order of 1911 applies, if accompanied by a licence in the Form A set forth in the First Schedule to the Swine-

Fever (Regulation of Movement) Order of 1908 authorising such movement, granted by an Inspector of the Local Authority of the District in which the place of destination specified in the licence is situate, but no such licence shall be expressed to be granted for movement for breeding purposes.

- (6.) Before a licence (Form A) is granted by an Inspector under this Article, the owner of the swine, or his agent authorised in writing for this purpose, shall sign and deliver or send by post to the Inspector, a declaration in the Form B set forth in the First Schedule to the Swine-Fever (Regulation of Movement) Order of 1908, countersigned as hereinafter provided.
- (7.) The declaration (Form B) shall not be effective until it is countersigned by an Inspector of the Local Authority of the county borough of Portsmouth, who, before countersigning the declaration, shall, so far as is practicable, satisfy himself as to the correctness of the statements contained therein.
- (8.) The declaration (Form B) shall be retained by the Inspector granting the licence thereon.
- (9.) Swine moved with a licence (Form A) under this Article shall not, for a period of twenty-eight days after arrival at the place of destination specified in the licence, be moved from such place of destination, except as hereinafter provided.
- (10.) Where swine are moved with a licence (Form A) to a market, fairground or saleyard, specified in the licence, the swine shall be moved from such premises only if accompanied by a licence in the Form C set forth in the First Schedule to the Swine-Fever (Regulation of Movement) Order of 1908, authorising such movement granted by an Inspector of the Local Authority of the District in which the market, fairground or saleyard is situate and only to a slaughter-house specified in the licence, or to the premises from which the swine were moved to the market, fairground or saleyard.
- (11.) Swine required by this Article to be detained for a period of twenty-eight days may be moved before the expiration of that period to a slaughterhouse in the same Scheduled Area if such movement is authorised by a licence in the Form C above mentioned granted by an Inspector of the

Local Authority of the District in which the swine are detained, and the swine are accompanied by the licence.

- (12.) Swine while detained under this Article shall be kept separate from all other swine.
- (13.) Swine moved under this Article shall be moved by the nearest available route and without unnecessary delay, and where they are moved to a slaughterhouse they shall be there detained until they are slaughtered.
- (14.) Licences granted under this Article shall be in force for not more than eight days inclusive of the day of issue.
- (15.) No licence under the Swine-Fever (Regulation of Movement) Order of 1908 shall be required for the movement into a Scheduled Area for the purposes of that Order of swine which are being moved under and in accordance with a licence granted under this Article."

Commencement.

2. This Order shall come into operation on the fourth day of August, nineteen hundred and thirteen.

Short Title, &c.

3. This Order may be cited as the Portsmouth Allotments (Swine-Fever) Order of 1913 (No. 2), and shall be read as one with the Portsmouth Allotments (Swine-Fever) Order of 1913.
