The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council. THEREAS by the Children Act, 1908, it VV was, amongst other things, enacted that His Majesty may by Order in Council under the Metropolitan Police Acts, 1839 and 1840, provide for the establishment of one or more separate Juvenile Courts for the Metropolitan Police Court District and for assigning as a division to each such Court such portion of that district as may be specified in the

And whereas by the Metropolitan Police Acts, 1839 and 1840, it was, amongst other things, enacted that it shall be lawful for Her Majesty, with the advice of Her Privy Council, to alter the number of Magistrates appointed to any of the Police Courts, and to order that a Police Magistrate or Magistrates shall attend regularly at any Police Court or Courts hereafter to be established, either daily or on such days or times as Her Majesty

by the advice aforesaid, shall order;

And whereas by divers Orders in Council made under the said Acts such Police Court Divisions as to His Majesty from time to time has seemed fit have been constituted within the Metropolitan Police District and the extent thereof defined respectively, and such divisions have been assigned to each of the Police Courts continued or established under the said Acts;

His Majesty is pleased, therefore, with the advice of His Privy Council, to order and it is hereby ordered accordingly that Juvenile Courts shall be established at each of the now existing Metropolitan Police Courts mentioned in the first column of the Schedule following;

that divisions shall be assigned to them as described in the second column of the said Schedule; that the said Juvenile Courts shall be held on the days and at the hours specified in the third column of the said Schedule or on such other days and at such other hours as may from time to time be approved by a Secretary of State; and that one of the Magistrates appointed for the Metropolitan Police Courts shall attend the said Juvenile Courts on the said days at the said hours: Provided that a Juvenile Court which would in pursuance of the foregoing provision have been held on Christmas Day, Good Friday, or a day appointed for a public fast or thanksgiving, may be held on the preceding day, or if the preceding day is a Sunday, on the day following.

And His Majesty is further pleased, with the advice aforesaid, to order, and it is hereby ordered accordingly, that at the Juvenile Court held at Bow Street on Monday in each week the Magistrate shall have jurisdiction to hear applications for licences for the employment of children under section three of the Prevention of Cruelty to Children Act, 1904, arising in the divisions of the Metropolitan Police Court District other than that assigned to the Bow Street Juvenile Court, if such applications cannot conveniently be made at the Juvenile Court for the division in which they arise.

And His Majesty is further pleased, with the advice aforesaid, to order, and it is hereby ordered accordingly, that Juvenile Courts shall not be held in the Court room in which the ordinary sittings of the Police Court are held, but in the second Court room (if any), or in some other room suitable for the purpose in the Police Court building, except that at Westminster Police Court the Juvenile Court may be held in the Court room in which the ordinary sittings of the Police Court are held, provided that—

hat—

(a) the Juvenile Court shall not sit till at least one-half hour after the morning sitting

of the Police Court has concluded;

(b) the afternoon sitting of the Police Court shall not begin, nor shall any persons other than those concerned in the cases in the Juvenile Court be admitted to the Court room or waiting rooms, until the sitting of the Juvenile Court is concluded and all children or young persons have left the Court

room.

The Orders made on the 2nd day of December, 1909, on the 5th day of March, 1910, and on the 29th day of February, 1912, relating to Juvenile Courts in the Metropolitan Police District, are hereby revoked.

WILD BIRD (ENGLAND).

The Wild Birds Protection (Administrative County of Glamorgan) Order, 1913.

Dated 18th August, 1913.

In pursuance of the powers conferred on me by the Wild Birds Protection Acts, 1880 to 1908, and upon application by the Council of the Administrative County of Glamorgan, I hereby make the following Order:—

Title.

I. This Order may be cited as "The Wild Birds Protection (Administrative County of Glamorgan) Order, 1913."

BIRDS.

Close Time for Wild Duck and Woodcock varied.

II. The period during which the killing or taking of Wild Birds is prohibited by the Wild Birds Protection Act, 1880, shall be varied throughout the Administrative County of Glamorgan so far as concerns Wild Duck and Woodcock, so as to be for Wild Duck between the 1st day of February and the 1st day of July in any year, and for Woodcock between the last day of January and the 1st day of August in any year.

Additions to the Schedule of the Act of 1880.

III. The Wild Birds Protection Act, 1880, shall apply within the Administrative County of Glamorgan to the following species of Wild Birds in the same manner as if those species were included in the Schedule to the Act:—

Snow Bunting, Common Buzzard, Golden Eagle, Peregrine Falcon, Kestrel, Kite, House Martin, Merlin, Nuthatch, Osprey, Raven, Siskin.

Certain Birds protected during the whole of the Year.

IV. During that period of the year to which the protection afforded by the Wild Birds Protection Act, 1880, does not extend, the killing or taking of the following species of Wild Birds is prohibited throughout the Administrative County of Glamorgan:—

Bittern, Snow Bunting, Common Buzzard, Chough, Longtailed Duck, Golden Eagle, Peregrine Falcon, Goldfinch, Great Crested Grebe, Sclavonian Grebe, Common Guillemot, Kestrel, Kingfisher, Kite, Wood Lark, House Martin, Merlin, Nightingale, Nightjar (Goat Sucker, Night Hawk or Fern Owl), Nuthatch, Golden Oriole, Osprey, Little Owl, Long-eared Owl, Short-eared Owl, Tawny Owl (Brown Owl, Wood Owl), White or Barn Owl, Grey Phalarope, Puffin, Raven, Razorbill, Green Sandpiper, Siskin, Smew, Green Woodpecker, Great Spotted Woodpecker, Lesser Spotted Woodpecker.

All Birds protected during the whole of the Year within a certain Area.

V. During those periods of the year to which the protection afforded by the Wild

Birds Protection Act, 1880, as varied by Clause II. of this Order, does not apply, the killing or taking of Wild Birds is prohibited on the Promontory known as Worms Head, in the Administrative County of Glamorgan.

All Birds protected on Sundays in certain Districts.

VI. During those periods of the year to which the protection afforded by the Wild Birds Protection Act, 1880, as varied by Clause II. of this Order, does not apply, the killing or taking of Wild Birds on Sundays is prohibited in all the Rural Districts in the Administrative County of Glamorgan, and in all the Urban Districts, except Neath Borough, Bridgend, Briton Ferry and Aberavon.

Eccs.

Certain Eggs protected throughout the County.

VII. The taking or destroying of the eggs of the following species of Wild Birds is prohibited throughout the Administrative County

of Glamorgan: -

Bittern, Snow Bunting, Common Buzzard, Chough, Kentish Dotterel, Golden Eagle, Peregrine Falcon, Goldfinch, Great Crested Grebe, Common Guillemot, Kestrel, Kingfisher, Kite, Wood Lark, House Martin, Merlin, Nightingale, Nightjar (Goat Sucker, Night Hawk or Fern Owl), Nuthatch, Golden Oriole, Osprey, Ring Ouzel, Water Ouzel, Oyster Catcher, Little Owl, Long-eared Owl, Short-eared Owl, Tawny Owl (Brown Owl, Wood Owl), White or Barn Owl, Stormy Petrel, Puffin, Raven, Razorbill, Siskin, Lesser Tern, Green Woodpecker, Great Spotted Woodpecker, Lesser Spotted Woodpecker.

All Eggs protected within a certain Area.

VIII. The taking or destroying of the eggs of any species of Wild Bird is prohibited on the Promontory known as Worms Head, in the Administrative County of Glamorgan, for a period of five years from the date of this Order.

Repeal of former Order.

IX. The Order of the 28th January, 1909, is hereby repealed.
