RULES OF THE SUPREME COURT.

Notice is hereby given that the following draft Rules are published, pursuant to the Rules Publication Act, 1893:—

*Draft Rules under the Trade Union Act, 1913,
Section 2 (4).*

1. All appeals to the High Court under Section 2 (4) of the Trade Union Act, 1913, shall be brought by petition in the Chancery Division of the High Court of Justice presented within three months of the decision of the Registrar, or within such further time as the Court may under special circumstances allow. Each such petition shall state the nature of the decision appealed against, and shall also state concisely the grounds of the appeal and no grounds, other than those so stated, shall, except with the leave of the Court to be given on such terms and conditions as may seem just, be allowed to be taken by the appellant at the hearing.

2. Every such appeal shall, subject to any direction of the Court to the contrary, be set down in the same manner as if it were a witness action, and be heard and disposed of in due course.

3. In all proceedings on such appeal the evi-

dence shall be the same as that presented to the Registrar, if any, and no further evidence shall be given, except by the leave of the Court on application to be made to the Court at or before the hearing.

4. In all proceedings on such appeal, the Court shall have all the powers by the Act vested in the Registrar, and may make any order which might, or ought to have been made by the Registrar.

5. In all proceedings on such appeal, the costs of and incident thereto, including the cost of any proceedings before the Registrar, shall be in the discretion of the Court.
