THE term of office of the Trade Board for the making of boxes or parts thereof made wholly or partially of paper, cardboard, chip or similar material in Great Britain, established on 29th July, 1910, in accordance with the Regulations for that trade, dated 27th April, 1910, having expired as provided in paragraph 6 of the said Regulations, the Board of Trade are now pleased, in pursuance of the powers conferred upon them by the Trade Boards Act, 1909, to establish a new Trade Board constituted in accordance with the said Regulations.
