The Board of Trade have received, through the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs, a copy of a Despatch, dated the 28th August, from His Majesty's Acting Consul-General at Trieste, transmitting the following translation of a Circular, dated the 8th August, issued by the Imperial and Royal Marine Board at Trieste, respecting arrivals from Servia and Bulgaria.

By Ordinance of the Imperial and Royal Ministries of the Interior, Commerce, and Finance (B.L.J., No. 160), dated August the 8th, 1913, and according to Article VII. of the Customs law of February the 13th, 1906, is prohibited, respectively limited the importation and transit of the following goods and articles from Servia and Bulgaria:—

(1) Soiled body linen, old and worn clothing (personal effects), old bedding (used bed feathers). If these articles are forwarded as travelling luggage, or in consequence of change of domicile, on crossing the frontier, they are subject to the special prescriptions in force of sanitary police.

(2) Rags. Of such prohibition are excluded: (a) Rags sent as goods pressed in iron-hooped bales for trade. New coaste from spinning, weaving, cloth, bleaching artificial wool, shoddy, and new paper waste.

The transit, however, of the goods and articles mentioned under No. 1 and 2 is allowed provided that they be packed in such a manner as to exclude all possible handling (manipolazione) during the voyage. The disinfection will take place for those articles considered by the Sanitary Authority as infected.

This Ordinance enters into force the date in which this Circular is issued.

The landing stages situate at Heysham Harbour, in the administrative county of Lancaster, in the occupation of the Midland Railway Company, together with all that space situate at the said Harbour which is coloured pink on the plan (marked B) sealed by the Board of Agriculture and Fisheries for the

purposes of this Order, and deposited at the office of the Board.

KEIGHLEY ALLOTMENT GARDENS  
(SWINE-FEVER) ORDER OF 1913.  
(No. 2.)

The Board of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in them under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1911, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

1. Article 3 of the Keighley Allotment Gardens (Swine-Fever) Order of 1913 is hereby revoked and the following provisions substituted therefor:—

*“Movement of Swine from Premises to which this Order applies.”*

3.—(1.) Swine (not being in a Swine-Fever Infected Place and their movement not being prohibited by Notice of an Inspector of the Local Authority or of the Board given under any Order of the Board) may be moved from any premises to which this Order applies under and in accordance with the following provisions.

(2.) Swine may be moved to any slaughter-house for the purpose of immediate slaughter if accompanied by a licence in the Form D set forth in the First Schedule to the Swine-Fever (Regulation of Movement) Order of 1908 authorising such movement, granted by an Inspector of the Local Authority of the borough of Keighley.

(3.) Before a licence (Form D) is granted by an Inspector under this Article the owner of the swine, or his agent authorised in writing for this purpose, shall sign, and deliver or send by post to the Inspector, a declaration in the Form E set forth in the First Schedule to the Swine-Fever (Regulation of Movement) Order of 1908, which shall be retained by the Inspector.

(4.) The swine shall, before the movement is commenced, be marked by and at the expense of the owner by the painting with an indelible composition of red colour of a broad line down the back and another broad line across the loins of each of the swine thus +, each line being not less than nine inches long.

(5.) Swine may also be moved from any premises to which this Order applies to any other premises, not being situate in a Scheduled Area to which the Swine-Fever (Special Areas) Order of 1911 applies, if accompanied by a licence in the Form A set forth in the First Schedule to the Swine-

Fever (Regulation of Movement) Order of 1908 authorising such movement, granted by an Inspector of the Local Authority of the District in which the place of destination specified in the licence is situate, but no such licence shall be expressed to be granted for movement for breeding purposes.

(6.) Before a licence (Form A) is granted by an Inspector under this Article, the owner of the swine, or his agent authorised in writing for this purpose, shall sign and deliver or send by post to the Inspector, a declaration in the Form B set forth in the First Schedule to the Swine-Fever (Regulation of Movement) Order of 1908, countersigned as hereinafter provided.

(7.) The declaration (Form B) shall not be effective until it is countersigned by an Inspector of the Local Authority of the borough of Keighley, who, before countersigning the declaration, shall, so far as is practicable, satisfy himself as to the correctness of the statements contained therein.

(8.) The declaration (Form B) shall be retained by the Inspector granting the licence thereon.

(9.) Swine moved with a licence (Form A) under this Article shall not, for a period of twenty-eight days after arrival at the place of destination specified in the licence, be moved from such place of destination, except as hereinafter provided.

(10.) Where swine are moved with a licence (Form A) to a market, fairground or saleyard, specified in the licence, the swine shall be moved from such premises only if accompanied by a licence in the Form C set forth in the First Schedule to the Swine-Fever (Regulation of Movement) Order of 1908, authorising such movement granted by an Inspector of the Local Authority of the District in which the market, fairground or saleyard is situate and only to a slaughter-house specified in the licence, or to the premises from which the swine were moved to the market, fairground or saleyard.

(11.) Swine required by this Article to be detained for a period of twenty-eight days may be moved before the expiration of that period to a slaughter-house in the same Scheduled Area if such movement is authorised by a licence in the Form C above mentioned granted by an Inspector of the Local Authority of the District in which the swine are detained, and the swine are accompanied by the licence.

(12.) Swine while detained under this Article shall be kept separate from all other swine.

(13.) Swine moved under this Article shall be moved by the nearest available route and without unnecessary delay, and where they are moved to a slaughterhouse they shall be there detained until they are slaughtered.

(14.) Licences granted under this Article shall be in force for not more than eight days inclusive of the day of issue.

(15.) No licence under the Swine-Fever (Regulation of Movement) Order of 1908 shall be required for the movement into a Scheduled Area for the purposes of that

Order of swine which are being moved under and in accordance with a licence granted under this Article."

*Commencement.*

2. This Order shall come into operation on the sixth day of September, nineteen hundred and thirteen.

*Short Title, &c.*

3. This Order may be cited as the KEIGHLEY ALLOTMENT GARDENS (SWINE-FEVER) ORDER of 1913 (No. 2), and shall be read as one with the Keighley Allotment Gardens (Swine-Fever) Order of 1913.
