## COAL MINES ACT, 1911.

The Secretary of State for the Home Department hereby gives notice that on the 26th August, 1913, he made an Order under Section 33 of the Coal Mines Act, 1911, approving certain types of safety lamps for use in all mines to which the Act applies, subject in each case to the conditions specified in the Schedule to the Order. ## COAL MINES ACT, 1911.
