The KING, taking into His Royal consideration that upon the decease of Sir Charles Mark, Lord Headley, without male issue, on the thirteenth day of January last, the dignity of Lord Headley, Baron Allanson and Winn, devolved upon Rowland George Allanson, now Lord Headley, as eldest surviving son and heir of Rowland Winn (commonly called the Honourable Rowland Winn), who was the uncle and heir presumptive of the said Charles Mark, Lord Headley, whereby according to the ordinary rules of honour the sisters of the said Rowland George Allanson, Lord Headley, cannot enjoy that place and precedence which would have been due to them had their father survived and succeeded to the title and dignity of Lord Headley: His Majesty has been graciously pleased to ordain and declare that Helen Margareta Winn, spinster, Stephanie, the wife of George Maryon-Wilson, Barrister-at-Law, of the Inner Temple, and Margareta Anne Winn, spinster, shall henceforth have, hold and enjoy the same title, place and precedence as if their father had survived his nephew Charles Mark, late Lord Headley, and thereby succeeded to the dignity of Lord Headley.

And to command that the said Order and declaration be recorded in His Majesty's College of Arms.
