Batoum reports Constantinople, Russian, Servian, Austrian and Roumanian Danubian ports declared infected with cholera.

Russian Government report, between August 26 and September 6, fifteen cases of cholera and five deaths in town of Kherson, and one non-fatal case in town of Nicolaiev. Town of Kherson considered infected by Russian Government.

Governments of Kherson and Bessarabia, districts of Balta in Podolia and Dnieper in Tauride, and prefectures of Odessa, Nicolaiev and Rostov-on-Don considered threatened with cholera.

**ORDER OF THE REGISTRAR-GENERAL
IN ENGLAND.**

(Dated September 18th, 1913.)

Whereas by the 21st Section of the Births and Deaths Registration Act, 1874, it is enacted that the Registrar-General, with the sanction of the Local Government Board, may from time to time alter Registration Sub-districts:—

1. And whereas it is expedient that the following changes should be effected in the constitution of the undermentioned Sub-districts of Ludlow Registration District, viz.:—

(1) That Diddlebury Sub-district should be united with Munslow Sub-district, the enlarged Sub-district to be called and known as Diddlebury Sub-district;

(2) that Hopton Cangeford Civil Parish should be transferred from Cainham Sub-district to Diddlebury Sub-district, as enlarged by this Order; and

(3) that Cainham Sub-district, as thus reduced, should be united with Ludlow Sub-

district, the enlarged Sub-district to be called and known as Ludlow Sub-district;

2. Now, therefore, I, Bernard Mallet, C.B., Registrar-General of Births, Deaths, and Marriages in England, in exercise of the powers given me by the above-mentioned Act, and with the sanction of the Local Government Board, do hereby order and declare that the foregoing alteration shall take effect accordingly.

3. This Order shall come into operation on the first day of October, nineteen hundred and thirteen.
