The following Address was presented to the KING, at Northampton, on Tuesday, the 23rd September:—

Address of the

MAYOR AND CORPORATION OF NORTHAMPTON To the King's Most Excellent Majesty and to Her Most Gracious Majesty Queen Mary.

We, the Mayor, Aldermen, and Burgesses of the ancient Borough of Northampton, desire on behalf of ourselves and the inhabitants of our town to approach Your Majesties with the heartiest assurances of our loyal feeling and respectful affection. It is our great privilege to-day to welcome Your Majesties to a town within whose walls in olden times Kings and Councils repeatedly sat. Amid modern industrial developments we are proud to recall the historical memories clustering round our ancient churches and charitable foundations, and we are deeply sensible of the gracious kindness which has prompted Your Majesties to add one more to the events of historical importance in the borough, by honouring the town with a visit so soon after Your accession to the Throne.

We cannot but recall the fact that the foundation-stone of a new wing of the Northampton General Hospital was laid by Your Majesty the King's beloved and lamented brother, His. Royal Highness Prince Albert Victor of Wales, and the sympathies of Your Majesty's House with everything tending to alleviate sickness and suffering are recognised further by our local Jubilee Institute for Nurses, erected to the memory of our late beloved Queen Victoria, which was opened by Her Royal Highness Princess Helena in 1901.

We take note that Your Majesties' sojourn in our county on this occasion is associated with those exercises of the Army which are essential for the adequate defence of the Realm and of Your Majesties' Dominions beyond the Seas, and are proud that Your presence to-day coincides in point of time with the visit to their home county and to the county town of the

Northamptonshire Regiment.

Had time served we should have been glad to show Your Majesties something of our educational institutions and of the industrial achievements of Northampton as the chief centre of the Boot and Shoe Trade, because we gladly recognise the deep interest Your Majesties have always displayed in the education and training of the young and in the industrial happiness and prosperity of Your people.

We desire to offer to Your Majesties heartfelt thanks for Your visit. It is our earnest prayer that every blessing may rest upon Your Majesties and the Royal Children, and that You may long be spared to promote the welfare of Your subjects throughout the Empire.

To which Address His Majesty was pleased to return the following gracious Answer:—

The Queen and I thank you most heartily for the loyal and affectionate welcome which you have extended to Us on behalf of the ancient Borough of Northampton.

It gives Us great pleasure that by My attending the Military Manœuvres in this district an opportunity has been given to Us of coming amongst you and renewing for the first time since the visit of Queen Victoria in 1844 that long connection between Northampton and the Throne of which you have reminded Us.

Amid many vicissitudes your borough has always held an important place in our national life, and I am glad to learn that in industrial enterprise, care for the sick, and education of the young you still strive worthily to preserve the fair name of which you are justly proud.

I rejoice to find in Northampton both that strong civic patriotism which is so essential to the efficient carrying out of the responsible duties entrusted to our local authorities, and that wider national patriotism which is concerned with the defence of My Realm and of My Dominions beyond the Seas. I pray that success may constantly attend your labours, and that they may be rewarded by an increasing measure of prosperity.
