The Board of Trade have received, through the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs, a copy of a Despatch, dated the 23rd September, from His Majesty's Minister at Athens, containing copy of a note from the Greek Government, of which the following is a translation:—

- (1.) The quarantine measures against the coast between Dedeagatch and Katerina have been raised, and vessels coming from ports in that district will henceforward obtain free pratique. But passengers will have to undergo a medical inspection and 10 days' supervision.
- (2.) Five days' quarantine (voyage not included) is imposed on vessels arriving from the island of Triheri.
- (3.) The following instructions have been sent to the Sanitary Authorities at Salonica:—

Vessels under quarantine can disembark passengers and goods under these conditions:

- (a) the boatmen and wharfingers shall not come into contact with the passengers and crew of the vessel;
- (b) the disembarkation shall take place under the supervision of the Sanitary Authorities.

Vessels shall be given a paper certifying that they have complied with these conditions, and when provided with this document they shall be entitled to free pratique in the other ports of the kingdom.
