Allen)	Lately residing at 74, Redcliffe - gardens, Fulham, London, whose present residence the Petitioning Creditors are unable to ascertain	High Court of Justice in Bankruptcy	1412 of 1911	July 30, 1913	The bankrupt undertaking to give a charge to the Official Receiver on the reversionary interest to which he is or may become entitled to under the will of Henry George Allen to secure the balance of the debts provable and not satisfied, bankrupt discharged subject to the following condition to be fulfilled before his discharge takes effect, viz. :— Bankrupt shall, before the signing of this Order, consent to Judgment being entered against him in the King's Bench Division of the High Court by the Official Receiver for the sum of £650, being part of the balance of the debts provable in the bankruptcy which is not satisfied at the date of this Order, and £1 10s. costs of Judgment; and that, upon the required consent being given, Judgment may be entered against the bankrupt in the King's Bench Division of the High Court for the sum of £650, together with £1 10s. costs of Judgment which have been paid to the Official Receiver. Without prejudice and subject to any execution which may be issued and by consent, it is ordered that the said sum of £650 be paid out of the future earnings of the bankrupt in manner following :—£10 per month out of the gross pay and staff salary of the bankrupt while he holds the rank of Lieutenant in His Majesty's Indian Army, and £13 per month when he shall attain the rank of Captain. The first payment of £10 to be deducted on the 31st January, 1914, and the first payment of £13 to be deducted from the first full month after the bankrupt shall attain the rank of Captain. Provided always that in the event of the bankrupt receiving or becoming entitled to receive a pension or other emolument on his leaving His Majesty's Service	Bankrupt's assets are not of a value equal to 10s. in the pound on the amount of his unsecured liabilities; that the bankrupt had contributed to his bankruptcy by gambling
