NATIONAL INSURANCE ACT, 1911. (1 & 2 Geo. 5, c. 55, s. 83.)

Notice is hereby given, that the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury have, in pursuance of the powers conferred upon Them by Section 2 of the Rules Publication Act, 1893, and by Section 83 of the National Insurance Act, 1911, and of every other power enabling Them in that behalf, issued under date the 9th instant, Provisional Regulations providing for the exercise and performance by the National Health Insurance Joint Committee, either alone or jointly with the several bodies of Commissioners appointed for the purposes of Part I of the latter Act, of certain of the powers and duties of the several bodies of Commissioners as provided in Sub-section (2) of the above quoted Section.
