

MOTOR CAR ACT, 1903.

Regulation under Section 8.

COUNTY OF DEVON.

PAIGNTON URBAN DISTRICT.

To the County Council of Devon;—
And to all others whom it may concern.

WHEREAS by Section 8 of the Motor Car Act, 1903, it is provided that We, the Local Government Board, may, by Regulations made under Section 6 of the Locomotives on Highways Act, 1896, prohibit or restrict the driving of any motor cars, or of any special kind of motor cars, on any specified highway, or part of a highway, which does not exceed sixteen feet in width, or on which ordinary motor car traffic would, in Our opinion, be specially dangerous;

And whereas the County Council of Devon having applied to Us to make a Regulation in pursuance of the above-mentioned Sections prohibiting the driving of motor cars on a certain highway situate in the Urban District of Paignton, and known as the Eastern Esplanade, We directed a Local Inquiry to be held into the matter by one of Our Inspectors, and an Inquiry was held accordingly, and Report has been made to Us thereon:

NOW THEREFORE, after consideration of the said Report and of all the circumstances of the case, We, the Local Government Board, in pursuance of Our powers in that behalf, do hereby make the following Regulation:—

During the period extending from the first day of May to the thirtieth day of September in every year a person shall not drive a motor car at a speed exceeding five miles per hour upon the highway situate in the Urban District of Paignton known as the Eastern Esplanade.

**ORDER OF THE BOARD OF
AGRICULTURE AND FISHERIES.**

(DATED 8TH OCTOBER 1913.)

The Board of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in them under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1911, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

The restrictions on movement of swine imposed by the Swine-Fever (Regulation of Movement) Order of 1908 shall not apply to the movement of swine from the sale mentioned in the Schedule hereto to any premises (not being a Swine-Fever Infected Place) situate in either of the administrative counties of Norfolk and East and West Suffolk or in the county boroughs of Norwich or Ipswich if the swine are accompanied by a licence in the Form F set forth in the First Schedule to the said Order granted by an Inspector of the Local Authority of the county of East Suffolk and the following conditions are complied with:—

(i.) The swine shall be moved to the place of destination specified in the licence and not elsewhere and shall be there detained and kept separate from all other swine for twenty-eight days, unless they are slaughtered on such premises before the expiration of that period, or are moved under and in accordance with the conditions of a licence in the Form C set forth in the said First Schedule to a bacon factory or slaughterhouse in the same Scheduled Area.

(ii.) The swine shall be moved by the nearest available route and without unnecessary delay, and during the movement shall, so far as is practicable, be kept separate from all swine not being moved with a licence under this Order.

(iii.) After completion of the movement the licence shall forthwith be delivered up at or sent by post to, the nearest police-station in the same District by the person in charge of the swine at the time of completing such movement.

A licence under this Order shall for the purposes of the above-mentioned Order be treated as a licence under that Order.
