"Whereas the advowson or perpetual right of patronage of and presentation to each of the said benefices of Isle Brewers and Stratton on the Foss is vested in His Royal Highness Edward Albert Christian George Andrew Patrick David, Prince of Wales, Duke of Cornwall and Rothesay, Earl of Chester and Carrick, Baron of Renfrew, Lord of the Isles and Great Steward of Scotland (hereinafter called "His Royal Highness"), as parcel of the possessions of the Duchy of Cornwall.

"And whereas the advowson or perpetual right of patronage of and presentation to the said benefice of East Harptree is vested in the Right Reverend George Wyndham, now Bishop of Bath and Wells, in right of his See

of Bath and Wells, in right of his See.

"And whereas a warrant under Your Majesty's Royal Sign Manual has authorized the passing of these presents under the Privy Seal of His Royal Highness and the said George Wyndham, Bishop of Bath and Wells, has signified to us his desire that the patronage of the said three benefices of Isle Brewers, Stratton on the Foss, and East Harptree may be rearranged by way of exchange in the manner which is hereinafter recommended and proposed.

"And whereas we have made due inquiry and calculation as to the circumstances and relative value of the said three benefices and of the patronage thereof respectively and we do hereby certify to Your Majesty in Council that the circumstances and present values of the said three benefices are as set forth in the Schedule hereunto annexed.

"Now, therefore, with the consent of His Royal Highness (in testimony whereof he has signed this Scheme and caused his Privy Seal to be affixed hereto) and with the consent of the said George Wyndham, Bishop of Bath and Wells, acting as such bishop (in testimony whereof he has signed this Scheme and affixed his Episcopal Seal hereto), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, humbly recommend and propose that upon and from the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme and without any conveyance or assurance in the law other than such duly gazetted Order the whole advowson or perpetual right of patronage of and presentation to each of the said two benefices of Isle Brewers and Stratton on the Foss, and the churches thereof shall be assigned and transferred from His Royal Highness to the said George Wyndham, Bishop of Bath and Wells, and his successors in the same bishoprick and shall become and be absolutely vested in and shall and may from time to time and at all times be exercised by the said George Wyndham, Bishop of Bath and Wells, and his successors in the same bishoprick for ever, and that in exchange for the same the whole advowson or perpetual right of patronage of and presentation to the said benefice of East Harptree and the church thereof shall in like manner and upon and from the same date be assigned and transferred from the said George Wyndham, Bishop of Bath and Wells, and from his successors, and shall become and be absolutely vested in His Royal Highness as parcel of the possessions of the Duchy of Cornwall, and shall and may from time to time and at all times be exercised by His Royal Highness and His successors for ever.

"And we further recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid or any of them in accordance with the provisions of the said Acts or of either of them or of any

other Act of Parliament.

"Now, therefore, with the consent of the Right Reverend Edward Lee, Bishop of Lincoln (in testimony whereof he has signed and sealed this Scheme), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, humbly recommend and propose that all that part of the said new parish of Scunthorpe, which is described in the Schedule hereunder written, all which part, together with the boundaries thereof, is delineated and set forth upon the map or plan hereunto annexed, shall upon and from the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme, become and be constituted a separate district for spiritual purposes, and that the same shall be named 'The District of Crosby.'

"And we further recommend and propose that without any assurance in the law other than this Scheme and any duly gazetted Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying the same, and upon and from the day of the date of the publication of such Order in the London Gazette as aforesaid, the whole right of patronage of the said proposed district, and when the said district shall have become a new parish as aforesaid then of the said new parish and of the nomination of the Minister or Incumbent thereto shall be assigned to and be absolutely vested in, and shall and may from time to time be exercised by the said Sir Berkeley Digby George Sheffield, his heirs and assigns, for ever.

"And we further recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid or any of them in accordance with the provisions of the said Acts or of any of them or of any other Act of Parliament.

"The SCHEDULE to which the foregoing Scheme has reference.

"The District of Crosby being: --

"All that part of the new parish (sometime district) of Scunthorpe, in the county of Lincoln and in the diocese of Lincoln, which forms part of the civil parish of Crosby."

And whereas drafts of the said Scheme have, in accordance with the provisions of the secondly hereinbefore mentioned Act, been transmitted to the Patron and to the Incumbent of the said new parish of Scunthorpe, out of which it is intended that the district recommended in such Scheme to be constituted shall be taken.

and seventh years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, chapter thirty-seven, and of the Act of the nineteenth and twentieth years of Her said late Majesty, chapter one hundred and four, have prepared and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following Scheme for constituting a separate district for spiritual purposes to be taken partly out of the parish (sometime district under the firstly hereinbefore mentioned Act) of Droylsden, partly out of the parish (sometime district under the Parish of Manchester Division Act, 1850) of Saint Cross, Clayton, and partly out of the parish (sometime district under the Parish of Manchester Division Act, 1850) of Saint Clement, Higher Openshaw, all within the original limits of the parish of Manchester, in the county of Lancaster and in the diocese of Manchester.

"Whereas we are satisfied that the said parish of Droylsden, the said parish of Saint Cross, Clayton, and the said parish of Saint Clement, Higher Openshaw, are parishes wherein or in parts whereof the provision for public worship and for pastoral superintendence is insufficient for the spiritual wants of the inhabitants thereof, and it has been made to appear to us that it would promote the interests of religion that the particular portions of the said parish of Droylsden, of the said parish of Saint Cross, Clayton, and of the said parish of Saint Clement, Higher Openshaw, which are hereinafter mentioned and described, should be constituted a separate district in the manner which is hereinafter set forth.

"And whereas there is not at present within the limits of the said proposed district any consecrated church or chapel in use for the purposes of divine worship.

"And whereas we are satisfied that an adequate and permanent maintenance for the support of the Minister of the said proposed district, and when the said district shall have become a new parish, then for the support of the Incumbent thereof will be secured as from the date of the licensing or appointment of such Minister or Incumbent by the payment of a sum of not less than one hundred and fifty pounds, which will be annually provided out of the moneys received by us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, under the provisions of the said Parish of Manchester Division Act, 1850.

"Now, therefore, with the consent of the said Edmund Arbuthnott, Bishop of Manchester (in testimony whereof he has signed and sealed this Scheme), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, humbly recommend and propose that all those portions of the said parish of Droylsden, of the said parish of Saint Cross, Clayton, and of the said parish of Saint Clement, Higher Openshaw, which are more particularly described in the Schedule hereunder written and are delineated and set forth on the map or plan hereunto annexed, shall upon and from the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme become and be constituted a separate district for spiritual purposes, and that the same shall be named 'The District of Saint Andrew, Droylsden.'

"And we further recommend and propose that the whole right of patronage of the said district so recommended to be constituted, and, when such district shall have become a new parish as aforesaid, then of the said new parish and the nomination of the Minister or Incumbent thereof shall without any assurance in the law other than this Scheme, and any duly gazetted Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying the same, and upon and from the day of the date of the publication of such Order in the London Gazette as aforesaid, be assigned to and be absolutely vested in and shall and may be exercised by the said Edmund Arbuthnott, Bishop of Manchester, and by his successors in the same Bishoprick for ever.

"And we further recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid or any of them in accordance with the provisions of the said Acts or of any of them or of any other Act of Parliament.

"The SCHEDULE to which the foregoing Scheme has reference:—

"The district of Saint Andrew, Droylsden, comprising:—

"All those contiguous portions of the parish (sometime district) of Droylsden, of the parish (sometime district under the Parish of Manchester Division Act, 1850) of Saint Cross, Clayton, and of the parish (sometime district under the Parish of Manchester Division Act, 1850), of Saint Clement, Higher Openshaw, all within the original limits of the parish of Manchester, in the county of Lancaster and in the diocese of Manchester, which, taken together, are comprised within and are bounded by an imaginary line commencing at the point in the middle of the northern end of Clayton Mill Bridge which crosses the River Medlock where the boundaries of the said parish of Droylsden, the parish of All Saints, Newton, in the said county and diocese, and the said parish of Saint Cross, Clayton, all meet, and extending thence first north-westward, then westward, and then south-westward along the boundary which divides the said parish of All Saints, Newton, from the said parish of Saint Cross, Clayton (thereby following in part the northern side of the River Medlock and crossing the river twice), for a distance of twenty-one chains or thereabouts to the point

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of the Act of the eighth and ninth years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, chapter seventy, of the Act of the fourteenth and fifteenth years of Her said late Majesty, chapter ninety-seven, and of the Act of the nineteenth and twentieth years of Her said late Majesty, chapter fifty-five, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following representation as to the assignment of a consolidated chapelry to the consecrated church of Saint Margaret, Coventry, situate within the parish of Stoke, in the county of Warwick and in the diocese of Worcester.

"Whereas at certain extremities of the said parish of Stoke, and of the new parish (sometime chapelry district) of Saint Peter, Coventry, which said extremities lie contiguous one to another, and are described in the Schedule hereunder written, there is collected together a population which is situate at a distance from the several churches of such parish and new parish.

"And whereas it appears to us to be expedient that certain contiguous portions (being the portions containing the population aforesaid) of the said parish of Stoke, and of the said new parish of Saint Peter, Coventry, should be formed into a consolidated chapelry for all Ecclesiastical purposes, and that the same should be assigned to the said Church of Saint Margaret, Coventry, situate as aforesaid.

"Now, therefore, with the consent of the Right Reverend Huyshe Wolcott, Bishop of Worcester, as such bishop, with the consent of the Right Honourable Richard Burdon, Viscount Haldane, now Lord High Chancellor of Great Britain, acting on behalf of Your Majesty as the patron of the vicarage of the said parish of Stoke, and with the consent of the Reverend Reginald Basil Littlewood, Clerk in Holy Orders, the Vicar or Incumbent of the vicarage of the parish of the Holy Trinity, Coventry, in the said county and diocese, and, as such Vicar or Incumbent, the patron of the

vicarage of the said new parish of Saint Peter, Coventry (in testimony whereof they, the said consenting parties, have respectively signed and sealed this representation), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, humbly represent, that it would, in our opinion, be expedient that all those contiguous portions of the said parish of Stoke, and of the said new parish of Saint Peter, Coventry, which are described in the Schedule hereunder written, all which portions, together with the boundaries thereof, are delineated and set forth on the map or plan hereunto annexed, should be united and formed into one consolidated chapelry for the said Church of Saint Margaret, Coventry, situate as aforesaid, and that the same should be named 'The Consolidated Chapelry of Saint Margaret, Coventry.'

"We, therefore, humbly pray that Your Majesty will be graciously pleased to take the premises into Your Royal consideration, and to make such Order in respect thereto as to Your Majesty in Your Royal Wisdom shall seem meet.

"The SCHEDULE to which the foregoing Representation has reference.

"The Consolidated Chapelry of Saint Margaret, Coventry, comprising:—

"I. All that portion of the parish of Stoke, in the county of Warwick and in the diocese of Worcester, which is bounded upon part of the east by the parish of Wyken, upon the north partly by the last-named parish, partly by the parish of Foleshill, and partly by the new parish of Saint Paul, Foleshill, upon the west partly by the new parish of Saint Mark, Coventry, partly by the new parish (sometime chapelry district) of Saint Peter, Coventry, and partly by the new parish of All Saints, Coventry, all in the said county and diocese, upon part of the south by the said new parish of All Saints, Coventry, and upon the remaining sides, that is to say, upon the remaining part of the south and upon the remaining part of the east, by an imaginary line commencing at the point upon the northern side of Binley Road where the boundaries of the said new parish of All Saints, Coventry, of the parish of Saint Michael, Coventry, in the said county and diocese, and of the said parish of Stoke all meet, and extending thence eastward along the northern side of Binley Road for a distance of two chains and a half or thereabouts to the point where it meets the wall or fence forming the western boundary of Stoke Park, and extending thence first northward, then eastward, and then again northward along such wall or fence for a distance of thirteen chains and a half or thereabouts to its northern end, where it meets the wall or fence forming the northern boundary of the said park, and extending thence eastward along the last-mentioned wall or fence for a distance of thirteen chains and a quarter or thereabouts to its eastern end on the western side of Brays Lane, and extending thence first eastward to, and then first northward, and then north-westward along the middle of Brays Lane for a distance of sixteen chains and a half or thereabouts to its junction with Walsgrave Road and Clay Lane, and extending thence first northward and then eastward, along the middle of Clay Lane for a distance of twenty-seven chains and a half or

WHEREAS by section 30 of the Municipal Corporations Act, 1882, as amended by section 2 of the Municipal Corporations Act, 1893, it is (amongst other things) provided that, if a majority of the whole Council of a borough agree to petition, and the council thereupon petition the King for the division of

the borough into wards, it shall be lawful for His Majesty from time to time, by Order in Council, to fix the number of wards into which the borough shall be divided, and that the borough shall be divided into that number of wards, and that where an Order in Council has been so made the Secretary of State shall appoint a Commissioner to prepare a Scheme for determining the boundaries of the wards and apportioning the councillors among them.

And whereas a majority of the whole Council of the borough of Evesham, in the county of Worcester, did on the 15th day of May, 1912, agree to petition, and the Council of the said borough thereupon petitioned His Majesty for the division of the said borough into wards.

And whereas His Majesty was pleased by His Order in Council of the 19th day of July, 1912, to fix the number of wards into which the borough of Evesham should be divided, and to order and direct that the said borough should henceforth be divided into four wards.

And whereas on the 5th day of August, 1912, the Right Honourable Reginald McKenna, one of His Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, did duly appoint Harold McKenna, Esquire, Barrister-at-Law, a Commissioner, to prepare a Scheme for determining the boundaries of such wards and for apportioning the councillors of the said borough among such wards.

And whereas the said Commissioner has prepared the following Scheme, dated the 8th day of October, 1913, accordingly:

BOROUGH OF EVESHAM.

- I, Harold McKenna, in pursuance of the powers given me by virtue of the appointment under the said Act, do hereby determine as hereinafter mentioned the boundaries of the said four Wards into which the said borough is divided, which Wards are hereinafter named and numbered as follows, that is to say:—
 - 1. North Ward.
 - 2. West Ward.
 - 3. South Ward.
 - 4. East Ward.

And when in the following descriptions of the Ward boundaries (so far as such descriptions do not refer to the borough boundary), a street, road or footpath is given as the boundary of a Ward, the boundary is to be taken as the centre of such street, road or footpath, and when any street or road is described as joining another street or road, the point of junction is to be taken as the point at which lines, drawn along the centres of the two streets or roads and continued, would intersect each other, and a point described as being opposite a street or road is to be taken as opposite the centre of a street or road.

. And when a river or stream is given as the boundary of a Ward, the boundary (except when it refers to the borough boundary) is to be taken as the medium filum of such river or stream.

No. 1.—North Ward.

I do hereby determine that North Ward shall comprise so much of the borough of Evesham as lies within the following boundary:—

THEREAS by the Burial Act, 1853, as amended by the Burial Act, 1900, it is enacted that, in case it appear to His Majesty in Council, upon the representation of the Local Government Board, that, for the protection of the public health, the opening of any new burial ground in any city or town, or within any other limits, save with the previous approval of the Local Government Board, should be prohibited, or that burials in any city or town, or within any other limits, or in any burial grounds or places of burial, should be wholly discontinued, or should be discontinued subject to any exception or qualification, it shall be lawful for His Majesty, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to order that no new burial ground shall be opened in any city or town, or within such limits, without such previous approval, or (as the case may require) that, after a time mentioned in the Order, burials in such city or town, or within such limits, or in such burial grounds or places of burial, shall be discontinued wholly, or subject to any exceptions or qualifications mentioned in such Order, and so from time to time circumstances may require: Provided always that notice of such representation, and of the time when it shall please His Majesty to order the same to be taken into consideration by the Privy Council, shall be published in the London Gazette, and shall be affixed on the doors of the churches or chapels of, or on some other conspicuous places within, the parishes affected by such representation, one month before such representation is so considered: Provided also that no such representation shall be made in relation to the burial ground of any parish until ten days' previous notice of

the intention to make such representation shall have been given to the Incumbent and the vestry clerk or churchwardens of such parish:

And whereas by the Burial Act, 1855, it is, amongst other things, enacted that it shall be lawful for His Majesty, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, from time to time to postpone the time appointed by any Order in Council for the discontinuance of burials, or otherwise to vary any Order in Council made under any of the Acts recited in the said Act, or under the said Act (whether the time thereby appointed for the discontinuance of burials thereunder, or other operation of such Order, shall or shall not have arrived), as to His Majesty, with such advice as aforesaid, may seem fit:

And whereas by an Order in Council dated the 8th day of February, 1855, it was ordered that burials should be discontinued in (amongst other places) the parish church and the churchyard of Wotton-under-Edge, in the county of Gloucester, as in the said Order mentioned:

And whereas the Local Government Board, after giving to the Incumbent and the church-wardens of the said parish of Wotton-under-Edge ten days' previous notice of their intention in that behalf have made a representation that so much of the said Order in Council of the 8th day of February, 1855, as relates to burials in the parish church and the church-yard of Wotton-under-Edge aforesaid, should be varied by substituting for the directions therein contained with regard to the said church and churchyard the following directions, viz.:—

That, except as hereinafter provided, burials shall be discontinued forthwith and entirely in the parish church of Saint Mary, Wotton-under-Edge, and in that portion of the church-yard which was in existence prior to the year 1855: Provided that in any vault or walled grave now existing in the said portion of the churchyard and situate not less than fifty feet from the house known as Lisle House, burial may be allowed, subject to the condition that every coffin buried in such vault or grave be separately enclosed by stonework or brickwork properly cemented.

Now, therefore, His Majesty in Council is pleased hereby to give notice of such representation, and to order that the same be taken into consideration by a Committee of the Privy Council, on the 20th day of November next.

ARTICLE I.—It shall be the duty of the Superintendent Nurse to visit each of the sick and lying-in wards of the Workhouse daily, and to see that the said wards have been duly cleansed and are properly warmed and ventilated, and also that all such arrangements are made as may be necessary for the proper care of and attendance upon the inmates both by day and during the night.

ARTICLE II.—The duty of making morning and nightly visits to the sick and lying-in wards of the Workhouse shall cease to be part of the duties of the Master or Matron of the Workhouse, as the case may be; but, except to this extent, nothing in this Order shall affect the duties of the Master or Matron so far as those duties relate to the general control of the Workhouse.
