the map or plan annexed to this Scheme, and extending thence first north-eastward along the last mentioned fence, and then in various directions along the fences forming the eastern and northern boundaries of the said close and along the fence forming the eastern boundary of the close numbered 207 upon the said maps for a distance in all of twenty-one chains or thereabouts to the point where the last mentioned fence meets the southern side of Manchester Road, and extending thence first northward to and then eastward along the middle of Manchester Road for a distance of one chain and a half or thereabouts to its junction with Sunnybank Road, and extending thence first north-westward and then northward along the middle of Sunnybank Road for a distance of nine chains and a half or thereabouts to its northern end at the gateway leading to the house called Sunny Bank, and extending thence north-westward in a straight line for a distance of two chains or thereabouts to the point in the middle of Sunny Bank Brook where it emerges from the culvert under the roadway leading to the said house called Sunny Bank, and extending thence first northwestward and then in various directions along the middle of the said brook (thereby passing through the Droylsden Urban District Council Sewage Works) for a distance of sixty-five chains or thereabouts to the centre of the bridge which carries Edge Lane across it upon the boundary which divides the said parsh of Droylsden from the said parish of Saint Cross, Clayton, and extending thence first northward and then north-eastward along such boundary (thereby following the middle of Edge Lane and crossing the River Medlock by the Clayton Mill Bridge) for a distance of six chains or thereabouts to a point in the middle of the northern end of the said bridge where the last mentioned boundary meets the boundary of the said parish of All Saints, Newton, at which point the said imaginary line commenced."

And whereas drafts of the said Scheme have, in accordance with the provisions of the firstly hereinbefore mentioned Act, been transmitted to the patrons and to the Incumbents of the three parishes out of which it is intended that the district recommended in such Scheme to be constituted shall be taken.

And whereas the patrons of the said parish of Droylsden and of the said parish of Saint Clement, Higher Openshaw, and the Incumbent of the said parish of Droylsden have respectively signified their assent to such Scheme:

And whereas the patron of the said parish of Saint Cross, Clayton, and the Incumbents of the said parish of Saint Cross, Clayton, and of the said parish of Saint Clement, Higher Openshaw, have offered certain objections to the same Scheme.

And whereas, notwithstanding these objections, the said Scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said Scheme, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts. And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct

that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of Manchester.

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Act of the eighth and ninth years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, chapter seventy; of the Act of the fourteenth and fifteenth years of Her said late Majesty, chapter ninety-seven; and of the Act of the nineteenth and twentieth years of Her said late Majesty, chapter fifty-five; duly prepared and laid before His Majesty in Council a representation, bearing date the thirty-first day of July, in the year one thousand nine hundred and thirteen, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of the Act of the eighth and ninth years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, chapter seventy, of the Act of the fourteenth and fifteenth years of Her said late Majesty, chapter ninety-seven, and of the Act of the nineteenth and twentieth years of Her said late Majesty, chapter fifty-five, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following representation as to the assignment of a consolidated chapelry to the consecrated church of Saint Margaret, Coventry, situate within the parish of Stoke, in the county of Warwick and in the diocese of Worcester.

"Whereas at certain extremities of the said parish of Stoke, and of the new parish (sometime chapelry district) of Saint Peter, Coventry, which said extremities lie contiguous one to another, and are described in the Schedule hereunder written, there is collected together a population which is situate at a distance from the several churches of such parish and new parish.

"And whereas it appears to us to be expedient that certain contiguous portions (being the portions containing the population aforesaid) of the said parish of Stoke, and of the said new parish of Saint Peter, Coventry, should be formed into a consolidated chapelry for all Ecclesiastical purposes, and that the same should be assigned to the said Church of Saint Margaret, Coventry, situate as aforesaid.

"Now, therefore, with the consent of the Right Reverend Huyshe Wolcott, Bishop of Worcester, as such bishop, with the consent of the Right Honourable Richard Burdon, Viscount Haldane, now Lord High Chancellor of Great Britain, acting on behalf of Your Majesty as the patron of the vicarage of the said parish of Stoke, and with the consent of the Reverend Reginald Basil Littlewood, Clerk in Holy Orders, the Vicar or Incumbent of the vicarage of the parish of the Holy Trinity, Coventry, in the said county and diocese, and, as such Vicar or Incumbent, the patron of the
