the intention to make such representation shall have been given to the Incumbent and the vestry clerk or churchwardens of such parish:

And whereas by the Burial Act, 1855, it is, amongst other things, enacted that it shall be lawful for His Majesty, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, from time to time to postpone the time appointed by any Order in Council for the discontinuance of burials, or otherwise to vary any Order in Council made under any of the Acts recited in the said Act, or under the said Act (whether the time thereby appointed for the discontinuance of burials thereunder, or other operation of such Order, shall or shall not have arrived), as to His Majesty, with such advice as aforesaid, may seem fit:

And whereas by an Order in Council dated the 8th day of February, 1855, it was ordered that burials should be discontinued in (amongst other places) the parish church and the churchyard of Wotton-under-Edge, in the county of Gloucester, as in the said Order mentioned:

And whereas the Local Government Board, after giving to the Incumbent and the churchwardens of the said parish of Wotton-under-Edge ten days' previous notice of their intention in that behalf have made a representation that so much of the said Order in Council of the 8th day of February, 1855, as relates to burials in the parish church and the churchyard of Wotton-under-Edge aforesaid, should be varied by substituting for the directions therein contained with regard to the said church and churchyard the following directions, viz.:—

That, except as hereinafter provided, burials shall be discontinued forthwith and entirely in the parish church of Saint Mary, Wottonunder-Edge, and in that portion of the churchyard which was in existence prior to the year 1855: Provided that in any vault or walled grave now existing in the said portion of the churchyard and situate not less than fifty feet from the house known as Lisle House, burial may be allowed, subject to the condition that every coffin buried in such vault or grave be separately enclosed by stonework or brickwork properly cemented.

Now, therefore, His Majesty in Council is pleased hereby to give notice of such representation, and to order that the same be taken into consideration by a Committee of the Privy Council, on the 20th day of November next.

And His Majesty is further pleased to direct that this Order be forthwith published in the London Gazette, and that copies thereof be affixed on the doors of the churches or chapels of, or on some conspicuous places within, the parish affected by such representation one month before the said 20th day of November.
