WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have in pursuance of the Act of the third and fourth years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, chapter one hundred and thirteen, and of the Act of the seventeenth and eighteenth years of Her said late Majesty, chapter eighty-four, duly prepared and laid before His Majesty in Council a Scheme bearing date the thirty-first day of July, in the year one thousand nine hundred and thirteen, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of the Act of the third and fourth years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, chapter one hundred and thirteen, and of the Act of the seventeenth and eighteenth years of Her said late Majesty, chapter eighty-four, have prepared and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following Scheme for appertioning the income of the benefice (being a rectory) of Saint Aldate, in the City of Oxford and in the diocese of Oxford, between that benefice and a certain other benefice, namely the benefice (being a vicarage) of Saint Matthew, Grandpont, Oxford, which said last-named benefice is

situate in the county of Berks and in the said diocese of Oxford.

"Whereas the Right Reverend James Denton, Bishop of Sodor and Man, the Reverend Robert Baker Girdlestone, of Number 13, Lauriston Road, Wimbledon, in the county of Surrey, Clerk in Holy Orders, and an Honorary Canon of Christ Church, Oxford, the Reverend Ernest Augustus Eardley-Wilmot, of Saint Jude's Vicarage, South Kensington, Clerk in Holy Orders and a Prebendary of the Cathedral Church of Wells, the Reverend Arthur Evelyn Barnes-Lawrence, of Number 6, Church Terrace, Blackheath, in the county of Kent, Clerk in Holy Orders and an Honorary Canon of the Cathedral Church of Southwark, and the Reverend Edward Alexander Stuart, of The Precincts, Canterbury, Clerk in Holy Orders and a Canon of the Cathedral Church of Canterbury (commonly known as Simeon's Trustees), are the patrons of the said benefice of Saint Aldate, Oxford, and also of the said benefice of Saint Matthew, Grandpont, Oxford.

"And whereas it has been made to appear to us that the said benefice of Saint Matthew, Grandpont, Oxford, is at present insufficiently endowed; and that the said benefice of Saint Aldate, Oxford, has endowments of such an amount as that after the apportionment hereinafter recommended and proposed to be made shall have been effected, the said benefice of Saint Aldate, Oxford, will still be sufficiently endowed.

"And whereas it has been represented to us, and we are of opinion, that it is desirable that additional provision should be made for the Cure of Souls within the new parish of Saint Matthew, Grandpont, Oxford aforesaid, by means of that apportionment of the income of the said benefice of Saint Aldate, Oxford, which is hereinafter recommended and proposed.

"And whereas the said benefice of Saint Aldate, Oxford, is now full.

"Now therefore with the consent of the Right Reverend Charles, Bishop of Oxford, acting as such Bishop (in testimony whereof he has signed this Scheme and sealed the same with his Episcopal Seal) and with the consents of the said James Denton, Bishop of Sodor and Man, Robert Baker Girdlestone, Ernest Augustus Eardley-Wilmot, Arthur Barnes-Lawrence, and Edward Alexander Stuart, acting as the patrons of each of the said two benefices as aforesaid (in testimony whereof they have respectively signed and sealed this Scheme), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, humbly recommend and propose that without any conveyance or assurance in the law other than this Scheme and any duly gazetted Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying the same and as from the day of the date at which the said benefice of Saint Aldate, Oxford, shall from whatsoever cause be next voided, all that sum of one thousand two hundred and twenty-nine pounds eleven shillings and eightpence London County three pounds per centum per annum Stock and all that sum of five hundred pounds India three pounds ten shillings per centum per annum Stock now held by us the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners in trust for and for the benefit of the Rector or Incumbent of the said benefice of Saint Aldate, Oxford, and all that sum of one thousand pounds cash now held by us in trust for such benefice and in respect of which we pay to the Incumbent of such benefice by quarterly payments a sum of thirty-three pounds six shillings and eightpence per annum, and all that sum of one thousand five hundred and ten pounds cash now held by us in respect of such benefice and in respect of which we pay to the Incumbent of such benefice by quarterly payments a sum of forty-five pounds six shillings per annum shall cease to form part of the endowments of the said benefice of Saint Aldate, Oxford, and shall be held by us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, in trust for and for the benefit of the Incumbent of the said benefice of Saint Matthew, Grandpont, Oxford, and as part of the endowments of that benefice.

"And we further recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid or any of them in accordance with the provisions of the said Acts or of either of them or of any other Act of Parliament."

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said Scheme, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts. And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of Oxford.

"And whereas it appears to us to be expedient that certain contiguous portions (being the portions containing the population aforesaid) of the said parish of Stoke D'Abernon, of the said parish of Cobham, and of the said new parish of the Holy Trinity, Claygate, should be formed into a consolidated chapelry for all ecclesiastical purposes, and that the same should be assigned to the said church of Saint Andrew, Oxshott, situate as aforesaid.

carlet, of The Manor House, Stoke D'Abernon, and Noel McGrigor Phillips, also of The Manor House, Stoke D'Abernon, Esquire, as the patrons of the rectory of the said parish of Stoke D'Abernon, with the consent of Charles Combe, of Cobham Park, in the said county of Surrey, Esquire, as the patron of the vicarage of the said parish of Cobham, and with the consents of Francis Augustus Bevan, of Number 54, Lombard Street, in the city of London, Banker, John Francis William Deacon, of Number 20, Birchin Lane, in the London, William said city of London, Banker, the Reverend Ernest Newton Sharpe, of the Holy Trinity Rectory, Saint Marylebone, in the county of Middlesex, Clerk in Holy Orders, the Reverend Henry Lawe Corry Vully de Candole, of Clifton Vicarage, Bristol, Clerk in Holy Orders, and the Reverend Edward Grose Hodge, of the Vicarage, Paddington, in the said county of Middlesex, Clerk in Holy Orders, and a Prebendary of the Cathedral Church of Saint Paul in London, as the patrons of the vicarage of the said new parish of the Holy Trinity, Claygate (in testimony whereof they, the said consenting parties, have respectively signed and sealed this representation), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, humbly represent that it would, in our opinion. be expedient that all those contiguous portions of the said parish of Stoke D'Abernon, of the said parish of Cobham, and of the said new parish of the Holy Trinity, Claygate, which are described in the Schedule hereunder written, all which portions, together with the boundaries thereof, are delineated and set forth on the map or plan hereunto annexed, should be united and formed into one consolidated chapelry for the said church of Saint Andrew, Oxshott, situate as aforesaid, and that the same should be named 'The Consolidated Chapelry of Saint. Andrew,. Oxshott.'.

"All those contiguous portions of the parish of Stoke D'Abernon, of the parish of Cobham, and of the new parish (sometime particular district) of the Holy Trinity, Claygate, all in the county of Surrey and in the diocese of Winchester, which, taken together, are bounded upon the east partly by the new parish of Saint Paul, Hook, and partly by the parish of Chessington, upon the south-east by the parish of Leatherhead, all in the said county and diocese, and upon the remaining sides, that is to say, upon the south, upon the south-west, upon the west, and upon the north, by an imaginary line commencing at the point near the southern corner of Stoke Wood, where the boundary which divides the said parish of Leatherhead from the said parish of Stoke D'Abernon crosses the middle of the road leading from Leatherhead to Oxshott, and extending thence north-westward in a straight line for a distance of one mile and five chains or thereabouts to the point opposite to the north-

eastern corner of the wood known as The Furze, where Bridle Lane is crossed by the footpath leading to Littleheath Farm, and extending thence westward along the middle of Bridle Lane for a distance of nine chains and a half or thereabouts to its junction with the road leading from Stoke D'Abernon to Oxshott, and extending thence first northward, then northeastward, and then again northward along the middle of the last-mentioned road for a distance of twenty-five chains and a half or thereabouts to the boundary which divides the said parish of Stoke D'Abernon from the said parish of Cobham, and extending thence south-westward along the last-mentioned boundary (thereby following in part the south-eastern and southern sides of Watercut Copse) for a distance of thirty-one chains or thereabouts to the point where it crosses the middle of the foot-path leading through Watercut Copse and across Little Heath, and extending thence first north-westward and then north-eastward along the middle of such footpath for a distance of twenty-seven chains or thereabouts to its junction on the northern side of Little Heath with Littleheath Lane, and extending thence northwestward along the middle of Littleheath Lane for a distance of thirty-seven chains or thereabouts to its junction with Miles's Lane, and extending thence northward along the middle. of Miles's Lane for a distance of seventeen chains or thereabouts to the point where such lane diverges north-eastward along the southeastern side of Fairmile Common towards Sandy Lane, and extending thence north-eastward in a straight line (thereby crossing the south-eastern portion of Fairmile Common and part of the Great Plantation) for a distance of twenty chains or thereabouts to the point in the middle of the stream flowing from Spring Pond to Middle Pond, where such stream falls into Middle Pond, and extending thence northwestward in a straight line across Middle Pond for a distance of eight chains or thereabouts to the point on the northern side of such pond in the middle of the outlet of the stream which flows from such pond, and extending thence first north-eastward and then northward along the middle of the last-mentioned stream for a distance of twelve chains or thereabouts to its junction with the stream which flows between the Great Plantation and Esher Common upon the boundary which divides the said parish of Cobham from the parish of Esher, in the said county and diocese, and extending thence east-ward along such boundary (thereby following in part the middle of the last-mentioned stream) for a distance of fifty-six chains or thereabouts to the point where the said boundary meets the boundary which divides the said parish of Esher from the said new parish of the Holy Trinity, Claygate, and extending thence north-eastward along the last-mentioned boundary (thereby following the middle of the stream called The Rythe) for a distance of twenty-six chains or thereabouts to a point opposite to the northern corner of the house known as Copsen Farm, and extending thence eastward in a straight line for a distance of thirty-eight chains or thereabouts to the centre of the bridge which carries the new Guildford line of the London and South-Western Railway across Birchwood Lane, and extending thence south-eastward along the middle of Birchwood Lane for a distance of eighteen chains and a half or thereabouts to the boundary which divides the said new parish of the Holy Trinity, Claygate, from the said parish of Cobham, and extending thence first northward, then eastward, then north-eastward, then south-eastward, and then again northeastward along the last-mentioned boundary for a distance of seventy-seven chains or thereabouts to the point at the north-eastern corner of the wood called Great Oaks, where such boundary meets the boundary of the said new parish of Saint Paul, Hook."

Gardens into the river known as the Afon Lliw at a distance of thirty-two chains and a half or thereabouts measured in a straight line from the junction of the said stream with the said river, and extending thence north-westward in a straight line drawn to the southern corner of the house called Gors fawr (thereby crossing the road leading from Gorseinon to Llangy-felach and also the north-western corner of Mynydd Carn Goch) for a distance of fifty-three chains or thereabouts to the point where such line crosses the middle of the said river upon the boundary which divides the said parish of Llangyfelach from the said parish of Llangyfelach from the said parish of Llandilo Talybont."

And whereas by "The Weights and Measures
(Metric System) Act, 1897," it is provided that
the Board of Trade standards which may be
made under section 8 of "The Weights and
Measures Act, 1878," shall include metric
standards derived from the iridio-platinum

Trade and numbered 18:

And whereas it has been made to appear to the Board of Trade that new denominations of standard weights derived from the standard kilogram aforesaid are required, and they have caused the same to be made and duly verified:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by virtue of the power vested in Him by the said Acts, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, is pleased to approve of the new denominations of standard weights specified in the Schedule hereto, and doth direct that the same, on and after the first day of April, 1914, shall be Board of Trade standards in like manner as if they were mentioned in the Second Schedule to "The Weights and Measures Act, 1878."

WHEREAS by Order in Council, dated the 24th day of March, 1902, His late Majesty, in pursuance of the powers conferred by the provisions of section 373 of the Merchant Shipping Act, 1894, did make the regulations for the registry, lettering, and numbering of British sea fishing boats set forth in the Schedule thereto, and did direct that such regulations should come into force on the 1st May, 1902:

The said Order in Council, dated the 24th day of March, 1902, shall be and is hereby amended by inserting after the word "fishing" in paragraph 17 (2) of the Schedule to the said Order, the following words, that is to say, "and that in the case of fishing boats being sailing boats with motor power, the mizzen sail shall be marked in addition to the mainsail with the letters and numbers prescribed by sub-section I of this regulation."

HEREAS by the Medical Act, 1886, it is provided (compared to the manufacture) is provided (amongst other things) that His Majesty may from time to time, by Order in Council, declare that the Second Part of the said Act shall be deemed, on and after a day to be named in such Order, to apply to any British Possession which in the opinion of His Majesty affords to the registered medical practitioners of the United Kingdom such privileges of practising in the said British Possession as to His Majesty may seem just; and that from and after the day named in such Order in Council such British Possession shall be deemed to be a British Possession to which the said Act applies, within the meaning of the said Second Part thereof, but that until such Order in Council has been made in respect of any British Possession the said Second Part of the said Act shall not be deemed to apply to any such Possession.

And whereas by the Medical Act (1886) Amendment Act, 1905, it is provided that for the purposes of the Medical Act, 1886, where any part of a British Possession is under a central and also under a local legislature, His Majesty may, if He thinks fit, by Order in Council, declare that the part which is under the local legislature shall be deemed a separate

British Possession.

And whereas the Province of New Brunswick, in the Dominion of Canada, is under a central and also under a local legislature.

And whereas the said Province of New Brunswick affords, in His Majesty's opinion, to the registered medical practitioners of the United Kingdom such privileges of practising in the said Province as to His Majesty seem just.

Now, therefore, His Majesty doth hereby, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, order and declare that the Province of New Brunswick, in the Dominion of Canada, shall be deemed a separate British Possession, and that the Second Part of the Medical Act, 1886, shall be deemed as from the date of this Order to apply to the said Province of New Brunswick.

Boundaries of Wards and Councillors assigned to such Wards, etc.

COMMISSIONER'S SCHEME.

WHEREAS a majority of the whole Council of the borough of Conway, in the county of Carnarvon, on the first day of May, 1912, agreed to petition and the Council of the said borough thereupon petitioned His Majesty for the division of the said borough into wards:

And whereas His Majesty has been pleased by and with the advice of His Privy Council, and in pursuance and in exercise of the powers vested in His Majesty by "The Municipal Corporations Act, 1882," as amended by the "Municipal Corporations Act, 1893," to fix the number of wards into which the municipal borough of Conway shall be divided and to order and direct that the said borough shall thenceforth be divided into four wards, which Order was made on the 17th day of March, one thousand nine hundred and thirteen:

And whereas on the eighth day of April, in the year last aforesaid, the Right Honourable Reginald McKenna, one of His Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, did duly warrant and appoint me, Thomas Evans Morris, Esquire, Barrister-at-Law, a Commissioner to prepare a scheme for determining the boundaries of such wards, and for appointing the Councillors of the said borough among such wards.

Now I, the said Thomas Evans Morris, in pursuance of the powers given me by virtue of the said appointment under the said Acts, do hereby determine as hereinafter mentioned the boundaries of the said four wards into which the said borough is divided, which wards are hereinafter named and numbered as follows (that is to say):—

- 1. Deganwy Ward.
- 2. Marl Ward.
- 3. Aber Conwy Ward.
- 4. Castle Ward.

And where, in the following descriptions of the ward boundaries (so far as such descriptions do not refer to the borough boundary), a street, road or railway is given as the boundary of a ward, the boundary is to be taken as the centre of such street, road or railway, and where any street or road is described as joining another street or road, the point of junction is to be taken as the point at which lines, drawn along the centres of the two streets or roads, and continued would intersect each other:

And where a river or stream is given as the boundary of a ward, the boundary (except where it refers to the borough boundary) is to be taken as the medium filum of such river or stream:

And where reference is made to the borough boundary the already determined boundary line of the borough is meant:

And in the event of any discrepancy between the map and the description, the Ordnance Survey Map (2nd Edition, 1901) shall prevail.

1.-Deganwy Ward.

I do hereby determine that Deganwy Ward shall comprise so much of the municipal borough of Conway as lies within the following boundary:—

Commencing at a point on the northern boundary of the said borough in the centre of the Pen Tywyn Road, thence south-westward along the centre of the said road over Tywyn Hill to its intersection with Glan-y-Mor Road, thence south-westward across the said Glan-y-Mor Road and across the line of the London and North-Western Railway Company, and onward in a straight line to a point in the borough boundary at a distance of 350 yards or thereabouts from the southernmost corner of Deganwy Pier, thence in a north-westward direction following the borough boundary westward, north-eastward, southward, northward and south-eastward to the point of commencement aforesaid.

2.-Marl Ward.

I do hereby determine that Marl Ward shall comprise so much of the said borough as lies within the following boundary:—

Commencing at a point on the northern boundary of the said borough, in the centre of the Pen Tywyn Road, and thence eastward and south-westward following the borough boundary to the centre of the River Conway, thence north-westward along the said river to a point in the medium filum of the said river, 46 yards or thereabouts south of the southern side of the Tubular Bridge, thence following the boundary between the parishes of Llanrhos and Conway north-eastward, north-westward, south-westward, and north-westward to a point in the borough boundary 200 yards or thereabouts from the northern side of the Suspension Bridge, thence northward along the borough boundary to the southern extremity of Deganwy Ward, thence north-eastward along the south-eastern boundary of Deganwy Ward to the point of commencement aforesaid.

3.-Aber Conwy Ward.

I do hereby determine that Aber Conwy Ward shall comprise so much of the said borough as lies within the following boundary:—

Commencing at a point on the western boundary of the borough in the centre of the Sychnant Road, thence following the borough boundary northward, westward, north-east-ward, eastward, south-eastward and northeastward to the south-western boundary of the Marl Ward, thence south-eastward along part of the south-western boundary of the Marl Ward and thence along the centre of the River Conway to the northern side of the Suspension Bridge, thence westward along the northern side of the said bridge to a point in the centre of the Bridge Approach Road, thence westward along the centre of the said road to its intersection with Rose Hill Street, thence westward along the centre of Rose Hill Street to its intersection with the road on the west side of Lancaster Square, thence north-west-ward along the centre of the said road on the west side of Lancaster Square and along the centre of the Bangor Road to the intersection of the latter road with Mount Pleasant Road,

thence south-westward along the centre of Mount Pleasant Road to its intersection with the Sychnant Road, and thence westward along the centre of the Sychnant Road to the borough boundary at the point of commencement aforesaid.

4.-Castle Ward.

NATIONAL HEALTH INSURANCE.

The National Health Insurance (Arrears) Order, 1913, dated 11th October, 1913, made by the National Health Insurance Joint Committee under Section 78 of the National Insurance Act, 1911 (1 & 2

Whereas by section 78 of the National Insurance Act, 1911 (in this Order called "the principal Act"), it is amongst other things enacted that if any difficulty arises with respect to bringing into operation Part I of the principal Act, the Insurance Commissioners, with the consent of the Treasury, may by Order do anything which appears to them necessary or expedient for bringing that part of the principal Act into operation, and that any such Order may modify the provisions of the principal Act so far as may appear necessary or expedient for carrying the Order into effect:

And whereas by sub-section (2) of section 43 of the National Insurance Act, 1913 (in this Order called "the amending Act"), it is enacted that the amending Act shall be deemed to be part of Part I of the principal Act except as to any provisions superseding or amending any provisions of Part III of the principal Act:

And whereas under the National Insurance (Joint Committee) Regulations, 1912 and 1913, the power of making Orders under section 78 of the principal Act relating to matters arising under the provisions of section 10 of that Act and section 8 of the amending Act is vested in the National Health Insurance

Joint Committee acting alone:

And whereas by section 10 of the principal Act it is amongst other things provided that where an insured person, being a member of an Approved Society, is in arrear with his weekly contributions as therein specified he shall be liable to a reduction, postponement or suspension of benefits, but that in calculating arrears of contributions no account shall be taken of any arrears accruing in the case of an employed contributor during the first twelve months after the commencement of the principal Act:

And whereas by section 8 of the amending Act (which section comes into operation on the 12th day of January, 1914) it is provided that, subject to the provisions of sub-section 4 of section 10 of the principal Act, insured persons who are in arrear shall be liable to such reduction, postponement or suspension of benefits as may be prescribed, so however that any such reduction, postponement or suspension of benefit shall be approximately equivalent to the value of the loss occasioned by the failure to pay the contributions in arrear, and that the provisions of the principal Act regulating the reduction, postponement and suspension of benefits on account of arrears shall cease to have effect, and that the Regulations of the Insurance Commissioners may prescribe the time within which, and the conditions under

which, arrears may be paid up:
And whereas in view of the provisions of section 8 of the amending Act it is necessary and expedient, for the purpose of bringing into operation Part I of the principal Act as amended by the amending Act, that the arrears of employed contributors being members of Approved Societies should not operate to reduce, postpone or suspend benefits, except in accordance with the provisions of section 8 of the amending Act, and that provision should be made with regard to the reduction, postponement or suspension of benefits in the case of voluntary contributors who are members of Approved Societies and who are in arrears:

And whereas by reason of the premises a difficulty within the meaning of section 78 has arisen with respect to the bringing into operation of Part I of the principal Act as amended

by the amending Act:
Now, therefore, the National Health Insurance Joint Committee, in pursuance of the powers conferred on them by the principal Act and the amending Act, and all other powers enabling them in that behalf, with the consent of the Treasury, hereby order as follows:

1. This Order shall have effect until the 12th

day of January, 1914.

2. Notwithstanding anything in section 10 of the principal Act, the benefits of an employed contributor being a member of an Approved Society shall not, so long as this Order is operative, be reduced, postponed or

suspended on account of arrears.

3. Where at any time before the 13th day of October, 1913, the benefits of a voluntary contributor being a member of an Approved Society have been reduced, postponed or suspended on account of arrears, they shall be deemed to have been reduced, postponed or suspended in accordance with the provisions of the principal Act, if, subject to the provisions of sub-section (4) of section 10 of the principal Act, such reduction, postponement or suspension was based upon the total number of weekly contributions in respect of which he was actually in arrear at the expiration of the quarter immediately preceding the date at which the reduction, postponement or suspension took effect, any arrears in the case of a person entering insurance after the expiration of the first week of a quarter which accrued during that quarter being disregarded.

4. On and after the 13th day of October, 1913, the right of a voluntary contributor being a member of an Approved Society to medical benefit and sanatorium benefit shall be suspended if, having entered into insurance during the week expiring on the 21st day of July, 1912, he is in arrear on the 13th day of October, 1913, in respect of more than thirty-two weekly contributions, or if, having entered into insurance after the 21st day of July, 1912, he is in arrear on the 13th day of October, 1913, in respect of more than twenty-six weekly contributions, subject in both cases to the provisions of sub-section (4) of section 10 of the

principal Act.

5.—(1) On and after the 13th day of October, 1913, where a voluntary contributor being a member of an Approved Society is in arrears, the sum of those arrears calculated as hereinafter provided shall be set off against any sickness benefit which may from time to time become payable to him, and his sickness benefit shall be withheld or reduced accordingly

(2) For the purposes of the last preceding paragraph the sum of the arrears of a voluntary contributor shall, subject to the provisions of sub-section (4) of section 10 of the principal Act, be ascertained as on each date on which any sickness benefit would be payable in accordance with the following provi-

sions : -

- (a) No account shall be taken of any arrears in the case of a voluntary contributor entering into insurance before the 14th day of October, 1912, except in so far as they exceed the amount of three whole weekly contributions or in the case of a voluntary contributor entering into insurance on or after that date except in so far as they exceed the amount of two whole weekly contributions.
 - (b) Where before the 13th day of October, 1913, any sickness benefit to which he would otherwise have been entitled has been re-

duced, postponed or suspended on account of arrears, the sum of his arrears calculated as aforesaid shall be deemed to have been reduced by a sum equal to the amount of sickness benefit to which, but for such reduction, postponement or suspension, he would have been entitled.

6. This Order may be cited as the National Health Insurance (Arrears) Order, 1913.
