

Gardens into the river known as the Afon Lliw at a distance of thirty-two chains and a half or thereabouts measured in a straight line from the junction of the said stream with the said river, and extending thence north-westward in a straight line drawn to the southern corner of the house called Gors fawr (thereby crossing the road leading from Gorseinon to Llangyfelach and also the north-western corner of Mynydd Carn Goch) for a distance of fifty-three chains or thereabouts to the point where such line crosses the middle of the said river upon the boundary which divides the said parish of Llangyfelach from the said parish of Llandilo Talybont."

And whereas the said Representation has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said Representation, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts. And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said diocese of Saint David's.

WHEREAS by section 8 of "The Weights and Measures Act, 1878," it is provided that the Board of Trade shall from time to time cause such new denominations of standards, being either equivalent to or multiples or aliquot parts of the imperial weights and measures ascertained by the said Act as appear to them to be required in addition to those mentioned in the Second Schedule to the said Act to be made and duly verified, and that those new denominations of standards when approved by His Majesty in Council shall be Board of Trade standards in like manner as if they were mentioned in the said Schedule:

And whereas by "The Weights and Measures (Metric System) Act, 1897," it is provided that the Board of Trade standards which may be made under section 8 of "The Weights and Measures Act, 1878," shall include metric standards derived from the iridio-platinum standard kilogram deposited with the Board of Trade and numbered 18:

And whereas it has been made to appear to the Board of Trade that new denominations of standard weights derived from the standard kilogram aforesaid are required, and they have caused the same to be made and duly verified:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by virtue of the power vested in Him by the said Acts, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, is pleased to approve of the new denominations of standard weights specified in the Schedule hereto, and doth direct that the same, on and after the first day of April, 1914, shall be Board of Trade standards in like manner as if

they were mentioned in the Second Schedule to "The Weights and Measures Act, 1878."

WHEREAS by Order in Council, dated the 24th day of March, 1902, His late Majesty, in pursuance of the powers conferred by the provisions of section 373 of the Merchant Shipping Act, 1894, did make the regulations for the registry, lettering, and numbering of British sea fishing boats set forth in the Schedule thereto, and did direct that such regulations should come into force on the 1st May, 1902:

And whereas it appears to His Majesty desirable to amend the said Order in Council in manner hereinafter appearing:

And whereas the provisions of section 1 of the Rules Publication Act, 1893, have been complied with:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, in exercise of the powers vested in him by the above-mentioned Act and otherwise by and with the advice of His Privy Council, is pleased to direct that:

The said Order in Council, dated the 24th day of March, 1902, shall be and is hereby amended by inserting after the word "fishing" in paragraph 17 (2) of the Schedule to the said Order, the following words, that is to say, "and that in the case of fishing boats being sailing boats with motor power, the mizzen sail shall be marked in addition to the mainsail with the letters and numbers prescribed by sub-section 1 of this regulation."
