"And whereas by His late Majesty's Order in Council, bearing date the 21st day of November, 1908, approval was given for the pay of Lascar ratings to be subject to certain reductions in the event of misconduct:

'And whereas We consider that it would be to the benefit of Your Majesty's Naval Service if the provisions of the above-mentioned Order in Council were made applicable to all naval ratings of Colour:

"We beg leave humbly to recommend that Your Majesty may be graciously pleased by Your Order in Council to direct that the pay of Lascar or other Coloured ratings shall be subject to the condition that in the event of any Coloured rating misconducting himself the pay which he shall receive may be reduced to the following extent, and no further, namely, not more than five days' pay in respect of any one or more offences punished at any one time, or ten days' pay in all within the space of any one calendar month, the word 'pay' for the purpose of these rules being understood to include full pay and full pay allowances whether already accrued or not.
