AERIAL NAVIGATION ACT, 1911.

And whereas by section 40 of the National Insurance Act, 1913, it is provided that any order made under the National Insurance Act, 1911, or the National Insurance Act, 1913, may be revoked, varied or amended by an order made in like manner as the original order, and that the time within which the powers of the Insurance Commissioners to make orders under section 78 aforesaid may be exercised shall be extended to the 31st day of December, 1914:

And whereas by the National Health Insurance (District Insurance Committees) Order, 1913 (in this Order referred to as the "Principal Order"), it is ordered that where at the date of the order any body being one of the bodies mentioned in the First Schedule to the National Health Insurance (District Insurance Committees) Regulations (England), 1912, has not been constituted, an Insurance Committee may appoint to be members of any District Insurance Committee in its area such number of persons as under the Scheme applicable to that area, that body, if constituted, would be entitled to appoint and may from time to time fill up vacancies as they occur among the persons so appointed, and that the order shall have effect up to and including the 15th day of October, 1913:

And whereas certain of the bodies referred to in the Principal Order have not yet been constituted, and for the purpose of bringing the National Insurance Act, 1911, into operation it is necessary that the persons appointed to be members of District Insurance Committees by virtue of the Principal Order or some of them shall continue in office after the 15th day of October, 1913:

SWINE-FEVER (BIRMINGHAM EXHIBITION) ORDER OF 1913.

The Board of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in them under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1911, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:—

Provision for Movement to and from Exhibition.

1.—(1.) The restrictions on movement of swine imposed by the Birmingham (Swine-Fever) Order of 1912 or the Swine-Fever (Regulation of Movement) Order of 1908 shall not apply to the movement of swine to the exhibition described in the Schedule hereto or from such exhibition to a place of destination in Great Britain, if the swine are accompanied by a Licence authorising such movement granted under this Article.

(2.) In the case of movement to the exhibition the Licence shall be one granted by an Inspector of the Local Authority of the city of Birmingham, or by some person specially authorised by that Local Authority, and in the case of movement from the exhibition the Licence shall be one granted by an Inspector of the Local Authority of the District in which the place of destination is situate, and such place shall be specified in the Licence.

Licences after Completion of Movement.

2.—(1.) Where swine are moved with a Licence under this Order to the exhibition, the Licence shall be delivered up in exchange for the Licence for movement of the swine from such premises.

(2.) Where swine are moved with a Licence under this Order to any premises other than the exhibition, the Licence shall forthwith after completion of the movement be delivered up at, or sent by post to, the nearest Police Station in the same District by the person in charge of the swine at the time of completing the said movement.

General Provisions as to Movement.

3.—(1.) Swine, while being moved under this Order, shall so far as is practicable be kept separate from all swine which are not being so moved, and shall be moved from the premises from which they are by the Licence authorised to be moved by the nearest available route and without unnecessary delay to the place of destination specified in the Licence, and not elsewhere.

(2.) No Licence granted under this Order shall have the effect of authorising movement of swine which are in a Swine-Fever Infected Place or of swine the movement of which is prohibited by notice served by an Inspector of a Local Authority or of the Board of Agriculture and Fisheries under any Order of the Board.

Short Title.

4. This Order may be cited as the SWINE-FEVER (BIRMINGHAM EXHIBITION) ORDER OF 1913.
