REGULATIONS dated October 9th, 1913, made by the Secretary of State under the Naturalization Acts, 1870 (33-4, Vict., cap. 14 and cap. 102), as to cases where an application for a Certificate of Naturalization, or for a Certificate of Re-admission to British Nationality, is made by an officer in the service of the Crown out of His Majesty's Dominions.

In exercise of the powers conferred by the Naturalization Acts, 1870 (33-4 Vict., cap. 14 and cap 102), I, the Right Honourable Reginald McKenna, one of His Majesty's Prin-cipal Secretaries of State, make the following regulations.

# Oath of Allegiance.

I. The Oath of Allegiance may, out of His Majesty's Dominions, be administered by and subscribed in the presence of any of the following persons:-

(a) In Cyprus or in any British Protectorate or British Protected State, any officer for the time being authorized by law in that territory to administer an oath for any judicial or other legal purpose.

(b) Elsewhere out of His Majesty's Dominions, any officer in the diplomatic or consular service of His Majesty:

and the Oath so taken and subscribed may be proved in any legal proceedings by the production of the original certificate, or of any copy thereof certified to be a true copy by one of His Majesty's Principal or Under Secretaries of State.

II. The foregoing regulation shall be substituted for Article I. of the Regulations (Supplemental), dated November 30th, 1894, made by the Secretary of State under the Naturalization Acts, 1870.
