**ORDER OF THE REGISTRAR-GENERAL
IN ENGLAND.**

(Dated 23rd October, 1913.)

Whereas by the 21st Section of the Births and Deaths Registration Act, 1874, it is enacted that the Registrar-General, with the sanction of the Local Government Board, may from time to time alter Registration Sub-districts:—

1. And whereas it is expedient, in order that the Registration Districts of Stockport and Chorlton may be made co-extensive with the Stockport Union and the Poor Law Parish of South Manchester respectively, as altered by the Manchester (Extension) Order, 1913, that the part of Heaton Norris Civil Parish, which by the operation of that Order will, on the 9th November next, form part of South Manchester Civil Parish, should be transferred from Heaton Norris Sub-district of Stockport Registration District to Didsbury Sub-district of Chorlton Registration District;

2. Now, therefore, I, Bernard Mallet, C.B., Registrar-General of Births, Deaths and Mar-

riages in England, in exercise of the powers given me by the above-mentioned Act, and with the sanction of the Local Government Board, do hereby order and declare that the foregoing alteration shall take effect accordingly.

3. This Order shall come into operation on the ninth day of November, nineteen hundred and thirteen.

**ORDER OF THE REGISTRAR-GENERAL
IN ENGLAND.**

(Dated 22nd October, 1913.)
