And We do by these Presents will and ordain that this Our Commission shall continue in full force and virtue, and that you, Our said Commissioners, or any three or more of you, may from time to time proceed in the execution thereof, and of every matter and thing therein contained, although the same be not continue I from time to time by adjournment:

And We do further ordain that you, or any three or more of you, have liberty to report your proceedings under this Our Commission from time to time, if you shall judge it

expedient so to do:

And Our further will and pleasure is that you do, with as little delay as possible, report to Us under your hands and seals, or under the hands and seals of any three or more of you, your opinion upon the matter herein submitted for your consideration.

WHEREAS by Section 34 of the Brighton West Kent Regiment, vice Captain W. NOW THEREFORE, in pursuance of the powers given to Us in that behalf, We hereby Declare and Order as follows:—

ARTICLE I.—Immediately after the publication of this Order in the London Gazette, the provisions of Sections 35 to 42, inclusive, of the said Brighton Improvement Act, 1884, shall apply to the enclosed ground known as Clarence Square, in the Borough of Brighton, and to the houses numbered 1 to 20, inclusive, and 26 to 31, inclusive, Clarence Square.

MOTOR CAR ACT, 1903.
Regulations under Section 9 (1).
COUNTY OF LONDON.

(Hyde Park Corner.)

To the London County Council; And to all others whom it may concern.

WHEREAS by sub-section (1) of section 9 of the Motor Car Act, 1903 (hereinafter referred to as "the Act"), it is enacted that, within any limits or place referred to in Regulations made by Us, the Local Government Board, with a view to the safety of the public, on the application of the local authority of the area in which the limits or place are situate, a person shall not drive a motor car at a speed exceeding ten miles per hour;

And whereas the London County Council having made application to Us to make a Regulation in pursuance of the said sub-section putting the above-mentioned provisions of that sub-section in force within the limits comprising certain roads or parts of roads within the county of London, We directed a Local Inquiry to be held into the matter by one of Our Inspectors, and the Inquiry was held accordingly, and Report has been made to Us thereon:

NOW THEREFORE, in pursuance of the powers given to Us in that behalf, We do, by this Our Order, make the following Regula-

tions:-

ARTICLE I.—The provisions of sub-section (1) of section 9 of the Act with respect to the driving of a motor car at a speed not exceeding ten miles per hour shall apply and have effect within the limits comprising the roads or parts of roads within the county of London which are specified in the Schedule hereto.

ARTICLE II.—These Regulations shall come into operation on the third day of November, one thousand nine hundred and thirteen.

So much of Knightsbridge and Piccadilly as extends from a point 50 yards west of the west side of Grosvenor Place to the west side of Hamilton Place;

(3) To acquire by gift and to hold certain lands situate in the said township of Ruswarp, and known as the Chubb Hill Estate, for the purpose of a public park or pleasure ground, and on any special occasion to close the whole or any part thereof against the public, and to charge for admission thereto;

HULL MARKET (SWINE - FEVER)
ORDER OF 1913.

The Board of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in them under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1911, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

- 1.—(1.) Notwithstanding the provisions of paragraph (iii.) of Article 5 (1) of the Swine-Fever (Regulation of Movement) Order of 1908 (hereinafter referred to as "the principal Order ''), swine which have been moved to the Corporation Cattle Market, in the county borough of Kingston-upon-Hull, may, so long as such market continues to be specially authorised under the said Article, be moved therefrom to the premises from which they were moved to the market if such premises are either in the Scheduled Area which comprises the said county borough, or in the Scheduled Area which comprises the administrative county of the East Riding of the county of York (excluding certain parishes), and if the swine are marked in the manner prescribed by the principal Order, and are accompanied by a licence in the Form C set forth in the First Schedule to that Order authorising such movement granted by an Inspector of the Local Authority of the county borough of Kingston-upon-Hull.
- (2.) The movement of swine under this Order shall be subject to the following conditions:—
 - (i.) The swine shall not, for a period of twenty-eight days after arrival at the place of destination specified in the licence, be moved therefrom except to a bacon factory or slaughterhouse, or to the Corporation

some other market, lairs or saleyard specially authorised under the principal Order, and then only if accompanied by a further licence (Form C) granted by an Inspector of the Local Authority of the district in which the swine are detained:

(ii.) Swine moved with a licence under this Order to a bacon factory or slaughterhouse shall be there detained until they are

slaughtered;

(iii.) Swine while being moved or detained under this Order shall be kept separate from all other swine.

- 2. This Order shall come into operation on the thirty-first day of October, nineteen hundred and thirteen.
- 3. This Order may be cited as the Hull MARKET (SWINE-FEVER) ORDER OF 1913, and shall be read with the principal Order.

RAMSBOTTOM URBAN DISTRICT COUNCIL TRAMWAYS.

BYE-LAWS made by the Urban District Council of Ramsbottom under the Ramsbottom Urban District Railless Traction Act, 1912.

Interpretation.

1. Throughout these bye-laws and regulations the word "Council" means the Urban District Council of Ramsbottom and such other local authority as may for the time being use the tramways or traction system of the Council; the word "tramways" means the tramway system or the railless electric traction system for the time being worked by the Council, whether situate in the urban district of Ramsbottom or in any other district.

bottom or in any other district.

The word "car" means any carriage or car run upon the tramways for the conveyance of passengers; the word "conductor" means any officer or servant of the Council having the charge of or helping in the charge of a car; the word "driver" means any officer or servant of the Council driving or helping to drive a car. Words importing masculine gender shall include females, and words in the singular shall include plural, and words in the plural shall include the singular.

Extent of Bye-laws.

2. The bye-laws hereinafter set forth shall extend and apply to every car using the tramways, and to all places with respect to which the Council have power to make bye-laws or regulations.

Entering or Leaving Cars.

3. No person shall enter, board, mount, or leave or attempt to enter, board, mount or leave any car whilst in motion. Every person shall enter or depart from a car by the step of the hindermost or conductor's platform, and not otherwise, unless so directed by the conductor. All persons desiring or required to alight from any car shall do so with all possible speed, and all persons desiring to board the car shall permit such persons to alight as aforesaid.

Smoking.

4. No person shall smoke or carry a lighted pipe, cigar, or cigarette inside any car, except in a portion or compartment specially set apart for the purpose.

Intoxicated or Objectionable Persons.

5. No person who is in a state of intoxication, or affected with any dangerous, contagious, or infectious disorder, or who from such or any other cause is in the opinion of the conductor unfit to be a passenger on the car, or who in the opinion of the person in charge of the premises used in connection with the tramways is unfit to remain on such premises, shall enter or mount upon any car or premises aforesaid, and if any such person is found in or upon any car or premises aforesaid, it shall be lawful for the conductor, or any other officer or servant of the Council, to immediately remove such person from the car or premises, and if such person shall have paid his fare, he shall not be entitled to demand back the amount of his fare so paid.

No person whose dress or clothing might, in the opinion of the conductor of a car, soil or injure the seats, linings or cushions of a car, or the dress or clothing of any passenger, and no person who, in the opinion of the conductor, might for any other reason be offensive to any passenger, shall be entitled to enter or remain in any car, and may be prevented from entering any car, and shall not enter or mount any car after having been requested not to do so by the conductor. Provided that on cars specially artisans, mechanics, and daily labourers no person shall be prevented from entering or remaining in a car under the provisions of this bye-law on the ground of the condition of his dress or clothing, if such condition is solely due to the nature of his employment.

Offensive Language or Conduct.

6. No person shall, in or upon any car or premises used in connection with the tramways, play or perform upon any musical instrument, or distribute advertisements or tracts of any kind, or beg or collect money, alms or subscriptions, or offer any article for sale, or play any game or gamble, or deposit portions of food or fruit or liquid, or swear or use obscene or offensive language, or conduct himself offensively, or spit or commit any nuisance, or in any other way wilfully interfere with the comfort of any passenger or other person lawfully thereon.

Damage to Car.

7. No person shall wilfully cut, tear, soil or damage the seats, cushions, curtains or linings, or remove or deface any number plate, printed or other notice, in or on any car, or break or scratch any window of, or otherwise wilfully damage any car. Any person acting in contravention of this bye-law shall, in addition to the penalty prescribed by these bye-laws, be liable for the amount of any damage so done.

Payment of Fares.

8. Each passenger shall, upon demand, pay to the conductor or other duly authorized officer of the Council the fare legally demandable for the journey, and obtain a ticket therefor. No child under three years of age who is sitting on the lap of a passenger shall be liable to pay a fare.

Tickets.

9. Each passenger shall immediately upon demand show his ticket to the conductor or any duly authorized officer of the Council, and shall also, when required so to do by the conductor or any duly authorized officer of the Council, either deliver up his ticket or pay the fare legally demandable for the distance travelled over by such passenger. Tickets shall not be transferable, and any person leaving a car shall be deemed to have completed his journey.

Artisans.

10. No person not being an artisan, mechanic, or daily labourer within the true intent and meaning of the Acts of Parliament relating to the tramways, shall use or attempt to use any ticket intended only for an artisan, mechanic, or daily labourer, or travel or attempt to travel on the tramways as an artisan, mechanic, or daily labourer.

Luggage.

11. Personal or other luggage not exceeding 28 lbs. and carried in the hand of the passenger (including the tools of artisans, mechanics, and daily labourers) shall, unless otherwise permitted by the conductor, be placed on the front or driver's platform, and not inside or on the roof of any car.

Travelling on Steps, &c.

12. No person, not being an officer or servant of the Council acting in the performance of his duty, shall travel or ride on the steps, platforms, outside rails, buffers, or guards of any car, or shall stand in any case on the outside or, except by the express permission of the conductor first obtained, in the interior of the car.

No person except a passenger or intending passenger shall board a car, and no person shall hold or hang on to any part of a car.

Full Number of Passengers.

13. When any car contains the full number of passengers for which seating accommodation, according to the notice thereof attached to the car, is provided in such interior, no person beyond such number shall enter, mount, or remain therein, except by the express permission of the conductor first obtained.

Dogs.

14. No dog or other animal shall be allowed in the interior of any car except when on knee of passenger if conductor so permit, nor in any case in which the conveyance of such dog or other animal is offensive or an annoyance to any passenger shall the same be allowed on the outside of any car. No person shall take a dog or other animal on any car after having. been requested not to do so by the conductor. Any dog or other animal taken or being on any car in breach of this Regulation shall be removed by the person in charge of such dog or other animal from the car immediately upon request by the conductor, and in default of compliance with such request, may be removed by or under the direction of the conductor.

Firearms.

15. No person shall enter, mount, or travel in or on any car with loaded firearms, or with

any article, instrument, or implement which may, in the opinion of the conductor, be dangerous or offensive to any passenger.

Obstruction.

16. No person shall wilfully obstruct or impede any conductor, driver, or other officer or servant of the Council acting in the performance of his duty upon or in connection with any car or tramway.

Interference with Driver or Conductor.

17. No person other than the conductor or driver, or other servant of the Council acting in the performance of his duty, shall change or remove the route indicators or destination boards, or interfere with the controllers, brakes, lights, ventilators, trolley cord, or any part of the car or its equipment, or signal a car to start.

Disabled Cars.

18. If at any time a car becomes disabled or in any way injured or from any cause unable to proceed, the passengers shall upon the request of the conductor leave the same, and if such passengers have paid their fares, they shall not be entitled to demand back the amount of their fares so paid, but on production of their tickets shall be allowed to travel by the next available car on the same day for the remainder of the distance in respect of which they have paid their fares. No person shall, except with the leave of the conductor, enter a disabled or injured car.

Bye-laws to be Placed in Cars.

19. There shall be placed and kept placed in a conspicuous position inside of each car in use a printed copy of the bye-laws.

Enforcing Bye-laws.

20. Every conductor and driver of a car shall to the best of his ability enforce these bye-laws and prevent the breach thereof, and if any such conductor or driver fails to enforce the same as aforesaid he shall be deemed to have committed a breach thereof.

Penalty.

21. Any person offending against or committing a breach of any of these bye-laws shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding forty shillings.

Power to Remove Passengers Committing Offences.

22. Any person who shall commit whilst on any car any legal offence or any breach of these bye-laws shall, in addition to being liable to a penalty, be liable to be immediately removed from the car, and if such person shall have paid his fare shall not be entitled to demand back the amount of his fare so paid.

Date Bye-laws Come in Force.

23. These bye-laws shall come into force on the 24th December, 1913.
