THE UNIVERSITY OF LONDON ACT, 1898.

Notice is hereby given, in pursuance of the above-named Act, that the following amendment of Statutes Nos. 108, 111, and 112 of the Statutes of the University of London has been made by the Senate, and that copies can be obtained on application to "The Secretary to the Senate, University of London, South Kensington, S.W."

To repeal Statutes 108, 111, and 112 of the Statutes of the University, and to substitute therefor the following:—

108. The following degrees may be granted by the University (that is to say):—

- (1) Bachelor and Doctor of Divinity;
- (2) Bachelor and Master of Arts and Doctor of Literature;
  - (3) Bachelor and Doctor of Laws;
  - (4) Bachelor and Doctor of Music;
- (5) Bachelor and Doctor of Medicine, and Bachelor and Master of Surgery;
- (6) Bachelor and Master and Doctor of Science.

111. Except as hereinafter provided no degree other than an honorary or ad eundem degree shall be conferred on any Student who has not satisfied the Examiners in the prescribed examination or examinations and fulfilled all other prescribed conditions and no Student shall be allowed to become a candidate for any higher degree who shall not have previously taken the lower degree or degrees of the same class. Provided that Students whose qualifications are considered suitable may be admitted by the Senate as candidates for the degree of Doctor of Science without their having previously obtained the degree of Master of Science.

112. Provided always that the Senate may subject to any conditions contained in any Regulations to be made by the Commissioners or the Senate accept in the place of the whole or any part of the examinations for any of the degrees of Doctor or the degree of Master of Surgery or the degree of Master of Science or the final examination for the degree of Bachelor of Science the results of the study or research of any candidate who in the opinion of the Senate has thereby made a distinct contribution to the advancement of learning or science in any of the subjects in which those degrees are conferred.

#### WILD BIRD (ENGLAND).

The Wild Birds Protection (Administrative County of Southampton) Order, 1913.

Dated 31st October 1913.

In pursuance of the powers conferred on me by the Wild Birds Protection Acts, 1880 to 1908, and upon application by the Council of the Administrative County of Southampton, I hereby make the following Order:—

Title.

I. This Order may be cited as "The Wild Birds Protection (Administrative County of Southampton) Order, 1913."

BIRDS.

Close time for Woodcock extended.

II. The period during which the killing or taking of Wild Birds is prohibited by the Wild Birds Protection Act, 1880, shall be extended throughout the Administrative County of Southampton for Woodcock only, so as to be between the 1st day of February and the 13th day of August in any year.

Additions to the Schedule of the Act of 1880.

III. The Wild Birds Protection Act, 1880, shall apply within the Administrative County of Southampton to the following species of Wild Birds in the same manner as if those species were included in the Schedule to the Act:—

Great Bustard, Little Bustard, Common Buzzard, Honey Buzzard, Baillon's Crake, Little Crake, Spotted Crake, Crossbill, Eagle (all species), Peregrine Falcon, Hen Harrier, Marsh Harrier, Montagu's Harrier, Night Heron. Hobby, Kestrel, Kite, House Martin,

Sand Martin, Merlin, Nutcracker, Nuthatch, Osprey, Rose-coloured Pastor, Quail, Raven, Lesser Redpole, Stork, Swallow, Wild Mute Swan, Swift, Bearded Tit, Dartford Warbler.

The Cormorant and Shag deprived of Protection.

IV. The whole of the Administrative County of Southampton is hereby exempted from the operation of the Act of 1880, as to the undermentioned birds:—

Cormorant, Shag.

Certain Birds protected during the whole of the Year.

V. During that period of the year to which the protection afforded by the Wild Birds Protection Act, 1880, does not extend, the killing or taking of the following species of Wild Birds is prohibited throughout the Administrative

County of Southampton: -

Avocet, Bittern (all species), Great Bustard, Little Bustard, Common Buzzard, Honey Buzzard, Chough, Crossbill, Stone Curlew, Diver (all species), Eagle (all species), Pere grine Falcon, Goldfinch, Black-necked Grebe (Eared Grebe), Great Crested Grebe, Rednecked Grebe, Sclavonian Grebe, Gull (all species), Marsh Harrier, Montagu's Harrier, Hobby, Hoopoe, Kingfisher, Kitz, Wood Lark, Merlin, Nutcracker, Nuthatch, Oriole, Osprey, Owl (all species), Raven, Lesser Redpole, Black Redstart, Great Grey Shrike, Spoonbill, Wild Mute Swan, Tern (all species), Bearded Tit, Dartford Warbler, Woodpecker (all species).

l'artial exemption from operation of foregoing Clause.

VI. The Administrative County of Southampton; with the exception of the undermentioned parishes, and the tidal and territorial waters abutting thereon, is hereby exempted from the operation of the foregoing Clause (No. V) so far as the Wild Mute Swan is concerned:—

Parishes.—Alverstoke Beaulieu, Bedhampton, Bitterne, Boldre, Botley, Bursledon, Christchurch, Christchurch East, Cosham, Crofton, Curdridge, Dibden, Eling, Exbury and Lepe, Fareham, Farlington, Fawley, Hamble, Havant, Hayling North, Hayling South, Higheliff, Holdenhurst, Hook with Warsash, Hordle, Hound, Hurn, Itchen, Lymington, Marchwood, Millbrook, Milfordon-Sea, Milton, Nursling, Pennington, Portchester, Sarisbury, South Stoneham, Titchfield, Warblington.

All Birds protected on Sundays and on Christmas Day in certain Areas.

VII. During those periods of the year to which the protection afforded by the Wild Birds Protection Act, 1880, as extended (so far as concerns Woodcock), by Clause II of this Order, does not apply, the killing or taking of Wild Birds on Sundays and on Christmas Day is prohibited in the following Petty Sessional Divisions of the County of Southampton:—Alton, Basingstoke, Fareham, Lymington, New Forest, Odiham, Petersfield, Ringwood, Romsey, Southampton and Winchester.

#### Eccs.

Certain Eggs protected throughout the County.

VIII. The taking or destroying of the eggs of the following species of Wild Birds is prohibited

throughout the Administrative County of Southampton:—

Bitteru (all species), Common Buzzard, Honey Buzzard, Crossbill, Common Curlew, Stone Curlew, Wild Duck (all species), Goldfinch, Great-crested Grebe, Black-headed Gull, Montagu's Harrier, Marsh Harrier, Common Heron, Night Heron, Hobby, Hoopoe, Kestrel, Kingfisher, Merlin, Nightingale, Nightjar, Nuthatch, Oriole, Owl, Quail, Raven, Lesser Redpole, Redshank, Sand-Grouse, Sheldrake, Tern (all species), Dartford Warbler, Woodcock, Woodpecker, and (after April 30th in each year) Lapwing (Peewit, or Green Plover).

Repeal of former Order.

IX. The Order of the 13th May, 1910, is hereby repealed.
